Crime and Enforcement Update

On October 24, at 1:39 p.m., Bayview officers responded to LaSalle and Mendell on the report of an auto boosting in progress. The officers found a man using a coat hanger in an attempt to enter a parked vehicle. The officers detained the man and he stated that the vehicle belonged to his friend who lived nearby, and he was merely attempting to "move it a few feet." The officers obtained the vehicle's owner through the DMV records and interviewed him. The victim, who did not reside in the home pointed out by the suspect, stated that he did not know the suspect and had not given him permission to enter his vehicle. The suspect, living on Goettingen Street, was booked for auto boosting and for an outstanding arrest warrant (041 216 117).

On October 24, at 2:19 p.m., Bayview plainclothes officers were on patrol on the 1600 block of Quesada when they saw a young man who had recently sold drugs to an undercover police officer loitering in the area. As the young man saw the officers, he began to quickly walk away and the officers stopped to talk with him. The man dropped several objects to the ground and was then detained by the officers. The officers recovered the dropped items and found them to be baggies of marijuana. The 16 year old suspect, living on the 1700 block of Quesada, was arrested and transported to Bayview Station. En route to the station, the suspect disposed of seven additional baggies of marijuana in the rear seat of the police car. The suspect was booked at YGC for possession of marijuana for sale (041 216 220).

On October 24, at 2:47 p.m., a woman was walking on Felton near Brussels when she was approached by two suspects. The first suspect demanded the victim give him her bags. The victim is Hispanic, as was this suspect, and the demand was given in Spanish. The victim called out for help and both suspects fled. Suspect one is a Hispanic male, 18-20, 5'3", 130, wearing a white T-shirt and blue jean pants. Suspect two is a black male, 18-20,

6'0", 180, braided hair, wearing a long black coat and blue pants (041 216 399).

On October 24, at 4:00 p.m., Bayview officers were on patrol at Evans and Rankin when they were flagged down by a man who stated that property had just been stolen from his auto yard. The man pointed down the street toward two men pushing a shopping cart filled with auto parts and told the officers that he had seen one of the two men climb over the fence of his yard and then hand various auto parts over the fence to the second man. The officers stopped the two suspects and inspected the auto parts, each of which was stamped with the name of the yard from which they had been stolen. Both men were booked for theft charges and outstanding arrest warrants (041 216 559).

On October 24, at 5:43 p.m., Bayview plainclothes officers were on patrol at 25th and Connecticut when they saw a man they knew to be wanted for violation of his parole. The man, living on the 100 block of Harbor Road, was arrested and booked for the parole violation (041 216 844).

On October 25, at 12:00 p.m. Bayview officers took a report from a woman living on the 700 block of Burrows regarding a burglary which had just occurred. The woman told officers that she returned home and realized that someone had entered her home, so she went to a neighbor's house and phoned police. The victim continued watching her home as she awaited the police, and she saw a man exit her home and get into a late 70's to early 80's dark colored Toyota or Nissan and flee the area. The vehicle displayed a license plate similar to SCTZ289. A check of the victim's home revealed that entry had been gained by breaking out a window near the front door. The home was ransacked and was secured for fingerprints. The suspect was described as a black male, 18-24, 5'9", dark complected, clean shaven, dreadlocks, wearing a black stocking cap and baggy clothes (041 219 600).

On October 25, at 7:43 p.m., Bayview officers met with two Parole agents in order to search for a wanted parolee who was believed to be at Fitzgerald and Jennings. The officers and agents located the suspect and arrested him for violation of his parole (041 222 142).

On October 25, at 9:35 p.m., Bayview officers responded to 600 Amador Street on the report of a burglary. The officers located a man inside of the "yard" of the business at 701 Amador Street and detained him. The officers were unable to locate a responsible party for the business, but determined that the suspect was wanted for two outstanding arrest warrants. The suspect, living in Oakland, was booked for the drug warrants, and also for an additional quantity of methamphetamine found on his person (041 222 249).

On October 25, at 10:01 p.m., Bayview officers responded to a home on the 100 block of Dakota on a call of a verbal dispute. The officers met the female caller, who stated that her boyfriend, who was in the bathroom, was prohibited from being in her home due to a domestic violence restraining order which had previously been issued. The caller also told officers that the boyfriend was currently "smoking drugs" in the bathroom. The boyfriend then walked out of the bathroom and the officers placed him under arrest for the restraining order violation. A search of the bathroom revealed a

quantity of methamphetamine, and the boyfriend was charged with this also (041 218 975).

On October 25, at 11:06 p.m., Bayview officers responded to 3rd and Yosemite on the report of a group of four males chasing a lone Asian male. The officers then learned that the victim had walked into Bayview Station to file a report. The victim told the officers that he had been walking on 3rd Street from Hollister when he realized that four men were following him. The victim began to run and the four suspects chased him to 3rd and Yosemite, where they knocked him to the ground and stole his currency. The suspects then fled on foot. A witness in a passing vehicle was present for the actual robbery, and apparently scared the suspects away by stopping. The officers took the victim with them as they searched the area, and two potential suspects were located on Williams Avenue. The victim identified the suspects as two of the four who had robbed him. The witness was brought to the scene and he also identified both suspects. The first suspect, a 19 year old male living in Daly City, was booked for robbery. The second suspect, a 15 year old male living on the 900 block of Ingerson, was booked at YGC for robbery (041 222 471).

On October 25, at 11:37 p.m., Bayview officers responded to the Domino's Pizza at 320 Bayshore on the report of a robbery. The victim told the officers that he had been delivering a pizza to a home on the 1400 block of Innes at 11:00 p.m., when he was approached from behind by a lone male carrying a chrome revolver. The suspect took the victim's currency and jewelry, and the victim then saw two additional suspects reach into his truck and steal the thermal bag containing two pizzas. Suspect one was a black male, 20-25, 6'0", 170, wearing a black ski mask, black jacket and blue jean pants. Descriptions for suspects two and three were sketchy (041 222 465).

On October 25, at 12:46 p.m., Bayview officers were on patrol at Ingalls and Kiska when they were approached by a woman wishing to report a domestic violence incident. The woman, living on the 1100 block of Oakdale, told officers that her boyfriend had battered her. The woman also told officers that she had a restraining order against the boyfriend which prohibited him from being in her home. The officers responded to the home on Oakdale and were told by the victim's mother that the suspect had fled out the back door upon seeing the officers. The officers later located the suspect in the area and arrested him for domestic violence and violation of a court order. In addition, the suspect had an outstanding arrest warrant charging him with domestic violence, and he was booked for this also. The officers were able to find three prior cases of domestic violence which had been documented in SF police reports, and these cases were referenced in the current report (041 219 951).
