Crime and Enforcement Update

Domestic Violence, 100 Block of Double Rock Ave, February 28, 11:30 p.m. Officers Norris and Whitfield were dispatched to the 100 block of Doublerock and were told by the victim that her boyfriend of two months had attacked her after telling her that he wanted her to "work on the track" (this being a street term for working as a prostitute). When the victim refused to do this, the suspect became enraged and struck the victim. The suspect was booked for aggravated assault with force, false imprisonment, and domestic violence. Narcotics Violation, Reckless Driving, Bacon Street, March 1, 12:25 a.m. Sergeant Halley was on patrol and spotted the suspect driving recklessly and violating numerous traffic laws. females then turned around and demanded an apology. When the

the

Narcotics Offense, Trespassing, 100 Block Middlepoint, March 1, 4:48
p.m.
Officers Bodisco, Rodatos, Sanders, and Siguido responded to a
loitering
complaint at the above location. Upon arriving, they noticed at
least 10
males "hanging around" the premises. The officers then noticed that
one of
the males had been cited earlier for trespassing at the same
location.
Upon seeing the officers, the group dispersed and the officers lost
sight
of the previously cited suspect. Several hours later, the officers
spotted
the suspect again as he drove a vehicle with no license plates. A stop
and
search of the vehicle revealed a bag of marijuana. The suspect,
living on

Shooting into Inhabited Dwelling, Palou Avenue, March 1, 5:13 p.m. Officers Coleman and Hastings responded to a report of shots being fired. A witness stated he saw a small, gray-silver vehicle driving westbound on Palou with two suspects inside. (The last three numbers in the license plate were believed to be 629). The suspects were two black males, eighteen to twenty years old. The witness saw the passenger of the vehicle shoot at two individuals who were standing on the sidewalk on the north side of Palou at Hawes. Aggravated Assault with Gun, Middlepoint, March 1, 7:30 p.m. Officers Escobar and Calaunan responded to SF General Hospital regarding a shooting victim. The victim told officers that he had been standing with another individual on the corner of Middlepoint and Westpoint when he saw a silver, luxury type vehicle stop directly in front of him and saw the passenger point a gun at him and then shoot. The victim was struck in his thigh. The victim stated that he was unable to identify the driver or shooter, and he declined to tell the officers how he made it to the hospital. (050 236 590)
