Crime and Enforcement Update

On October 29, at 4:12 a.m., Bayview officers were on patrol at Latona and Bayview when they saw what they believed to be a drug deal take place between a man and a woman. The couple split up and walked in separate directions, and the officers got out of their car in order to detain them. The officers caught up to the male, but lost the female in the area. The male identified himself to the officer, and when the officers ran his name they determined that he was on probation. The male then told the officers that he was lying and had given his brother's name. The male then gave his actual name and the officers determined that he had an outstanding arrest warrant charging him with possession of crack cocaine (he should have stuck with the original story). The suspect, living on the first block of Latona, was booked for the warrant (041 236 278).

On October 29., at 11:18 a.m., Bayview officers arrested a man, living on Argonaut Street, at 700 Missouri for an outstanding arrest warrant charging him with a narcotics violation. The man was also charged with a new case of possession of crack cocaine and violation of probation (041 237 298).

On October 29, at 12:27 p.m., Bayview officers arrested a man, living on Webster Street, at Revere and Jennings for an outstanding arrest warrant charging him with possession for sale of cocaine and destroying evidence (041 237 737).

On October 29, at 3:56 p.m., Bayview plainclothes officers saw three known "Big Block" gang members loitering near Kirkwood and Mendell. The officers began to approach the group and one of the men took off running toward 3rd Street, all the while keeping his hand near his waistband (indicative of a person armed with a firearm). The suspect removed his jacket while running, and then threw a gun to the ground and still continued running. The officers overtook and arrested the suspect, and retrieved the handgun. The man, living in Daly City, was booked for possession of a loaded and concealed handgun, possession of crack cocaine for sale, possession of stolen property, and gang charges (041 238 688).

On October 29, at 7:05 p.m., Bayview officers interviewed a woman living on the 100 block of Westpoint who told officers that her son was violating a stay-away order by loitering at Westpoint and Middlepoint. The woman told officers that she had seen her son counting a "big wad" of money, and that he was selling drugs (again) in the area. The officers, who know the suspect well, saw him a few minutes later near the basketball courts and approached him. The suspect began running and dragged an officer down a

dirt hill after being grabbed by the officer. The suspect was eventually arrested and charged with transportation of crack cocaine, resisting arrest, violation of a court order, and trespassing. The suspect's mother told officers that she wishes that the criminal justice system would keep her son in jail because she feels that he's going to be killed if he keeps on selling drugs (041 239 363).

On October 29, at 7:50 p.m., a woman living on the first block of Northridge told Bayview officers that a man she knows had come to her residence and demanded entry by knocking and kicking on her front door. When the man couldn't gain entry to the woman's apartment, he went to her back door and began kicking on it. The woman looked out her window and saw that the man was armed with a gun. The man then kicked in the rear door and entered the apartment, and the woman then ran out the front door and ran to a relative's house, where she phoned police. The woman told officers that the man is angry because she won't pursue a romantic relationship with him. The wanted suspect is Michael Gaines and he resides in the 6th Street area. Gaines is known to drive a maroon colored van (041 239 567).

On October 29, at 11:53 p.m., Bayview officers were on patrol at 3rd and Mariposa when they were flagged down by a man who stated that he had just been robbed. The victim told officers that he was standing in the bus stop when 6-8 suspects approached him and one of the suspects punched him in the face, causing him to fall to the ground. All of the suspects began to beat and punch the victim, and they then removed his shoes, pants, and his gold teeth (caps). The officers put the victim into their car and began to search the area. At 22nd and Indiana Streets the officers saw two individuals and the victim told officers, "Those are the ones who jumped me." The officers got out of the car and detained one of the suspects, but the other suspect started running and was chased by one of the officers, who eventually overtook and detained the suspect. A search of the first suspect revealed an air gun (which appears very similar to an actual handgun), gold teeth caps, and a quantity of marijuana. The first suspect, living on the 100 block of Middlepoint, was booked for robbery, conspiracy, possession of an air gun, and possession of marijuana. The second suspect, living on the 1600 block of Yosemite, was booked for robbery, conspiracy, and resisting arrest (041 240 360).

