#### Crime and Enforcement Update

On November 24, at 1:20 a.m., Bayview officers responded to 3rd and Kirkwood on the report of a kidnapping. The female caller told officers that an acquaintance of hers had picked her up at her place of employment and driven her to the East Bay. A second male was present in the car with the driver and victim. The driver returned to San Francisco and when the victim asked to be driven home, the driver told her that she now "worked" for him and was now his "ho." The victim jumped out of the vehicle at 3rd and Oakdale, and then phoned the police. The driver suspect is a rapper named Dumay who uses the stage name "D-Moe." He is a black male, 20-25, 5'9", 160, wearing a red coat, blue jeans, and white pin-stripe hat (041 339 468).

On November 24, at 1:48 p.m., Bayview officers were on patrol at Westpoint and Middlepoint when they saw a man they knew to be wanted standing on the sidewalk. The officers approached the man and he took off running. The officers lost the man in the area, but located him later in the same general area. The man was booked for a outstanding warrant charging him with cocaine sales (041 341 667).

On November 24, at 4:30 p.m., Bayview officers arrested a man at 3rd and Quesada for two outstanding arrest warrants. A search of the man revealed a quantity of methamphetamine. The man, living on Hearst Street, was booked for the warrants and the drug charges (041 342 245).

On November 24, at 6:59 p.m., Bayview plainclothes officers walking through the Oakdale and Baldwin area when they came across four individuals loitering near 1101 Oakdale. The officers noticed that three of the individuals were validated members of the Oakdale Mob gang, and all four individuals were detained. The officers then saw a paper bag on the ground near the feet of the two gang members and looked inside it, finding 31 rocks of crack cocaine. The officers also found a crumpled candy wrapper on the ground and looked inside of it, finding an additional 25 rocks of crack cocaine and one large chunk of crack. The first subject, a juvenile

living on the 1300 block of Ingalls, was booked for drug charges, gang charges, and conspiracy at YGC. The second subject, a juvenile living on the 1100 block of Oakdale, was booked on the same charges. The third subject, a juvenile living on Lakeview, was also booked for the same charges (041 342 950).

On November 24, at 8:17 p.m., Bayview officers were on patrol on the 900 block of 16th Street when they saw a man near a parked vehicle trying numerous keys in the door in an apparent attempt to open the door. Upon seeing the officers, the man began to walk away quickly and the officers detained him. The man told the officers that the vehicle he was attempting to enter belonged to his sister, but a DMV check revealed that it did not. The officers arrested the man and searched him, finding over 40 house and vehicle keys which had been filed down. The officers also found a plastic container in the man's sock which contained a white crystal substance. The man told officers that the substance was vitamin B12. The officers, although unfamiliar with the properties of vitamin B12, opted to err on the side of caution and booked the man for possession of methamphetamine, as well as for attempted auto burglary and possession of burglar tools. The man has prior arrests for both auto theft and vehicle tampering (041 343 152).

On November 24, at 8:35 p.m., Bayview officers responded to Quesada and Quint on the report of an accident. The officers interviewed both parties and noticed that one of the drivers had alcohol on his breath. The driver, living on the 1900 block of Quesada, was booked for drunk driving after registering .27 on his breath test (.08 is the legal limit) 041 343 334.

On November 24, at 8:48 p.m., Bayview officers responded to Bertha Lane on a shooting call. The officers found a man lying in the street with a gunshot wound to his temple. The officers began CPR and attempted to control a hostile crowd of 40 to 50 people who were present and refused to back away from the crime scene. Officers at the scene canvassed the area and obtained information regarding two vehicles and a suspect which witnesses had seen fleeing the area following the shooting. The victim died of his injuries. See below for additional developments regarding this case (041 343 237).

On November 25, at 7:03 a.m., Bayview plainclothes officers arrested a woman, living on Dakota Street, for an outstanding arrest warrant charging her with possession of cocaine (030 003 886).

On November 25, at 7:16 a.m., Bayview plainclothes officers arrested a man, living on the 1500 block of Underwood, for an outstanding warrant charging him with numerous drug offenses (041 704 024).

On November 25, at 7:39 a.m., Bayview plainclothes officers arrested a man, living on Westbrook Court, for an outstanding arrest warrant. The officers found numerous rocks of crack cocaine in his jacket pocket. The man was booked for the warrant, which charged him with a firearms violation, and the new drug charges (041 344 257).

On November 25, at 10:35 a.m., Bayview plainclothes officers located a vehicle parked on the 1100 block of Mendell which matched the description

of a vehicle seen fleeing the murder scene described above (Bertha Lane.) The officers staked out the vehicle and eventually a man entered it and drove away. The officers stopped the vehicle and detained the driver, who they found to be carrying a plastic firearm in his waistband. The man was interviewed by the assigned Homicide Inspector, and it appears he may have only been in the area of the homicide and had been seen fleeing the area, but was not actually involved in the crime (041 343 237).

On November 25, at 11:35 a.m., Bayview officers were on patrol at Selby and Hudson when they saw a man they knew to be wanted and approached him. The officers arrested the man for an outstanding warrant charging him with attempted burglary. A search of the man revealed quantities of both methamphetamine and cocaine. The man was booked for the warrant, the drug charges, and violation of probation (041 344 780).

On November 25, at 1:25 p.m., Bayview officers were on patrol at 3rd and Palou when they saw a man they knew to be wanted and stopped to arrest him. The man, living on the 1500 block of Kirkwood, was booked for the outstanding drug warrant (020 551 425).

