Crime and Enforcement Update

Warrant Arrest, Thomas and Keith, March 20, 8:53 a.m.

Bayview Officers Lew and Damonte responded on a call of suspicious people selling drugs and as they arrived, numerous loiterers began leaving in different directions. The officers were able to detain five individuals, one of whom was wanted for an outstanding arrest warrant and a second found in possession of both crack cocaine and a crack pipe. The first man, a transient, was booked for an outstanding arrest warrant charging him with violation of parole and was also charged with possession of stolen property when a credit card taken in a robbery was found in his wallet. The second man, living on the 1400 block of Thomas, was booked for the drug charges (050 310 520).

Robbery, 345 Bayshore, March 20, 1:25 p.m.

Bayview Officers Pai and Reyes responded to the McDonald's on Bayshore on the report of a fight. The officers interviewed several employees who told them a group of customers had complained that their "value meal" was missing a sandwich. The customers became argumentative and one of them simulated a handgun by placing his hand into his pocket as he threatened the cash register employee. One of the customers (suspects) then reached over the counter, removed the currency from the register, and the entire group then fled. The group entered a Chevy Impala with a partial plate of 5DUY79_. The suspects are described only as four black males and one black female (050 313 176).

Domestic Violence, 79 Ledyard, March 20, 7:25 p.m.

Bayview Officers Erb and Johnson responded on a domestic violence call and found an apartment with numerous broken items strewn about. The officers interviewed the female caller who told them her ex-boyfriend, with whom she is still living, had just punched and kicked her following an argument. The suspect was booked for aggravated assault and domestic violence (050 312 071).

Vandalism, Possession Deadly Weapon, Resisting Arrest, Jerrold and

Barneveld, March 21, 8:02 a.m.

Bayview Officers Reyes and Pai responded on an aggravated assault call and met with the female caller who told them that a man had just threatened her with a stick. The caller had followed the man as he attempted to flee the area, and had updated Dispatch about her location changes. The suspect was located by officers and detained. The victim explained to officers that she was unloading recycling items from her truck when the suspect had walked up to her truck and kicked it, resulting in a large dent and a cracked windshield. When the victim's friend asked the suspect why he had kicked the truck, he picked up a stick and threatened both of them, stating, "Blank you, I ain't did nothing." The suspect, a transient, was booked for vandalism, brandishing a weapon, and resisting arrest. He was admonished regarding his use of a double negative (050 313 320).

Domestic Violence, 1025 Fitzgerald, March 21, 10:11 a.m.

Bayview Officers Lamma and Doherty responded on an arson call and spoke with the female caller who told them that her ex-boyfriend had choked her and then set her clothing on fire following an argument. The boyfriend threatened to further injure the victim as he was leaving. The suspect, Xavier Pittman, born in 1976, 5'9", 185, is wanted for arson and domestic violence (050 314 237).

Domestic Violence, 70 Westpoint Road, March 21, 10:40 a.m.

Bayview Officer Damonte responded on a domestic violence call and spoke with the female caller who stated that her ex-boyfriend had come to her house and started an argument, and had then grabbed and thrown her cell phone. The boyfriend then followed her when she went to her see her social worker and threatened her at the office of the social worker (050 314 293).

Warrant Arrest, 1655 McKinnon, March 21, 11:18 a.m.

Bayview Officers Dalton and McPherson were on patrol when they saw a suspicious man loitering near a parked van. The officers went to approach the man and he took off running. The officers pursued the man for several blocks, eventually overtaking and detaining him. The man, living on the 1500 block of Newcomb, was found to have an outstanding felony arrest warrant and was booked for it (050 314 447).

Burglary, 812 Colby, March 21, 1:45 p.m.

Two Bayview units responded on the call of a suspicious person parked in a vehicle with two male occupants. The officers arrived and met with the Asian male caller who spoke no English. Two of the officers spoke Cantonese and interviewed the caller, who stated that he had come home to find two men running out of his house and entering a gray Ford Taurus with a plate of 5HSK049. The officers ran the plate and tracked it to the 1200 block of Shafter, where it was parked and unattended. The officers detained three men found near the car, but the victim couldn't identify any of the suspects. The first detained man lives on the 1200 block of Shafter and owns the car used in the burglary. The second detained man lives on the 1400 block of Shafter, and the third detained man lives in Sacramento (050 315 780).

Gun Robbery, 1245 Ingalls, March 21, 6:00 p.m.

Bayview Officers Kenney and Archini responded on the call of a shooting and found a male who had just been shot in the shoulder. The victim told officers that he was walking to his grandmother's home when an armed suspect approached him and asked him if he had any money. The victim stated that he began running away and was then shot. The suspect is

described as a black male, 5'10", 185, light skinned, wearing a black hooded sweatshirt and carrying two handguns (050 316 619).

Robbery, 700 block Missouri, March 21, 6:12 p.m.

A woman walked into Bayview Station and reported that she had just been robbed on Potrero Hill. The woman, who provides in-home care to a person residing on the 700 block of Missouri, was leaving the home when she was approached by two men she knows from the area (she grew up on Potrero Hill). One of the men produced a handgun and demanded the woman's money, telling her he would "...bust a cap in (her) head," if she didn't cooperate. The victim gave her money to the suspects and they fled on foot. Suspect one is Cornelius Wigfall, born 1981, 6'0", 165, wearing a black pea coat and black jeans. Suspect two is Terrence Briggs, born 1981, 5'4", 135, wearing all black clothing. Wigfall is currently wanted for violation of parole. These suspects are considered armed and dangerous, and if you see or encounter them, phone 9-1-1 immediately (050 316 540).

Shooting into a Dwelling, 33 Westbrook, March 21, 9:05 p.m.

Bayview Officers Anderson and Farrell responded on the call of a bullet hole and interviewed the female caller who told them that on March 20, at approximately 8:45 p.m., she heard several shots being fired and then realized that a bullet had been shot through one of her windows. The caller felt that it was a random shot which had not been intended for her home (050 317 350).

Warrant Arrest, 3rd and Oakdale, March 22, 2:14 p.m.

Bayview Officer Singh was on patrol when he stopped a vehicle for mechanical violations. The driver was found to have numerous warrants for his arrest, and a suspended license as well. The driver, living on the 2900 block of Hawes was booked for the warrants and the new traffic offenses. The vehicle was towed with a hold for our STOP program (050 317 441).
