#### Late Night Basketball

#### Crime and Enforcement Update

On September 26, at 6:40 p.m., Bayview officers interviewed a woman who told them that she was walking to her cousin's house on the 1200 block of Ingalls when she was "jumped" by six or seven women who had been hiding in the bushes. The suspects beat the victim severely and ripped some of her clothes off. The victim's cousin heard the fracas and came outside in an attempt to pull her cousin into the home. The suspects then attacked the cousin, who was eventually able to drag the original victim into her home, where she phoned police. All of the suspects fled in a green 2002 Dodge Caravan. The attack was apparently related to a group of men, known both to the victims and the suspects. The suspects were all adult females in their 20's. First names for three of the suspects are Tracey, Charmine, and Sassy (041 109 233).

On September 27, at 9:25 a.m., Bayview officers arrested a woman for fraud charges for attempting to pass a counterfeit \$50.00 bill at the Walgreens on 3rd Street (041 106 217).

On September 27, at 1:30 p.m., Bayview officers took a report of a stolen van from a man working on the 1600 block of Davidson Street. The man stated that he had received a parking citation which showed that his vehicle had been parked illegally on Bayshore Blvd. in July, and it was only then that he realized that his vehicle had been stolen. The officers

went to the area where the citation had been issued and located both the vehicle, and a man living in it. The man was arrested for stolen auto and an outstanding arrest warrant (041 107 908).

On September 27, at 4:30 p.m., Bayview officers were sent to the 200 block of Mississippi on the report of two neighbors arguing. The first neighbor (a 71 year old woman) told the officers that her house abuts her next-door neighbor's house, and that her painters needed to climb on his roof in order to paint her house. The neighbor (70 year old man) refused to allow the painters access. This led to an argument between the neighbors, and the man began to choke the woman, and then threatened to kill her. The woman told officers she wished to pursue the case criminally, and the man was charged with both the assault and the threats (041 108 859).

On September 27, at 11:10 p.m., an elderly (74) man living on the 100 block of Dakota Street was home alone on his sofa when an unknown suspect placed a pillow over his head and told him not to move. The suspect then reached under the sofa cushion and removed \$800.00 in currency. The victim's caregiver later told police that numerous drug addicts frequent the victim's home (041 109 863).
