

BAYVIEW COMMUNITY UPDATE September 30, 2004

Bayview Neighborhood Rescue Team

The newly formed Bayview Neighborhood Rescue Team, mentioned previously in various e-mails, held their biweekly meeting at Bayview Station and then visited a large, illegal dump site and homeless encampment at the end of Wallace Avenue. There are numerous violations in this area, ranging from the unlawful storage and dumping of toxic materials to abandoned autos to attractive public nuisances to beached boats to stray dogs off leash to building code violations to allegations from some of the local homeless that there are several dead bodies buried in the area! The investigations and clean-up will continue.

Late Night Basketball

After months of community planning, Bayview's Late Night Basketball began at the Joe Lee Gym last night. Manny Flores of Carpenter's Local 22 came in and spoke with the young men about opportunities available for those wishing to become apprentice carpenters. Cedric Jackson, from the One Stop (employment) office at the Southeast Community Facility also came in to speak with the young men about additional job opportunities and training, including current job openings with the Postal Service. The gym was packed with fans, and three great basketball games were played. This league promises to be a very positive event for the Bayview community.

Crime and Enforcement Update

On September 28, at 11:00 a.m., Bayview officers responded to the El Azteca Restaurant at 5298 3rd Street on the report of a 911 hang-up call. As the officers arrived, the employees pointed across the street to two individuals walking away on 3rd Street. The individuals were detained and the manager was interviewed. The manager stated that the man and woman had entered their respective restrooms in the restaurant, and had stayed there for approximately 30 minutes. When the manager attempted to get the individuals out of the restrooms, the male became enraged and grabbed several bottles of condiments, throwing them to the floor. The male suspect then grabbed a stool and attempted to break out the plexiglass separating the food from the customers. Both suspects then fled, and as the manager followed, the male suspect threatened to stab him. The male suspect was booked for threats and vandalism, as well as for an outstanding arrest warrant. The female suspect was identified and released (041 111 880).

On September 28, at 12:47, Bayview officers arrested a man for an outstanding drug arrest warrant. The man gave his address as 101 Hyde Street, which is a common address given by transients (041 112 167).

On September 28, at 3:40 p.m., Bayview plainclothes officers were on surveillance on the unit block of Latona when they saw a man seated on a television set in front of 78 Latona handling and looking into a plastic baggie. The officers approached the man to speak with him and he stuffed the baggie down his pants. When the officers spoke with the man, he stated that he was on federal probation (from Sacramento). The officers retrieved

the baggie and found it to contain 24 rocks of crack cocaine. The suspect was interviewed at Bayview Station and admitted that he had been shot at numerous times the prior evening while at Thornton and Latona (this shooting incident, in which two other people were shot, was referenced in a prior e-mail). The suspect also admitted that his vehicle had been "shot up" in this incident. When the suspect described his vehicle, the officers determined that other Bayview officers were in the process of towing it from Osceola Street after finding it with three bullet holes in it (041 113 375). The arresting officers then went to the tow yard and searched the vehicle, finding approximately 1/2 ounce of cocaine in the gas cap area of the vehicle, as well as a digital scale. Members of our Gang Task Force assisted with this investigation, and verified that the suspect is a validated member of the "Sunnydale" gang. The suspect was booked for numerous drug and gang charges (041 113 052).

On September 28, at 8:10 p.m., Bayview officers arrested a man, residing on the 3900 block of 3rd Street, for domestic violence. The female caller told officers that she had asked her husband to cook dinner for their son, and he became angry at her and slapped and punched her in the presence of their son (041 114 107).

On September 29, at 11:22 a.m., Bayview officers arrested a man, living on the 1800 block of Palou, for an outstanding arrest warrant (041 116 062).

On September 29, at 12:41 a.m., Bayview officers arrested a woman, living on the 1900 block of 25th Street, for an outstanding arrest warrant charging her with burglary and petty theft with a prior (041 114 630).

