

BAYVIEW COMMUNITY UPDATE October 28, 2004

CBO Workshop

LEGISLATION INTRODUCED

1. At the October 26 Board of Supervisor's meeting, Supervisor Maxwell introduced legislation, co-sponsored by Supervisors Alioto-Pier, McGoldrick, Peskin, and Sandoval, to create disclosure and filing requirements for organizations that engage in election communications. This ordinance will close a loophole in current campaign finance laws that allows certain organizations - those that do not explicitly say "vote for" or "vote against" a candidate - to communicate with voters without having to disclose where their funding comes from. Under this proposed ordinance, all organizations that communicate with voters about candidates within 90 days of an election will be required to disclose their funding sources. An article in today's San Francisco Chronicle highlights the issue this legislation is designed to address.

LEGISLATION PENDING

1. Supervisor Maxwell's legislation to create a Back Streets Business Advisory Board, designed to make recommendations to the Board of Supervisors on policies and programs the city should adopt to retain and expand blue-collar jobs in the city, was unanimously approved today by the Rules Committee. The full Board of Supervisors will consider the legislation at its meeting on Tuesday, November 2.

Crime and Enforcement Update

On October 27, at 8:00 a.m., Bayview officers responded to the 1000 block of Gilman on the report of a fraud. The female caller told officers that she had received her bank statement and it showed that a check was drawn on her account for \$3,300.00. The woman stated that she had written no such check. The woman also showed the officers a copy of her 30 year old son's account statement, which showed a deposit to his account in the amount of \$3,300.00 on the same day as the withdrawal from her account. The officers went to ask the son for his side of the story and he said, "I want an attorney." The officers arrested the man for fraud (041 230 264).

On October 27, at 8:10 a.m., Bayview officers responded to SFGH and interviewed a man who was being treated for injuries he sustained as a result of a street robbery. The victim, who spoke only Cantonese, told the officers through an interpreter that he was walking to work in the Bayview and was suddenly punched on the back of the head, causing him to fall forward onto the sidewalk. The victim was rendered unconscious by the fall, and when he awoke, his currency and wallet were missing. The victim is unsure of the exact location of the attack, and could only describe the

suspect as a Latin male (041 227 744).

On October 27, at 12:14 p.m., Bayview officers arrested a woman at 120 Mississippi for an outstanding drug arrest warrant (041 111 009).

On October 27, at 12:45 p.m., Bayview officers were on patrol east on LaSalle at Keith when they saw a vehicle run through a stop sign and attempted to pull the vehicle over. The vehicle drove at a high rate of speed away from the officers and pulled into the parking lot of the Joe Lee Gym at Newcomb and Mendell. Four of the occupants of the vehicle exited the vehicle quickly and ran in separate directions. One of the suspects ran into the gym, pursued by two officers. The officers caught up to the man near a garbage can and detained him, and upon looking into the garbage can, found a loaded handgun. The officers arrested the man and seized the gun. The driver of the vehicle, a man living on the 1000 block of Connecticut, was cited for traffic violations. The arrested man, living on Commer Court, was booked for possession of a loaded handgun, as well as for possession of a firearm with obliterated serial numbers (041 228 974).

On October 27, at 2:19 p.m., Bayview officers responded to the 100 block of Dakota on a fight call. The female caller told police that she had a court-issued stay away order preventing her boyfriend from coming near her, and she wanted him arrested. The boyfriend was arrested for violation of a court order. The caller was found to have an outstanding arrest warrant charging her with burglary, and she too was arrested (041 229 405).

On October 27, at 3:38 p.m., Bayview officers were on patrol on the 1000 block of Connecticut Street when they saw a man they knew to be wanted for a parole violation. The man, living on the 900 block of Connecticut Street, was booked for the parole violation (041 229 875).

On October 27, at 4:10 p.m., Bayview plainclothes officers were conducting a surveillance in the Oakdale / Baldwin area (Oakdale Mob gang territory) when they saw a man loitering on the 1000 block of Oakdale. The officers saw the man bend down and begin digging in the area of a dirt path, and then bury something in the hole he had just created. The officers continued to watch the man as he sat nearby, and they then approached the man and detained him. The officers went to the dirt area and found a small hole covered with mulch, and as they removed the mulch, they discovered a plastic bag full of crack cocaine. The man, living in Vallejo, was booked for possession for sale of crack cocaine, and possession of marijuana (found in his pocket). The suspect was interviewed and denied all knowledge of the crack, stating that he neither sells nor uses crack. He has a possession of crack for sale case from the same street pending in the courts from April of this year, and he was admonished regarding his loitering for purposes of drug sales on the same block also (041 230 032).

On October 27, at 4:40 p.m., Bayview plainclothes officers were conducting a surveillance in the Oakdale / Baldwin area when they saw a young man make what appeared to be three separate drug deals. In each case, the young man was approached by individuals who handed him currency. The young man would then walk with the individual between the adjacent buildings and return a few moments later. The individuals each walked away from the young man after receiving small objects. The officers approached the young man and detained him and then searched the area he had walked to. The officers

located a napkin in a tree, and upon opening the napkin, discovered that it contained a large amount of crack cocaine. The suspect was arrested and transported to Bayview Station, and during transport, he dumped a baggie containing heroin in the back seat of the police car. The suspect, living in Oakland, was booked for possession of crack for sale, possession of heroin, and an outstanding arrest warrant from Alameda County (041 230 054).

On October 27, at 9:01 p.m., Bayview officers responded to a residential hotel room on the 6600 block of 3rd Street on a domestic violence call. The female caller told the officers that she was home with her boyfriend when another woman came to the door and asked for her boyfriend. The second woman entered the apartment and displayed a single rock of cocaine to the caller's boyfriend. The caller told her boyfriend that since there wasn't enough crack for everyone, they shouldn't smoke it right then. The boyfriend became angry and stated, "I'll smoke all I want. Don't tell me what to do." The boyfriend then attempted to push the caller from apartment, and she scratched his face. The caller then picked up a broomstick and swung it at her boyfriend, missing him. The boyfriend then punched the caller in the face and threatened to kill her with a steak knife. The boyfriend then fled from the apartment and drove away in the caller's truck. An emergency protective court order was issued in the case (041 231 052).
