Basketball

Crime and Enforcement Update

On November 4, at 9:49 a.m., Bayview officers responded to Kirkwood and Marlin on the report of an assault. The victim told officers that he was exiting his vehicle when a man walked up to him and asked him for change. When the victim told the suspect that he had none, the suspect reached into the victim's pockets, and as the victim pulled back, the suspect punched him in the eye. The suspect then threatened the victim with a silver chain, and the victim refused to give up his wallet, causing the suspect to flee on foot toward Jerrold. The suspect is a black male, 19-20, 5'8", 170, wearing a blue baseball cap and black jacket (041 262 029).

On November 4, at 12:00 p.m., a woman came into Bayview Station and told officers that she was driving her mother's vehicle on Westpoint Road when her ex-boyfriend pulled alongside her in her own vehicle, which she had previously reported stolen. The victim's boyfriend jumped out of the car and smashed the driver-side window of the victim's vehicle. The suspect then pulled the victim out of her car and threw her to the ground, where he beat her with his fists and kicked her numerous times. The suspect was accompanied by a woman, who also beat the victim. Both suspects then got back into the stolen vehicle and fled. At 2:15 p.m., Bayview plainclothes officers were on patrol at Oakdale and Baldwin when they saw a man look in their direction and then take off running. This area is known Oakdale Mob territory, and the officers began to search for the man due to his suspicious behavior. The officers located the man within minutes, and he was in the company of a woman. The officers saw that the man had fresh blood stains on his shirt. Another officer arrived at the scene and realized that the man and woman were the suspects from the earlier domestic violence case. Both suspects were arrested. The man, living on Garlington Street, was booked for domestic violence and aggravated assault. The woman, living on Topeka Street, was booked for the same charges (041 262 546).

On November 4, at 1:50 p.m., Bayview officers were on patrol at 3rd and Oakdale when they saw a man driving a light gray Chevy Blazer who they believed was wanted by parole. The officers stopped the vehicle and contacted the parole agents, who were in the district looking for this man, and the agents responded to the officers' location. The man stopped, living on the 1500 block of Quesada, was in fact the wanted parolee, and he was taken into custody and booked for violation of his parole (041 263 328).

On November 4, at 2:21 p.m., Bayview officers were on patrol at 25th and Michigan when they saw a man they knew to be wanted for a felony narcotics warrant. The officers arrested the man for a warrant charging him with possession of cocaine (040 770 865).

On November 4, at 3:45 p.m., Bayview plainclothes officers were on patrol on the 1500 block of Kirkwood when they saw a known member of the Big Block gang seated in a car with another man. The officers had previously arrested the man for gun violations, and knew him to have an active drug case pending in the courts. The officers approached the men and saw a ski mask on the dash of their vehicle. Believing that the first man might again be armed, the officers patted him down, discovering a bag containing crack cocaine in his jacket pocket. The second man also possessed a bag containing crack cocaine. Both suspects were booked possession for sale of crack cocaine (041 263 635).

On November 4, at 4:41 p.m., Bayview officers responded to the first block of Reardon Road on the report of shots fired into a home. The victim told officers that she noticed a hole in the floor of her apartment and became suspicious when she also noticed a hole in her ceiling. The officers conducted an investigation and determined that a shot had apparently been fired from the upstairs apartment into the victim's apartment. When the officers spoke with the woman living in the upstairs apartment, she told officers she didn't own a gun and knew nothing of the incident. The woman also told officers that her boyfriend had recently been in her apartment. The officers did a records check on the boyfriend and determined that he is a convicted felon and is currently wanted for violation of his parole (041 263 895).

On November 4, at 6:36 p.m., Bayview plainclothes officers removed several messages from our station "anonymous tip" line having to do with the non-stop drug dealing occurring at 3rd and Hollister, specifically, that drug dealing being committed by members of a notorious family living in the area referenced many times in these e-mails. The officers set up a surveillance of the area and saw three brothers from the mentioned family hanging out in front of the liquor store. A fourth man (also known to the officers as a drug dealer) drove up the three men, and the four men then drove away. The men drove to the gas station at Carroll and Quint and the officers detained them. A search of the vehicle revealed a quantity of packaged marijuana, and the brother who had been sitting on the marijuana was booked possession for sale. The second brother was booked for an outstanding arrest warrant. The third brother, along with the driver of the vehicle, was released without charges (041 264 241).

On November 4, at 7:41 p.m., Bayview officers responded to 1610 Jerrold on

the report of a security officer being assaulted. The security guard told officers that he was attempting to remove the suspect from the drive-through window area, and the suspect, who was pretty liquored up and could barely stand, begin swinging a bag of empty cans at him. The security guard kept him at bay and called the police. The subject was booked for assault and public intoxication. His cans were not booked as evidence (041 264 401).
