

BAYVIEW COMMUNITY UPDATE May 3, 2005

Central Subway Meetings

In response to community support, Muni is pursuing a Supplemental Environmental Impact Statement to evaluate a Fourth Street Alignment for the Central Subway. There will be two community meetings held to discuss this issue. The first meeting will be held Tuesday, May 10, from 6:30 to 8:30 p.m. at the Parc 55 Hotel, Barcelona Room, 3rd Floor, 55 Cyril Magnin. The second meeting will be held on Tuesday, June 7, at the Municipal Transportation Agency Board, 2:00 p.m., City Hall, Room 400.

Crime and Enforcement Update

Warrant Arrest, 200 Elmira, May 2, 9:32 a.m.

Bayview Officer Damonte responded on a call of a wanted person and spoke with the caller who stated that his daughter was wanted for an outstanding arrest warrant. The 14 year old girl was taken to YGC and booked for the warrant (050 485 559)

Domestic Violence, 9500 block Gilman, May 2, 11:09 a.m.

Bayview Officers Nevin and Remedios responded on the call of an assault and spoke with a husband and wife who provided conflicting accounts of a physical fight they had just engaged in. Both individuals had physical injuries and there were no witnesses. The husband had obtained a court order from San Mateo County preventing the wife from harassing him, and the wife was advised of the specifics of the order. Both parties were advised to contact our Domestic Violence Unit for follow-up (050 484 971).

Possible Burglary, 398 Pennsylvania, May 2, 11:20 a.m.

Numerous Bayview officers responded on the report of a burglary in progress and spoke with the caller who had been driving by her neighbor's home and had seen two feet sticking out of the (large) mail slot. The caller had also seen a second man standing outside the home as the feet disappeared into the home. A perimeter was set up by responding officers and the premises were searched, to no avail. The owner of the premises was contacted and stated that the description provided of the suspects matched that of two construction workers who had been working on his home and may have left some of their tools in his garage (050 486 400).

Intoxicated Juvenile, 400 Mansell, May 2, 11:33 a.m.

Bayview Officer Miller responded to Burton High School on the report of a returned missing juvenile and spoke with the caller, who is the brother-in-law of the juvenile. The caller stated that his 15 year old brother-in-law had stayed out all weekend and had then come to school Monday both drunk and under the influence of marijuana. The juvenile was refusing to leave campus and refusing to go home and was taken to CARC where he was cited and released to the custody of a case worker (050 486 579).

Trespassing, 96 Westpoint, May 2, 11:45 a.m.

Bayview Officers Dockery, Robinson and Alcaraz were performing premise checks of vacant units when they found three squatters living in a unit which has been occupied numerous times by local transients. All three

individuals had previously been charged with trespassing and were booked for a continuing offense (050 486 375).

Domestic Violence, 1036 Innes, May 2, 4:35 p.m.

Bayview Officers Archini and Kenney responded on a domestic violence call and spoke with the female caller who stated that her boyfriend had beaten her the previous night and then threatened to kill her if she called police. The boyfriend was not present when the victim was being interviewed. The boyfriend lives with the victim and the case is being investigated by our Domestic Violence Unit (050 488 177).

Battery, Jerrold and Dormitory, May 2, 6:30 p.m.

Bayview Officers Kenney and Archini responded on the call of a battery and spoke with a mother who stated that her 11 year old son had been assaulted by two other boys. The officers found the two suspects in the area and detained them. The first suspect, 13 years of age and living in Daly City, was cited for battery. The second suspect, 13 years of age and living on Northridge, was also cited for battery (050 488 713).

Challenging to Fight, 755 Jerrold, May 2, 7:07 p.m.

Bayview Officers Archini and Kenney responded on the call of a fight and were abating the fight when two intoxicated men approached them and challenged Officer Archini to fight by saying, "We've been waiting for you. You name the time and place." The officer recognized the men as individuals he had arrested in the past and the officer told them to go home. The more vocal man (6'3", 235 pounds) continued to taunt the officer (5'7", 155 pounds) and stated, "It's just you and me, name the time and place." The two men, both living on the 700 block of Jerrold, were arrested for challenging to fight in a public place (050 488 785).

Aggravated Assault, 20 Apollo, May 2, 9:30 p.m.

Bayview Officers Haynes and Reyes responded on a call of several men and women fighting. The officers separated the two main combatants, both women, and learned that they had been fighting over a parking space. One of the women had struck the other woman with an anti-theft "club," resulting in injuries to the victim's arm. The woman with the club, living on Apollo Street, was booked for aggravated assault (050 489 448).

Possession Cocaine, Revere and Lane, May 2, 11:14 p.m.