On September 29, at 2:40 p.m., Bayview officers arrested a man, residing on Turner Terrace, for an outstanding drug warrant (041 116 993).

On September 29, at 3:00 p.m., Bayview officers responded to Foodsco at 345 Williams on a theft call. Security told the officers that a woman had attempted to purchase a shopping cart full of groceries with a stolen credit card, but was discovered when she signed her own name to the credit card slip (as opposed to the name on both the stolen credit card and the stolen driver's license presented with the credit card). The officers contacted the woman named on the credit card and ID, and she responded to Foodsco. The victim told officers that she had been at the Factory 4U Store in the Mission earlier today and had placed her wallet into her baby's stroller. The victim stated that a woman then bumped into her and walked away. When the victim went to pay for her items, she couldn't find her wallet. The victim immediately identified the woman in custody at Foodsco as the same woman who had bumped into her. The suspect, living on the 1800 block of 26th Street, was booked for various theft and fraud charges, as well as for an outstanding warrant. Note that this same woman was convicted of burglary in 2001 and received a sentence of "one day credit" in the county jail for that crime. She apparently didn't learn her lesson from that case, even with the harsh sentence (041 118 240).

On September 29, at 4:29 p.m., Bayview officers were on patrol on Silver at Quint when they heard 6 guns shots in rapid succession, and then saw a man standing on the corner of the intersection. The man, upon seeing the officers, began to run west on Palou and the officers exited their car and

ordered the man to the ground at gunpoint. The officers searched the man for a firearm, but found only several baggies of marijuana. It was then determined that this man was the intended target of the shots fired. Witnesses at the scene told officers that a 2 door burgundy Honda had just fled the scene, and a Bayview sergeant then advised units over the air that he had just seen (prior to the announced shooting) two "Down the Hill" Sunnydale gangsters driving a red Honda hatchback on Barneveld from Oakdale. The officers in the area searched for this vehicle, but it was gone from the area. Bayview officers responded to the Sunnydale to search for this vehicle and its occupants, and at 5:50 p.m., they located the vehicle on the unit block of Blythdale ("Down the Hill" gang territory). Additional Bayview officers, as well as members of our Gang Unit, responded to the Sunnydale and located the two suspects seen earlier driving the Honda. The original (shots fired) victim was brought to the Sunnydale for a "cold show" of the suspects, but he did not identify them. The two "Down the Hill" Sunnydale gangsters (both living in the Sunnydale development) were released after being interviewed. It appears that this incident, as well as the above arrest at 78 Latona, as well as the shooting at Thornton and Latona, are all related, and may indicate efforts on the part of Sunnydale gangsters to send a message to Bayview gangsters (041 117 543).

On September 29, at 8:49 p.m., Bayview officers were on patrol at Jennings and Yosemite when they saw two men pushing a vehicle down the roadway. The officers stopped to find out what had happened and determined that the vehicle was stolen. The first suspect (homeless) was booked for stolen auto. The second suspect, living on the 1200 block of Ingalls Street, was also booked (041 116 909).

On September 29, at 10:57 p.m., Bayview officers were on patrol at Bayshore and Jerrold when they saw a vehicle "spinning doughnuts" in the intersection. The officers stopped the vehicle and cited the driver for various vehicle code violations. The passenger, living on Key Street, was booked for possession of marijuana for sale and transportation of marijuana (041 119 135).

On September 30, at 1:48 a.m., Bayview officers were on patrol at 3rd and Jamestown when they saw a vehicle drive past them, with two men aboard, displaying a license plate which they had just "added" to their hot sheet based upon a Communications dispatch. The officers pulled the vehicle over and the driver ran into a nearby wooded area and hid himself in the bushes. The officers ran into the area and found a man lying on the ground under a bush. The officers arrested the man and then removed him from the bush. It was then determined that the vehicle had been taken in a burglary from Sagamore Street. The driver, living on Thrift Street, was booked for stolen auto and possession of stolen property. The passenger, living on Head Street, was booked for the same charges (041 119 282).
