### Crime and Enforcement Update

Murder Arrest, 1100 block Palou, March 22, 5:00 p.m.

Members of our Gang Task Force, accompanied by Oakland PD detectives responded to a home on Palou to serve both an arrest warrant and a search warrant. The subject of the arrest warrant, an 18 year old male living in the home, was arrested for the murder warrant. The subject is believed to be connected with a string of robberies committed in the East Bay. In one of the robberies, a bank teller was shot and killed (050 324 355).

Aggravated Assault, 990 Hollister, March 24, 7:24 a.m.

Bayview Officers Whitney, Lujan and Barron responded on the call of an assault and spoke with a woman who told them she had been in argument with her roommate regarding his allowing people into the home. The argument escalated and the roommate struck the caller with a broomstick (050 326 618).

Burglary, Theft of Utility Services, 1520 Kirkwood, March 24, 9:30 a.m.

Bayview Officers Calaunan and Escobar responded on the report of a burglary and spoke with a pastor of the Bethel Temple Church who stated that she came to the church and found that one of the windows was broken out and an extension cord had been connected to an outlet in the church and then strung through a window into the house next door. The caller told officers that this theft has occurred in the past (050 334 019).

Illegal Lodging, 25th and Iowa, March 25, 9:15 a.m.

Bayview Officer Lavin responded on a complaint of a homeless encampment and found two men sleeping in tents on state property and surrounded by piles of debris. The men were cited for illegal lodging (050 331 946). Officer Buelow later cited a man at Carolina and 16th for living in a van on a public street (050 335 158).

Marijuana Arrest, 693 Vermont, March 25, 10:45 a.m.

Bayview Officer Miller was working at ISA High School when he was alerted by the vice principal that a student had been caught with marijuana. The student, 16 years of age and living on Byxbee Street, was cited for possession of marijuana (050 332 596).

Burglary Arrest, 455 Toland, March 25, 12:45 p.m.

Bayview Officers Berge and Lew responded on a theft call and met with store employees who were detaining a theft suspect. The man was caught stealing a case of cigarettes valued at more than \$1500. The man had a vehicle

parked in the store's parking lot, and the arresting officers saw that both its front and rear plates were covered with duct tape, in an apparent attempt to elude detection (050 333 629).

Marijuana Sales, 950 Connecticut, March 25, 3:05 p.m.

Bayview Officers Mustafich, Solares and Benzinger were on foot patrol on Connecticut Street when they heard several people yelling out "Five- Oh," in an attempt to alert people in the area to the presence of the police. The officers then saw a man quickly place a baggie of marijuana into his jacket pocket and walk away. The officers stopped the man and arrested him. The man, living on the 2200 block of the Great Highway, was booked for possession of marijuana for sale and trespassing on public housing property (050 333 607).

Domestic Violence, 1700 block LaSalle, March 25, 3:30 p.m.

Numerous Bayview units responded on a battery call and met with the female caller who had numerous visible injuries. The officers summoned medical assistance for the victim and then interviewed her. The caller told officers that she had just been released from County Jail and had come home to find her boyfriend asleep. When the boyfriend awoke, he tackled the victim, beat her with a chair leg, and then sexually assaulted her. The boyfriend was gone when the officers arrived, but he was later located and booked for numerous charges (050 336 623).

Warrant Arrest, 3727 Mission, March 25, 5:23 p.m.

Bayview plainclothes officers received information from an informant that an individual wanted out of San Mateo County was staying at a hotel on Mission Street. The officers responded to the hotel and arrested the man as he walked from the hotel to his car. The man, living on Mission Street, was booked for five outstanding arrest warrants charging him with a variety of offenses including domestic violence, kidnapping, violation of a court order, theft charges, battery charges, and traffic offenses (050 334 081).

Sexual Assault, 1700 block Quesada, March 25, 5:33 p.m.

Bayview plainclothes officers responded to a home on the 1700 block of Quesada on a request from our Sex Crimes Unit to arrest a man wanted for three counts of assault with intent to commit rape and one count of failing to register as a sex offender. The man, living in the home, was located and booked (050 297 912).

Possession Cocaine, 3rd and Underwood, March 25, 7:25 p.m.

Bayview plainclothes officers were on patrol when they saw a man crouch down between two parked cars upon seeing them. The officers approached the man and he attempted to discard three rocks of crack cocaine. The man was also in possession of marijuana and was arrested. The man refused to provide a name and couldn't be fingerprinted (many crack users no longer have usable prints as a result of crack pipe burns on their fingertips). The man was booked as a "John Doe" (050 334 445).

Possession Cocaine, Jennings and Fitzgerald, March 25, 8:15 p.m.

Bayview plainclothes officers were on patrol when they saw a man drinking alcohol in a public place and detained him. The man was found to be intoxicated and was placed under arrest, and an arrest search revealed crack cocaine. The man, living on the 1100 block of Hollister, was booked for the cocaine (050 334 558).

Possession Marijuana, Newcomb and Mendell, March 25, 8:47 p.m.  
Bayview plainclothes officers were on patrol when they saw a man standing in front of the Joe Lee Gym drinking alcohol. The man, 18 years of age, was arrested for minor in possession and the officers found seven baggies of individually packaged marijuana in his jacket pocket. The man, living on the 1400 block of Shafter, was booked possession of marijuana for sale, possession of alcohol by a minor, and drinking in public (050 334 677).

