#### Late Night Basketball

#### Crime and Enforcement Update

On October 30, a techno music event took place on Pier 48. Undercover officers from our Narcotics Detail were present to address concerns about sales and usage of illicit drugs, primarily ecstasy. The officers made numerous sales cases, including the following:

At 7:55 p.m., the officers arrested a man, living in Palo Alto, for sales and possession for sale of ecstasy. Also arrested was a man, living in Redwood City, for the same charges (041 243 091).

At 8:30 p.m., the officers arrested a man, living in Redwood City, for sales and possession for sale of ecstasy. The man fought with the officers and was also charged with resisting arrest (041 243182).

At 9:15 a.m., the officers arrested a man, living in Fremont, for sales and possession for sale of ecstasy (041 243 289).

At 10:45 p.m., the officers arrested a man, living in Oakland, for sales of marijuana and resisting arrest. The man, dressed as a Ninja, fought violently with the officers upon being arrested and punched two of the officers. The first man was accompanied by a second man, dressed as a purple Merlin, and he too was booked for marijuana sales and resisting arrest (041 243 596).

At 11:15 p.m., the officers arrested a man, living in San Jose, for sales and possession for sale of ecstasy (041 243 609).

At 11:30 p.m., the officers arrested a man for sales and possession for sale of ecstasy (041 243 615).

At 1:20 a.m., the officers arrested a man, living on 25th Street, for sales of ecstasy (041 243 950).

On November 2, plainclothes officers from Bayview Station teamed with members of our Narcotics Detail to conduct a narcotics operation in the Bayview utilizing undercover buy officers. The following cases were made:

At 9:36 a.m., plainclothes officers were surveilling the area of Keith and Thomas when they saw a known drug dealer conduct two sales to individuals who had approached him on the sidewalk. The dealer then entered a car and began to drive away. The officers stopped the vehicle and conducted a probation search on the seller, finding a quantity of tar heroin. The seller, living on George Court, was booked for sales and transportation of heroin and violation of probation (041 253 294).

At 11:06 a.m., plainclothes officers were surveilling the area of Oakdale and Baldwin when they saw a drug deal being conducted by a validated member of the Oakdale Mob gang. The officers saw the seller walk underneath a stairway at 1101 Oakdale during the sale, and the officers checked this area after approaching and detaining the two males seen engaging in the sale. The officers found a stash of crack cocaine when they checked the stairway area, and the cocaine was seized and booked as evidence. The seller, living on the 1000 block of Griffith, was booked for sales and possession for sale of crack cocaine, gang charges and possession of marijuana. The man with the seller, living in Vallejo, was booked for transportation of crack cocaine and possession of marijuana (041 254 076).

At 2:47 p.m., an undercover officer purchased two rocks of crack cocaine from a man at Newcomb and Newhall. The dealer got into the officer's car for the exchange, and a woman then approached the car and told the seller not to complete the deal because the buyer was probably a cop. The deal was completed and the seller then exited the car, joined the female, and began to walk away. The cover officers then approached the buyer, and he dropped a bag of crack cocaine to the sidewalk. The seller was booked for sales and possession for sale of crack cocaine. The female was booked for an outstanding arrest warrant charging her with sales of cocaine. The female was also charged with violating a stay-away order which prohibits her from going near Newcomb and Newhall (041 255 022).

On November 2, at 12:15 p.m., Bayview's quality of life enforcement officers responded to a large homeless encampment at Amazon and Cargo Streets after receiving numerous complaints regarding illegal activity in the vacant lot. The officers found numerous tents, large piles of garbage and debris, piles of salvaged metal, and signs of rodent infestation. Four individuals were cited for illegal lodging. A fifth individual was arrested for possession of methamphetamine and failure to register as a convicted sex offender (041 253 937).

On November 2, at 5:34 p.m., Bayview officers responded to 680 Illinois on the report of trespassers. The caller told officers that numerous people were living illegally within his employer's building, and when he asked them to leave, they threatened him and refused. The officers entered the building and found large piles of debris and garbage strewn about the building. The officers found a man inside and were going to cite him for illegal lodging but couldn't determine his actual name. The man provided one name, then changed his mind and used a second name (for which he presented a California ID card), and finally offered a third name, which he was booked under. The man was booked for various charges, including providing a false name to a peace officer, twice. We think (041 255 773).
