State of the City

Crime and Enforcement Update

On October 14, at 9:20 a.m., Bayview officers received information that drugs were being dealt out of a black Saab and a burgundy Toyota Camry at 3rd and McKinnon (this corner is notorious for heroin sales). The officers began to approach a man near one of the cars and saw him drop three objects to the ground. The officers retrieved the objects and found them to be packaged black tar heroin. The man, currently on parole, was arrested for possession of heroin and violation of parole (041 174 991).

On October 14, at 9:20 a.m., Bayview officers were still at 3rd and McKinnon streets investigating illegal narcotics sales when they saw two individuals smoking from a crack pipe. The officers arrested the individuals. The first subject, a man living on the 1500 block of LaSalle, was booked for possession of tar heroin and possession of narcotics paraphernalia. The second subject, a woman living on McAllister Street, was cited for possession of narcotics paraphernalia (041 175 159).

On October 14, at 4:30 p.m., Bayview officers responded to a home on the 1600 block of Revere on a domestic violence call. The female victim told officers that her ex-boyfriend had punched her twice in the chin and threatened to have her killed by a group of females. The suspect then fled to a green Chevy Tahoe SUV, and as he was driving away, he pointed a gray revolver at the victim. The suspect is Damont Kimble, 25 years, 6'0", 235 pounds, gold upper teeth, wearing a white shirt, blue jeans, and black athletic shoes (041 177 832).

On October 14, at 7:45 p.m., Bayview officers responded to the 600 block of Hamilton on the report of a street robbery. The victim told the officers that he was walking south on Hamilton when he was approached by a man who displayed a silver semi-auto handgun to him and stated, "Now you see what's going on, give me your money." The victim complied and handed his property over to the suspect, who then fled on foot. The suspect is described as a black male, 30-35, 5'10", 160, long goatee, wearing a white T-shirt and dark pants (041 178 169).

On October 14, at 8:35 p.m., Bayview officers responded to the 1200 block of Egbert on the report of a robbery. The victim stated that he was walking east on Yosemite at 3rd when two juvenile suspects approached him

and demanded his money. When the victim told the suspects he had no money, one of the suspects placed his hands into his pockets and stated, "I have a gun. You don't want me to pull it out." The victim began to flee the area and the suspects then threw rocks at the victim. The suspects fled east on Carroll. Suspect one was a black male, 15, 5'10", 180, wearing a white T-shirt, blue jeans, blue athletic shoes, riding a blue mountain bike. Suspect two was a black male, 12, 5'5", 125, wearing a gray jacket, green pants, riding a silver "razor-like" scooter (041 178 294).

On October 14, at 10:50 p.m., Bayview officers were on patrol at 3rd and Palou when they were flagged down by a man standing in the bus stop with blood on his shirt. The man stated that he had just been robbed by three men. The victim stated that the three suspects approached him and demanded money, and then surrounded him. One of the suspects then picked up a 2 by 4 piece of wood from the ground and hit the victim in the head with it. The victim fell to the ground and was struck eight to nine more times on his head with the wood. The suspects removed the victim's property from his pockets and fled on foot. The suspects are described as black males, 16-22, one wearing a white T-shirt with blue pants, the others wearing dark clothing (041 178 523).

On October 14, at 11:00 p.m., Bayview officers responded to Quint and Quesada on the report of shots being fired. The officers found shell casings at the scene, but nothing else. A woman approached the officers and described an auto which had been at the scene at the time she heard gunshots, but she was unsure if the auto was involved. She described it as an old white car with a blue stripe. The woman stated that two males were seated in the front seat of the auto. The officers later received a call from a man living on Ervine Street who stated that he had been shot while parked at Quint and Quesada. The victim stated that he was attempting to talk with a "girl" on the street when a dark green El Camino pulled alongside him and a passenger in the El Camino pointed a black semi-auto handgun at him and began firing, striking the victim. The suspect is described as black male, 20-23, no further (041 178 573).

On October 15, at 12:46 a.m., Bayview officers were on patrol at 3rd and 25th when they saw a Toyota Camry pull into the gas station. The officers ran the plate on the Camry, a frequently stolen auto, and determined that the vehicle was stolen from Capitola, California. The officers approached the driver and asked her about the vehicle, and she stated that she had borrowed it from a friend, although she didn't know the friend's name. The driver assured the officers that she had permission to have the vehicle, but they became suspicious of her statements when they saw a screwdriver sticking out of the ignition (as opposed to a key, which is a more traditional method of starting an auto). The woman, living in Elk Grove, was booked for stolen auto. Additionally, she was not allowed to keep her screwdriver, it was booked as evidence (041 178 761).
