Public Health Forum

Crime and Enforcement Update

Weekend Violence

Homicide, 238 Princeton, May 20, 7:49 p.m.

Bayview Officers Rodriguez and Chu responded a call of shots fired and found a male victim shot on the sidewalk. The male, with an address in Oakley, California, expired of his wounds. A second victim, with an address in El Sobrante, was also at the scene and had also been shot. A Latin male suspect was seen fleeing the scene. He is described as being 25-30, 5'10", 180, hair in pony tail, wearing a white T-shirt and tan shirt, fled east on Felton (050 564 103).

Possession Handgun, 700 block of Bacon, May 21, 12:46 p.m.

A man, living on the 700 block of Bacon Street, was arrested at Sweeney and Barneveld for possession of a loaded and concealed handgun following a routine traffic stop. Also found in the man's car were brass knuckles, a knife, cocaine, marijuana, and a stun gun. The man was booked for all of these offenses (050 566 303).

Shots Fired, 750 Kirkwood, May 22, 1:00 a.m.

Bayview Officer Lewis responded on a shots fired call and spoke with residents who stated that they were awakened in the middle of the night by what sounded like major gun battle. Numerous buildings and parked vehicles were struck by bullets, and two separate groups of spent shell casings were found in the area. One group of casings came from a standard handgun and the second group came from a military assault rifle (050 569 125).

Robberies

A man told officers that he was walking at 3rd and Paul when he was approached by four black males who beat and robbed him. The victim could provide very little in terms of a suspect description (050 561 745).

A 15 year old boy was at the park at Felton and Holyoke when he was approached by three young men and robbed of his personal property. The suspects are three young black males, 14-18 years of age, all approximately 5'5", 130 (050 570 194).

A man was standing at the bus stop at 499 Bayshore when he was approached by two men and robbed at gunpoint. Suspect one is an Asian male, 20-25, 6'2", 210, wearing a black beanie and a red jacket. Suspect two is a black male, 20-25, 5'7", 170, wearing a black sweat suit and white sneakers (050 571 368).

Domestic Violence

A man, living on Ellsworth Street, was arrested for domestic violence at 22nd and Illinois after punching his girlfriend numerous times in the face. The couple had been drinking alcohol in a parked car and the man became angry when the woman refused his sexual advances. The man called the woman several very derogatory names and then threatened to kill her. The man was also booked for felony threats and violation of probation (050 568 519).

Bayview officers responded to a burglary alarm at an automotive business on the 2100 block of Palou and found that someone had rammed the roll-up door. The officers were unable to contact a responsible for the premises and were guarding the property when a second alarm went off in the premises. The officers again searched the premises and found a man attempting to steal property from the business. The suspect, living on the 2100 block of Quesada, was arrested for burglary. The man was questioned and stated that he knew it was "stupid," but he had decided to sneak into the building even though he saw the police car because he thought he could get away with it. The man was also booked for violation of probation (050 565 418).
