forward to me all traces dealing with firearms recovered in the Bayview.

Crime and Enforcement Update

After several weeks of relative peace in the Bayview, we had a bad weekend.

Listed below are descriptions of several shootings in the district. I have been in contact with both our Gang Task Force and our Homicide

regarding these cases, and as of now, they do not appear to be related to $\ensuremath{^{\text{to}}}$

one another.

On September 24, at 3:30 a.m., Bayview officers were sent to a home on Holyoke to take a report of a sexual assault which had just occurred on Gaven Street. The woman reported that she had seen an old acquaintance who

had asked her to come to her home, and once there, she was introduced to a $% \left(1\right) =\left(1\right)$

man who forced her to commit a sex act. The suspect was armed with a ${\rm knife}$

and threatened to kill the victim if she told anyone about the incident.

The victim eventually went home and phoned police. The officers accompanied the victim to look for the suspect, and he was eventually located at Silver and Girard. The suspect was still in possession of the

knife used in the attack at the time the officers detained him. The \max

living on the 100 block of Gaven Street, was booked for sexual assault, false imprisonment, terrorist threats and an outstanding arrest warrant (041 093 993).

On September 24, at 9;38 a.m., an officer was directing traffic at San Bruno and Dwight when he saw a man walk up to a PG&E truck and take a plastic "Dewalt" tool case. The man began to quickly walk away, and the

officer pursued him on foot and detained him. The man dropped the tool case to the ground and offered to "sweep up" if the officer would let him

go. The man provided the officer with a fictitious name, but he had used

the name before and his true identity was determined. The man, living on

the 3300 block of San Bruno Avenue was booked for grand theft and violation $% \left(1\right) =\left(1\right) +\left(1\right)$

of parole (041 094 571).

On September 24, at 10:35 a.m., a 17 year old young woman walked into Bayview Station and reported that she and her boyfriend were riding a scooter at 3rd and Newcomb when a woman drove a vehicle up onto the sidewalk and struck the scooter. The driver of the vehicle then got

and started hitting the victim. The victim stated that she and the suspect

dislike each other because they each have children fathered by the same man

 $(041\ 095\ 654)$. A few moments later this incident was followed by a second

incident wherein the original suspect was confronted by the mother of the

victim ,and the suspect struck the victim's mother with a baseball bat. $\ensuremath{\mathtt{A}}$

second suspect, an associate of suspect one, then punched the victim's mother in her head. A third suspect then removed a gun and hit the victim's (14 year old) brother across the mouth with it. As all of the victims were fleeing the scene in their auto, the third suspect shot out.

the back window of their car. Suspect two (residing on the 1200 block of

Oakdale) was booked for battery. Suspects one and three are at large, and

suspect three is considered armed and dangerous (041 095 648).

On September 24, at 12:27 p.m., Bayview officers were dispatched to a home

on the $100\ \mathrm{block}$ of Princeton on a possible homicide. The officers were

told that a man had just turned himself in at the Hall of Justice, telling

police there that he had killed his wife in their home. The officers forced entry to the home and found the deceased wife. The officers determined that the couple had a son attending a local school, and a family

member was called to attend to the child. The case is under investigation $% \left(1\right) =\left(1\right) +\left(1\right) +$

by our Homicide Unit (041 095 444).

On September 24, at 5:00 p.m., Bayview plainclothes officers were on patrol

at 23 rd and Arkansas when they noticed that the license plates on a nearby

vehicle were on their "hot sheet." The officers stopped the vehicle and

arrested the driver (living on the unit block of Dakota Street) $\,$ for stolen $\,$

auto and an outstanding arrest warrant charging him with grand theft $(041\ 069\ 819)$.

On September 24, at $8:58~\mathrm{p.m.}$, Bayview officers were dispatched to Terry

Francois and Mariposa on the report of an auto boosting in progress. The

officers found a man in the parking lot across from Kelly's Mission $\mathop{\rm Rock}\nolimits$

Inn who matched the description given of the booster, and they detained him. Note that the man was not happy about the detention and told the officers, "You crazy, I ain't done (expletive deleted)." The officers attempted to interview the man, but he became belligerent and refused to

answer any questions. The man was arrested for violation of parole, providing a false name, possession of narcotics paraphernalia, possession

of marijuana, and an outstanding arrest warrant (041 097 616).

On September 24, at $10:44~\mathrm{p.m.}$, Bayview officers responded to Fitzgerald

and Hawes on the report of a man down on the street. The officers found a $\,$

 $\mbox{{\it man,}}$ shot once in the abdomen. The victim told officers that he had been

standing at the corner when he heard a loud noise and realized he had been

shot. The victim stated that he didn't see who shot him and had no further

explanation for the shooting. The victim was accompanied by two friends at

the time of the shooting, one of whom stated he saw nothing, and the second

who refused to be interviewed. The incident may have been captured on \boldsymbol{a}

nearby security camera. The victim lives in the Doublerock area, and was

treated at SFGH for his injuries (041 097 826).

