Bayview Softball Tournament

Tomorrow, September 25, the 1st Annual Softball Challenge will take place at Gilman Park, beginning at noon. There will be teams present from the Mayor's office, the Probation Department, Bayview Station, and the Bayview community. The Bayview community All-Stars will play the Bayview officers at 2:30 p.m. Although various members of the community team have assured me that they are going to beat our team (handily), my officers have assured me of the opposite outcome. It should be lots of fun.

Guns

Regular readers of this e-mail know that we seize a large number of firearms in the Bayview District. I have asked our department's firearms tracer to forward me the results of his trace inquiries for all guns recovered in the Bayview, and I received a stack of returns this morning. In Monday's e-mail, I'll provide a breakdown of where these guns are coming from.

Soccer

Our Bayview kids play tomorrow at 9:45 a.m. at Parkside (south) versus the Jamestown Little Men.

Basketball

Our two basketball teams are preparing to begin their seasons, and both of them practiced this week. I'll release game times and locations this week as the schedules are finalized.

Crime and Enforcement Update

On September 23, at 8:00 a.m., Bayview officers responded to the unit block of Nichols on a suspicious occurrence call. A mother had called regarding an incident which had just occurred involving her two daughters, ages 7 and 10, as they walked to school. The girls told the officers that they were walking on the 100 block of Nichols when they were approached by two men,

one of whom asked, "Can I buy some Skittles?" The girls became frightened and ran toward the bus stop, but the two men ran after them and, according to the girls, repeated the same question. The girls got onto the bus and told the driver what had happened. Suspect one is described as a Hispanic male, 29-30, 5'8", 180, wearing a yellow and white shirt, blue jeans and a baseball cap. Suspect two is described only as a Hispanic male wearing a green and white shirt and blue jean pants (041 093 131).

On September 23, at 2:50 p.m., Bayview officers responded to the 2000 block of Palou on a domestic violence call. The female caller told the officers that her husband, from whom she is separated, came to her home and beat her and threatened to kill her. The victim stated that her husband has physically abused her over 100 times in the past 23 years, and that, in the past two weeks, his attacks have increased in frequency and intensity. The victim also stated that in one of the latest incidents, her husband brought another man to their home and accused the victim of being angry because the husband and the man had a sexual relationship. The suspect, living also on the 2000 block of Palou (in a separate home), was located by the officers and booked for various domestic violence-related charges. An Emergency Protective Order was also issued (041 091 163).

On September 23, at 4:16 p.m., Bayview officers responded to Northridge and Jerrold on a call that a carjacking victim had seen his car being driven in the area. The officers located the vehicle, a 1985 brown Toyota Camry, and it was being driven by a woman. The woman stated that she had purchased the vehicle from its owner, and she provided the name of the actual owner, along with some paperwork. The officers had the vehicle's owner respond to the scene and he identified the vehicle as his, and the woman stated that he was not the same man who had "sold" her the vehicle. Apparently some of the vehicle's paperwork was in the vehicle when it was stolen in a carjacking, and someone, perhaps the carjacker, then "sold" it to the woman. The case is being investigated by our Auto Detail (041 079 874).

On September 23, at 5:15 p.m., a woman walked into Bayview Station and

related the following. She and her aunt were driving and were stopped at a red light at Carr and Paul when they saw a vehicle pull up behind them, and then saw its occupant, a girl known as "Nett," get out of the car holding a tire iron and begin to approach them. The light turned green, the victim and her aunt drove off, and they then heard a sound like a gunshot. The victim stated that "Nett" then followed her to Bayview Station, but drove off as they arrived at the station. The victim refused to provide her name or phone number. The victim stated that "Nett" was accompanied by two other black females, and they were driving a blue 2 door vehicle (041 092 161).

On September 23, at 5:48 p.m., Bayview officers responded to Candlestick Park on the report of a carjacking (actually a motorcyclejacking) incident which had just occurred. The victim stated that he was riding his motorcycle west on Gilman and slowed for a man who was standing in the middle of the street waving his arms over his head. The man quickly approached the victim, grabbed him around the neck, and pulled him from the motorcycle. The suspect then threatened to shoot and kill the victim, and the victim told the suspect to just "...take the bike." At this time a Park Ranger pulled up to the scene and the victim ran to the ranger, as the suspect started the motorcycle and drove off at a high rate of speed. Moments later, Bayview officers spotted the motorcycle at 3rd and Oakdale, and attempted to pull it over, but the suspect fled south onto 3rd Street. The suspect then rammed the motorcycle into a second police vehicle, which had been responding to the area. The suspect then took a fighting stance with the officers and pointed his hands toward the officers as if he was holding a gun (it had been reported to the officers from the original victim that the suspect was possibly armed with a gun). The officers approached the suspect in an attempt to take him into custody, and he resisted violently. The suspect was eventually taken into custody. The suspect, who gave an address in Henderson, Nevada, was booked for robbery, carjacking, aggravated assault, threats, and various vehicle code violations. The officers received only minor injuries in the ramming incident and the subsequent fight with the suspect (041 091 981).

On September 23, at 8:20 p.m., Bayview officers responded to a home on the

2000 block of Revere on the report of a carjacking incident. The victim told the officers that he had been drinking at his friend's home on the 200 block of Bridgeview, when the friend's nephew walked up to him and began to strike him with his fists. The nephew then took the victim's wallet and car keys, ran out of the house and entered the victim's vehicle, and drove off. Note that the victim was pretty liquored up when being interviewed by the officers. The officers went to the home on Bridgeview and interviewed the woman who had been drinking with the victim. The officers determined that she had some substance abuse problems, and her story was both non-responsive and confusing. The "nephew" was nowhere to be found. Based on the totality of the circumstances, particularly the intoxicated condition of both the victim and the woman, the officers simply documented the incident and forwarded it to our Inspector's Bureau, where more thorough, and hopefully sober, interviews can be conducted (041 092 804).

On September 23, at 11:19 p.m., Bayview officers responded to the 700 block of Jamestown on the report of a woman who appeared to have been beaten who had been knocking on doors in the area. The officers located the victim, who was then transported to St. Lukes via ambulance. The officers accompanied the woman to the hospital and attempted to interview her, but she was uncooperative. The victim eventually told the officers that her boyfriend had driven her to the area around Candlestick Park and had punched her in the face several times. The officers observed her entire face to be swollen, her nose to be bleeding, and one of her eyes to be swollen shut. The victim also admitted that she is 22 weeks pregnant, but she refused to identify the suspect (her boyfriend). The case was referred to our DV Unit, but the officers were unable to obtain an Emergency Protective Order since the suspect's identity is unknown (041 093 448).
