Arrested Subject Information

For several months now, I have sent out daily e-mails to the Bayview community. There are currently over 700 groups and individuals receiving these e-mails, including Bayview residents, business owners, government officials, city department employees, social service providers, Housing Authority officials, neighborhood associations, merchant associations, news reporters, and others. A crucial component of these e-mails has been the information related to criminal arrests. Every felony arrest is listed in the e-mails, including the arrestee's name and address. Arrest information is considered a public record, meaning that you, as members of the public, are entitled to it. As of Friday, I have been ordered to stop providing you with this information. I have been told that the department is concerned that this information might be used inappropriately, and that vigilante-style retaliation might be instituted against criminal defendants. It must be noted that, of the hundreds of cases I have reported on in the past five months, there has not been a single incident of such retaliation. It must also be noted that, beginning in 1997, I provided similar information to the Ingleside community as the captain of that district (although this was before the department had e-mail, and the information was provided via a community fax-alert system.) As you might expect, there was not a single incident of retaliation in the Ingleside either. I trust and respect the members of this community, and I have always had complete confidence that the information I have provided, information to which you are lawfully entitled, would be used judiciously, responsibly, and appropriately. I apologize to you that not everyone shares my confidence.
