Police Officer Applications

Crime and Enforcement Update

The first three cases listed below are related to one another.

On November 17, at 1:50 p.m., Bayview officers responded to Pier 96 (end of Cargo) on the report of two gunshot victims. The officers found two men lying on the ground, bleeding from numerous gunshot wounds. The victims were taken by ambulance to SFGH. A woman who had been walking her dog in the area told officers that she had seen two vehicles, one apparently chasing the other, speeding into the area. The witness saw the side door of the second vehicle (van) open up and a man lean out holding a black firearm. The witness then saw the two vehicles drive between two postal storage bins and she heard 4-5 shots. One of the victims was able to tell the officers that he and his friend had been driving home from a car auction when they were suddenly "cut off" by a van. The victim stated that the persons in the van began chasing his vehicle, and eventually, a suspect in the van shot him and his friend. The shooter is described as a black male, 25-27, 150 pounds, wearing a white T-shirt, brown pants, armed with a black revolver. The suspect van is described as possibly a newer Toyota Sienna, silver or white colored. The license plate on the van possibly began with "5EX," followed possibly with an "8" or a "3." (041 314 034) See the below related case.

On November 17, at 5:27 p.m., Bayview officers developed information regarding the shooter in the above case and responded to a home on Jennings Court, where the suspect was alleged to be living with his girlfriend and her mother. As the first Bayview officers were arriving at the home, a man was seen near the front window, and all of the lights in the home then went out. Numerous units responded and cordoned off the area, surrounding the house and block. SWAT officers and a search dog eventually entered the home, but found it empty. The suspect had apparently fled out the rear of the home upon seeing the first officers. This suspect, who is has not been formally named by the victims but is believed to be the likely shooter, is well known to Bayview officers and is believed responsible for more than

one Bayview homicide. See the below related case.

On November 17, Bayview plainclothes officers received information that a local Oakdale Mob gangster, well known to Bayview officers, had been seen recently in the Oakdale and Baldwin area armed with a black assault rifle. At 7:30 p.m., the officers received additional information that the suspect was in the company of another well known Oakdale Mob gangster, and that they were inside of a residence on the 1000 block of Griffith Street. The officers were told that these gang members were about to shoot some rival gang members in retaliation for a shooting which had taken place earlier in the day in the Bayview (see the above described shooting from Cargo Street). The officers responded to the described apartment and set up a perimeter on it prior to knocking on the door. A group of officers covered the back of the premises, and as they did, they could see inside the premises and saw one of the previously named suspects holding a black semi-auto handgun. The officers in front of the premises made entry, and the officers in the rear saw (through the window) the suspect place the handgun into an entertainment center and run up the stairs. Two suspects were detained on the lower floor of the apartment, and three suspects (including the two named suspects) barricaded themselves in a bedroom on the upper floor. The officers in the rear of the unit then saw the suspects open the window, in an apparent attempt to jump and escape, but upon seeing the officers, they closed the window and retreated. The officers attempted to force the bedroom door open, but it continued to swing back closed. When the officers eventually were able to enter the room, they saw that a 400 pound man had been leaning against it, hence the difficulty in opening it. Present in the bedroom with the three suspects was a 3 year old boy. The officers searched the room and found an AK-47 assault rifle hidden under the child's bed. The rifle was outfitted with a high capacity magazine. The officers also located a plastic bag containing a large amount of cocaine at the head of a bed in another bedroom. Two additional firearms, a black semi-auto handgun and a chrome revolver were also found in this bedroom. Boxes of ammunition were found in an additional room and were seized as evidence. The five adult male suspects in the home were all arrested, and as they were being handcuffed and placed into police cars, one of the suspects (already handcuffed) pushed the officer guarding him away and ran into a dark area nearby and was lost. The first booked suspect was charged with possession of a firearm by a felon, possession of an assault weapon, gang charges, conspiracy, possession of drugs and resisting arrest. The second suspect was charged with the same offenses. The third suspect, living on the 1000 block of Griffith, was arrested for an outstanding felony arrest warrant. The fourth suspect, also living on the 1000 block of Griffith, was charged with failure to register as a sex offender and an outstanding arrest warrant. The wanted suspect is Curtis Jones, born 1981, 6'0", 190, last seen wearing dark clothing and a set of handcuffs (041 315 587). It is very likely that the actions taken by the Bayview officers in this case prevented another gang-related retaliatory shooting, and perhaps even saved one or more lives.

On November 17, at 10:30 a.m., Bayview officers were on patrol on the 400 block of Illinois when they saw two tents pitched on the sidewalk and saw two men seated nearby "stripping" the insulation from copper wire. The officers asked the men if the tents belonged to them, and they stated that

they did not, but that they were "watching" the tents for other parties who were in jail. The first man was booked for an outstanding felony arrest warrant. The second man was cited for illegal lodging (041 312 828).

On November 17, at 5:30 p.m., Bayview officers took a report from a woman who told them that her ex-boyfriend had beat and strangled her. The woman told officers that her ex-boyfriend became enraged when she received a phone call from another man, and he began to strangle and threaten her. The woman left the home, but returned later and found the ex-boyfriend still present. The ex-boyfriend demanded that the woman accept his apology for his previous conduct (choking her), and when she refused, he bit her in the nose. The ex-boyfriend then threw the woman to the ground and threatened to kill her. The woman attempted to phone the police, and the ex-boyfriend then dismantled both of her phones, preventing her from phoning anyone. The victim was eventually able to make contact with the police, and a report was taken. The officers tracked down the suspect in this case, living on Westbrook court, and booked him for domestic violence, terrorist threats, injuring phone lines, false imprisonment, aggravated assault, and attempted murder (041 315 424).

On November 17, at 5:05 p.m., a man reported to Bayview officers that he was at his home the previous evening when his ex-girlfriend phoned and demanded to speak with him. The man's brother had answered the phone and told the woman that he was unavailable. This enraged the woman, and she told the victim's brother that she was going to "burn" his car. The victim ignored this threat, and as he was approaching his vehicle in the morning, he could see that a window had been broken out and a fire had been set inside the vehicle. The man also determined that his brake lines had been cut. The man has decided to no longer ignore phone calls from his ex-girlfriend (041 314 567).

On November 17, at 7:10 p.m, Bayview officers responded to Watchman Way on the report of a shooting victim. The officers found a man bleeding from a single gunshot wound to his foot. The victim told officers that he had been standing near his parked vehicle on Missouri Street when new model silver Dodge Intrepid pulled up to him and he heard gunshots and then saw the passenger of the vehicle shooting at him, with one of the shots striking his foot. The victim told officers he had no idea why anyone would shoot at him, and the victim refused to provide any description for the suspect (041 315 270).