On November 26, at 12:41 p.m., Bayview plainclothes officers were on patrol at Fitzgerald and Jennings when they saw a known drug dealer standing on the corner speaking with another man. The officers approached the dealer and saw him place an object into his mouth. The man began to swallow the object and was detained. The man was unable to swallow the object, which turned out to be tar heroin wrapped in cellophane, and he was arrested. The man, living on the 1200 block of Palou, was booked for possession of heroin for sale and an outstanding arrest warrant. The man has three narcotics cases currently pending in Superior Court (041 347 596).

On November 26, at 1:11 p.m., Bayview plainclothes officers were on patrol on the 900 block of Connecticut when they saw a man handing what appeared to be narcotics to a juvenile. The officers approached the juvenile and he took off on his bicycle. When the officers caught up to him, they found that he was a 14 year old on probation for stolen auto, and also that he was wearing an electronic monitoring device on his ankle (for home detention). The juvenile, living on the 1800 block of 25th Street, was released after being identified. The adult was also stopped, and was found to have a pocket full of small currency bills. The officers also found a bag containing 55 baggies of marijuana nearby to the man. The man, 18 years of age and from Boston, was charged with trespassing on Housing Authority property. The marijuana was booked for eventual destruction (041 347 706).

On November 26, at 1:25 p.m., Bayview plainclothes officers were on patrol at Westpoint and Middlepoint when they saw a man they knew to be wanted. The officers arrested the man and found over \$2,300.00 in currency in his pocket. The money was booked as evidence, pending an investigation by our Narcotics Unit. The man was booked for an outstanding warrant charging him with cocaine sales (041 577 473).

On November 26, at 7:45 p.m., Bayview officers responded to the 1600 block of Kirkwood on the report of a robbery. The victim told officers that he was approached in front of his home by a female who asked if she could

charge her cell phone for a few minutes in his home. The man agreed to this and brought the woman's cell phone into his home, returning it to her a while later. The woman then held a knife to the victim's throat and was joined by two men, who went through his pockets. The three suspects then fled on dark mountain bikes. Suspect one is a black female, 5'8", 140, blond hair, wearing a black jacket with white patches on the elbows, white Capri pants and white tennis shoes. Suspect two is a black male, 5'8", 160, wearing black clothing. Suspect three is a black male, 5'8", 165, wearing a black baseball hat and black clothing (041 349 213).

On November 26, at 8:38 p.m., Bayview officers arrested a man, living on Apollo Street, at 3rd and Newcomb for an outstanding arrest warrant from San Mateo County (041 349 360).

On November 27, at 12:54 a.m., Bayview officers were on patrol on the 1400 block of Innes when they saw a parked vehicle with a license plate which was listed on their hot sheet. The officers found a man inside the vehicle and arrested him. The officers conducted a follow-up investigation and found that the suspect's wife (the owner of the vehicle) had reported the vehicle stolen following a domestic violence incident. The man was booked for stolen auto, possession of stolen property, robbery, and domestic violence. He was also charged with two outstanding arrest warrants (041 491 340).

On November 27, at 12:05 p.m., Bayview officers responded to Revere and Griffith on the report of an auto boost. The victim told officers that he had caught a man inside of his parked vehicle and had chased him off. The victim told officers that the suspect was a local who he frequently sees riding a bike through the area. At 2:23 p.m., a Bayview sergeant saw a man at Underwood and Ingalls who matched the description given earlier of the suspect, and he detained the man. The victim was brought to the scene for a cold show, and the victim positively identified the man as the suspect who he had found inside his vehicle. The man was booked for auto burglary (041 351 224).

On November 27, at 5:07 p.m., Bayview officers were on patrol at Lathrop and Gillette when they found a man and a woman having sex in a parked auto. The woman was found to have an outstanding warrant and was arrested. A search of her purse revealed a syringe filled with brown fluid. The woman, living on the 1300 block of Oakdale, was charged with the warrant and possession of heroin (041 352 103).

On November 27, at 7:35 p.m., Bayview officers were on patrol at 16th and Illinois when they saw a man preparing to get on a motorcycle and determined that the motorcycle was stolen. The man was booked for stolen auto (041 316 265).

On November 27, at 11:30 p.m., Bayview officers were flagged down by a man who told them that he had just been shot at Missouri and Mariposa Streets. The victim told officers that a man had approached him as he was stopped in his car at the intersection, and the man had yelled out, "Where are you from, get out of your car." The victim stated that he then heard a loud bang and realized he had been shot in the leg. The suspect is a black male, 18-25, 6'6", 200, wearing a dark sweatshirt with hood and dark pants

(041 353 264).

On November 28, at 3:56 p.m., two Bayview officers were working the 49er game at Monster Park when security alerted them to the presence of a man who was being disruptive and was climbing a rail after being warned repeatedly not to. The officers began to speak with the man and observed that he was quite intoxicated and smelled of marijuana. The officers attempted to escort the man from the stadium and he became violent and resisted their efforts, eventually striking the officers as he shouted obscenities. The man was arrested and charged with drunk in public, possession of marijuana, resisting arrest, and battery on a peace officer. It must be noted that the man was shouting out anti-49er statements and was clearly a Miami fan (041 355 066).

On November 28, at 5:09 p.m., Bayview officers arrested a man, living on Watchman Way, at 23rd and Dakota for an outstanding arrest warrant charging him with possession of cocaine and possession of narcotics paraphernalia (041 355 298).