On September 24, at 11:21 p.m., Bayview officers responded to 3rd and Newcomb on the report of a shooting. The officers found a man on the sidewalk on the 1600 block of Newcomb and determined that he had been shot

once above his left eye. The officers attempted to interview numerous people who were present at the crime scene, but they each stated that they

had seen nothing. The officers recovered a quantity of both white powder

and marijuana at the crime scene near to the where the victim had been

lying. Additionally, when hospital staff handed the victim's clothing to

the officers at SFGH, a quantity of crack cocaine was found in the ${\tt victim's}$

shorts. The officers were unable to interview the victim due to his injuries. The victim lives on Hunter's Point Hill (041 097 876).

On September 25, at 10:10 a.m., Bayview officers arrested a man in a stolen

auto at 162 Westpoint. The man, who lives on Middlepoint Road, was also

booked for an outstanding arrest warrant (041 099 026).

On September 25, at 6:57 p.m., Bayview officers were on patrol at 20th and

San Bruno when they saw a man seated inside of a vehicle "snorting" something from a flat surface. The officers approached the man and recovered a quantity of powdered cocaine from beneath his car seat. The

man, living in Concord, was booked for possession of cocaine $(041\ 101\ 035)$.

On September 25, at $8:55 \, \text{p.m.}$, two Bayview officers were at 3rd and Underwood when they heard gunfire. The officers looked in the direction of

the gunfire and could see the "muzzle flash" of a firearm in front of 78

Latona Street. The officers responded and saw ten to fifteen people begin

to run in different directions. As the officers took cover, they saw two

vehicles fleeing the scene and asked responding officers to stop these vehicles. The first vehicle was stopped and was found to have three bullet

holes in it. The occupants were identified and stated that they were uninvolved and had simply fled the area in fear after their vehicle had been shot at. The officers then found a woman on the sidewalk with a gunshot wound to her leg. The woman, living on the 1400 block of VanDyke,

stated that she had seen nothing and did not know why she was shot.

officers began to knock on doors in an attempt to locate possible witnesses, but none of the persons interviewed would provide their names or

any information. A second vehicle, as well as a home, were found to also

have bullet holes. A second victim then phoned police from Flora Street, $\$

reporting that he too had been shot as he drove down Latona Street. An anonymous caller to Bayview Station stated that a blue van was seen leaving

the area following the shooting, and that this van is used by a drug dealer $\ensuremath{\mathsf{dealer}}$

in the area. The words, "The Family Van" appear on the rear of the van (041 101 217).

On September 26, at 12:35 a.m., a man was walking home on Goettingen at

Felton when he was approached by a man who asked, "Had a long day?" The

suspect then displayed a gun and was joined by a second suspect, who went

through the victim's pockets. Suspect one was a black male, 35-40, 5'6",

150, dark beanie cap, leather gloves, dark clothing, armed with black revolver with 6" barrel. Suspect two was a black male, 5'6", 160, dark beanie cap, dark clothing, leather gloves (041 101 728).

On September 26, at 2:27 a.m., Bayview officers were on patrol at Bayshore

and Industrial when they made a traffic stop on a vehicle with (illegal)

tinted windows and broken taillamps. As the officers contacted the driver,

they could smell the odor of burning marijuana, and the driver admitted to

the officers that his license was suspended. The driver, living on Minerva

Street, was booked for possession of marijuana, driving with a suspended $% \left(1\right) =\left(1\right) \left(1\right) +\left(1\right) \left(1\right) \left(1\right) +\left(1\right) \left(1\right)$

license, numerous traffic offenses, and an outstanding arrest warrant. The $\,$

On September 26, at 7:10 a.m., a man was walking on Fitzgerald at Jennings

when he was suddenly approached by two men who threw him to the $\operatorname{sidewalk}$

and beat him around his face and body. The suspects then stole the victim's bag and fled on foot toward 3rd Street. Suspect one is a black

male, 20-25, 6'0", 180, wearing a brown 3/4 length jacket, beanie cap, black pants. Suspect two is a black male, 20-25, 6'0", 180, wearing a black jacket, white T-shirt, and blue jean pants (041 102 419).

On September 26, at $5:30~\mathrm{p.m.}$, a man was walking west on Silver at Gambier

when he was approached by three juveniles who ordered him to, "Empty (his)

pockets." Two of the suspects blocked the victim's path as the third suspect attempted to go through his pockets. The victim then kicked the

third suspect in the groin and ran toward Mission Street. Suspect one was

a black male, 15-16, 5'7", 185, wearing a black T-shirt with the number "12" on front. Suspect two was a black male, 15, 5'6", 140, wearing a black T-shirt with the number "8" on front. Suspect three was a black male, 14, 5'6", 120, no further $(041\ 105\ 128)$.

On September 26, at 11:09 p.m., Bayview officers responded to a residence

on Illinois Street on the report of loud music coming from Kelly's Mission

Rock Inn. The caller signed a "private person arrest" for the excessive

noise, and the manager of Kelly's was cited. A band, known as "The League

of Pissed Off Voters," was playing live music in an open, outside area of

Kelly's (041 105 106)..