On October 30, at 5:23 a.m., Bayview officers responded to the 1000 block of Fitzgerald on a vandalism call. The caller had given a description of the suspect, and had told Dispatch that he might be carrying a gun. The officers found and detained the suspect, and as they were "patting him down" for weapons, he took off running. The officers caught and attempted to detain the man, who then began kicking the officers, resulting in injuries to one of the officers. The officers ultimately arrested the suspect and then attempted to interview the caller. The caller then told officers, "Get the (expletive deleted) out of here." The caller had apparently had a change of heart. The suspect was booked for an outstanding arrest warrant and a new charge of battery on a peace officer (041 240 815).

On October 30, at 9:40 a.m., Bayview officers arrested a man, living on the 5100 block of 3rd Street, at 1498 Thomas for two outstanding arrest warrants charging him with stolen auto, drunk driving, disturbing the

peace, and other related offenses (041 241 330).

On October 30, at 5:34 p.m., Bayview officers made a traffic stop on a vehicle at Oakdale and Ingalls, and as the officer approached the driver he recognized him as having an active arrest warrant and the driver gunned the car and took off at a high rate of speed. The vehicle could be seen driving through numerous stop signs as it fled from the officers, and it was lost in the area. Moments later, different officers located the vehicle parked at Jamestown and Gilroy, and then saw the suspect running from the area. The officers attempted to arrest the suspect, but he took a fighting stance and resisted their efforts. The suspect was eventually arrested and told the officers he had been running because he thought that he was wanted for having just "hit (his) old lady." The suspect was booked for his outstanding warrant and new charges of flight from an officer, reckless driving, probation violation, and resisting arrest. The suspect, living on the 200 block of Harbor Road, is a well known Bayview drug dealer, and had over \$1,100.00 in currency on his person. The currency was booked for a follow-up investigation by our Narcotics Detail (041 242 463).

On October 30, at 6:16 p.m., Bayview officers took custody of a male at Espanola and Rosie Lee from private security guards who had detained him for a narcotics offense. The suspect, living in San Mateo, was booked for possession of cocaine and possession of narcotics paraphernalia (041 242 833).

On October 30, at 10:50 p.m., Bayview officers responded to 3rd and Kirkwood on the report of a carjacking. The victim told officers that he was leaving the corner liquor store and walking to his car when a green Nissan Ultima pulled up to him and the front passenger pointed a black semi-auto handgun at him and stated, "(N word), break yourself, you know what time it is." The victim could see that the passenger in the rear seat was holding a sawed-off shotgun. The victim, and his passenger, got out of their vehicle and the suspects entered it, driving off in both cars. The victims then heard several gunshots ring out in the area (several casings were late found near 1550 Kirkwood). The victim's vehicle is a 95 Chevy Classic, 4 door, white in color, California license 4XGF979. The suspects are described as black males wearing all black clothing with black ski masks (041 243 568).

On October 31, at 5:30 p.m., Bayview plainclothes officers were on patrol at Westpoint and Middlepoint Roads when they saw a drug deal take place. The officers arrested both the seller and the buyer. The seller, living on the 100 block of Westpoint, was booked for sales and possession for sale of crack cocaine. The buyer, living on Treasure Island, was booked for possession of crack cocaine and an outstanding arrest warrant. The buyer was also charged with threatening a peace officer after he told the arresting officer, "(Expletive deleted), you need to take off that badge so I can kick your (rear end)." 041 242 617

On October 31, at 1:35 a.m., numerous Bayview officers responded to 16th and Illinois on the report of a shooting. When the officers arrived, they found that five separate vehicles had been damaged as a result of an accident. The officers searched for the victim of the shooting to no avail, but found a blood trail on the west sidewalk of Illinois Street.

The officers then interviewed numerous female witnesses at the scene who told them that they were walking back to their cars from Kelly's Mission Rock Inn and ended up in the middle of a gunfight. The females provided a very confusing description of what had just occurred. According to these witnesses, an occupant of a silver colored vehicle had exited his vehicle and shot several times into a white four door Buick. No victims could be located at the scene, but two victims were later found at SFGH, each with numerous gunshot wounds. Both victims were uncooperative and provided little information regarding the incident. The first victim is a 19 year old male from the Sunnydale. The second victim is an 18 year old male from Daly City (041 244 033).
