Operation Impact

The California Highway Patrol will return to the Bayview on March 5, and

will conduct a traffic enforcement operation which they refer to as Operation Impact. The CHP officers will be enforcing traffic laws throughout the district from approximately 7:30 p.m. until 3:00 a.m. on March 6.

Camera for Plainclothes Unit

We have secured a surveillance camera through the federal HIDTA program (High Intensity Drug Trafficking Area), and our plainclothes officers will

be utilizing it in our "hot spots" when conducting narcotics surveillance operations.

Crime and Enforcement Update

Robbery with Knife, 3rd and Evans, March 2, 2:00 a.m.

A man walked into Mission Station and stated that he had just been robbed

at 3rd and Evans by a suspect who displayed a knife and threatened to stab

him if he didn't hand over his money. The suspect is described as a Hispanic male, 22-25, 5'6", 180, side burns, wearing a blue jacket and blue

jeans (050 237 758).

Battery, Hate Crime, 2055 Silver, March 2, 12:00 p.m.

A sixth grade student at the "21st Century Academy" came into Bayview Station, accompanied by his father, and reported that his substitute teacher had pushed him during class and told him to move, using the "N-word." The student reported the incident to both the principal and vice principal, and they responded to the class and had all of the students write out statements after asking the substitute teacher to leave the classroom. The incident is being investigated by both the school and the police department (050 240 074).

Domestic Violence, 2 Reardon Road, March 2, 1:00 p.m.

Bayview Officer Berge interviewed a man who stated that his (soon to be) ex-wife had come to his home and argued with him regarding his decision to buy a motorcycle. The man told the officer that he had an active restraining order against his wife and wanted a police report written. When the officer attempted to obtain information regarding the restraining order, the caller became angry and cursed the officer out. The officer was unable to locate any restraining orders against the man's wife in the computer system, however, he did find a restraining order which prohibited the caller from going near his wife (050 239 384).

Shots Fired, 1119 Palou, March 2, 1:42 p.m.

Bayview Officer Lamma took a report from a woman who stated they she heard several gunshots the previous evening at around 6:00 p.m., and when she went to enter her auto today, she saw a single bullet hole on the car's left fender (050 239 760).

Possession Marijuana for Sale, 1719 Quesada, March 2, 2:44 p.m.

Bayview plainclothes officers were walking in the area of 3rd and Quesada when they passed a parked vehicle with a man seated inside and smelled the odor of marijuana coming from inside the vehicle. The man told officers that he was, "...just smoking a little weed," but the officers found 12 individually wrapped baggies of marijuana inside the vehicle. The suspect, living on Velmar Terrace, was booked for possession of marijuana for sale (050 239 801).

Trespassing, 1610 Jerrold, March 2, 3:08 p.m.

Bayview Officer Lamma responded to the Kentucky Fried Chicken Restaurant and spoke with an employee who told her that a customer was causing a disturbance and refusing to leave. The customer, a "regular" at the

restaurant who is frequently offered free food if she will agree to leave,
was cited for trespassing (050 240 030).

Possession of Firearm and Marijuana, Carroll and Jennings, March 2,
4:22
p.m.

Bayview's plainclothes officers were on patrol when they saw a man drive past them at a high rate of speed and noticed that the man was smoking a handrolled cigarette. Believing the cigarette might not be filled with tobacco, the officers stopped the vehicle. The officers found two additional passengers inside the vehicle, one of whom was on probation. A probation search of the vehicle revealed a fully loaded revolver next to the rear seat passenger. This same passenger was found to also possess 15 baggies of individually packaged marijuana and over \$400.00 in currency.

This suspect, living on the first block of Cashmere (where we have had numerous shooting-related incidents in the past few weeks), was booked for possession of a loaded and concealed handgun, possession of stolen property, and possession of marijuana for sale (050 240 331).

Shots Fired, Lane and Quesada, March 2, 6:27 p.m.

Officers Escobar and Calaunan were dispatched on a shots fired call and were told by Dispatch that a black male suspect had been shooting from the street at a person in a passing vehicle. The suspect had been seen getting into a silver Chrysler and driving away from the area. The officers found numerous spent shell casings in the area. Following the incident, an eye-witness to the shots being fired, who wished to remain anonymous, responded to Bayview Station and provided very valuable information about both the shooting specifics and the suspect description. Bayview's officers immediately recognized the description provided as a well known local criminal and put together a photo spread for the witness. The witness positively identified the shooter. A second witness, who also wished to remain anonymous, also responded to Bayview Station and provided valuable information about the suspect vehicle. Shortly thereafter, Bayview officers located the suspect vehicle and towed it, with a "hold" for our Gang Unit. An additional suspect, who had been present in the suspect car at the time of the shooting, was also identified. Bayview officers are actively searching for both of the identified suspects, who are wanted and are considered armed and dangerous. This case is an excellent example of how these crimes can be cleared when witnesses come forward and provide information. These two suspects will be found and

arrested in the next few days (050 240 767).

Illegal Lodging, 16th and Illinois, March 2, 11:30 p.m.
Bayview Officer Buelow was on patrol when he found a female, whom he has admonished and cited numerous times for illegal lodging, living in a parked motorhome. The woman was cited for the offense (050 241 646).

Warrant Arrest, 185 Arkansas, March 3, 4:55 a.m.
Officers Lane and Gallo responded to Arkansas Street on the call of a suspicious person in a car. The officers found two persons seated inside a parked vehicle, and determined that one of them was wanted for an outstanding \$25,000.00 criminal warrant. The suspect, a transient, was booked for the warrant (050 242 070).