Shooting into a Dwelling, Missouri and Sierra, March 25, 9:30 p.m.  
Bayview Officers Borgen and Chiang responded on a shots fired call and were informed by Dispatch that individuals in two vehicles (a Chevy Suburban and a silver 4 door hatchback) had been exchanging gunshots. The officers interviewed residents from three different homes on the 600 block of Missouri, each of whom reported that bullets had been fired into the fronts of their homes. No additional information or descriptions were available (050 334 887).

Stay Away Order Violation, 3rd and Newcomb, March 25, 10:39 p.m.  
Bayview plainclothes officers were on patrol when they saw a woman they knew was prohibited by court order from loitering in the area. The woman, living on the 1400 block of Quesada, was booked for violation of a court order and violation of probation (050 335 051).

Possession Stolen Property, Kansas and 26th, March 26, 1:50 a.m.  
Bayview Officers Bradford and Brown responded on the call of an auto boosting in progress. Officers Erb and Johnson were also responding to the scene and saw a man running from the area one block away and detained him. The man was found to be in possession of numerous items of personal property which were tracked back to a vehicle which had just been broken into. The suspect, living on the 1700 block of Quesada, was booked for possession of stolen property and violation of probation (050 338 588).

Shooting, 1740 Cesar Chavez, March 26, 1:57 a.m.  
Bayview Officers Chiang and Borgen responded on the report of a shooting and spoke with the Spanish speaking victim who told them that he had parked his vehicle on Cesar Chavez and was walking across the street to his place of employment when two suspects approached him and began yelling at him. One of the suspects then shot the victim in his leg with a shotgun. The suspects fled following the shooting, and the victim stated that he had no idea why he was shot. Suspect one is a black male, 6'0", heavyset, wearing a blue shirt and dark jacket. Suspect two is a black male (050 335 512).

Warrant Arrest, 345 Williams, March 26, 6:49 p.m.  
Bayview Officer Erb responded to the Foodsco Store and took custody of a shoplifter who was also wanted for an outstanding arrest warrant. The suspect, living on the 200 block of Wheeler, was booked for a warrant charging him with theft and fraud (050 337 825).

Marijuana Arrest, 1720 Quesada, March 26, 7:22 p.m.  
Bayview plainclothes officers responded to the 1700 block of Quesada on a call from a neighbor that people were selling drugs from a blue station wagon. The officers located the described vehicle and could see that it had a flat tire and was being supported by a jack. The officers could also see that although the vehicle was on a jack, five teen-age men were seated inside it. Believing that the young men might not actually be preparing to drive in the car (the jack was a giveaway), the officers approached and

found that the young men had just finished smoking marijuana. One of the young men, 14 and living on the 1600 block of Kirkwood, was cited for possession of marijuana (050 3337 853).

Warrant Arrest, Newhall and McKinnon, March 26, 9:05 p.m.

Bayview plainclothes officers were on patrol when they saw a young man crouch down behind a parked vehicle upon seeing them. The officers stopped the juvenile and determined that he was wanted. The juvenile, 15 years of age and living on the 1000 block of Connecticut, was booked for a warrant charging him with robbery (041 205 057).

Warrant Arrest, 3rd and Revere, March 26, 10:05 p.m.

Bayview Officers Cahill and Wise were on patrol when they saw a man they knew to be wanted and arrested him. The man, a transient, was booked for a warrant charging him with sales of cocaine (031 042 029).

Shooting, Cameron and Nichols, March 26, 11:45 p.m.

Bayview Officers Whitfield and Norris responded to SFGH on the report of a shooting victim receiving treatment. The officers attempted to interview the shooting victim, but he was very uncooperative and refused to provide any information. Two witnesses who had been present with the victim at the time of the shooting told officers that they had been "hanging out" with the victim at Cameron and Nichols when he was suddenly shot, for no apparent reason. No crime scene could be located at Cameron and Nichols, but the investigating officers also responded to VanDyke and Keith, where a "shots fired" call had gone out at the same time, and they located several spent and live shell casings (050 338 306).

Domestic Violence, 1131 Hollister, March 27, 6:10 a.m.

Bayview Officer Altorfer responded on the call of a restraining order violation and was told by the 90 year old female caller that her son was sleeping in her house in violation of a restraining order, and further, that he was wanted for outstanding warrants. The son, 68 years of age, was booked for violation of a court order and for a warrant charging him with possession of crack cocaine, possession of paraphernalia, and violation of a court order (050 338 964).

Shooting, Unknown Location, March 27, 8:00 a.m.

Bayview Officer Lewis responded to SFGH on a the report of a gunshot victim and spoke with a 21 year old male who told him that he had been shot in the leg. The victim provided a fictitious name (his true identity was determined later), and stated that he had been "clubbing" and had consumed a large amount of both alcohol and marijuana, had passed out and then been awakened at a friend's home and realized that he had been shot. The victim stated that he didn't know where his friend lived, didn't know his friend's name, and didn't know where he was when he was shot. The victim later changed his story and said that he was walking somewhere in the Bayview when a car pulled up to him and its occupants yelled out some epithets, and one of the occupants then shot him. This case might be related to the VanDyke and Keith crime scene mentioned above. Or might not be (050 339 326).

Warrant Arrest, Ingalls and Beatrice, March 27, 7:07 p.m.

Bayview Officers Kenney and Coleman were on patrol when they stopped a man for a traffic violation and determined that he had an outstanding warrant for his arrest. The man, living in Hayward, was booked for a warrant

charging him with possession of crack cocaine for sale (050 340 618).
