The other thing I tell people is to put the subject line of the message into google and it will often bring up some good background on the message usually pointing out it is a fraud.

Crime and Enforcement Update

Drug Arrests

The following drug arrests were made this weekend:

March 11, 12:55 p.m., Bayview plainclothes officers were walking through the parking lot of the Franciscan Hotel at 6600 3rd Street when they found a woman in possession of both cocaine and heroin. The woman, living in South San Francisco, was booked for possession of both cocaine and heroin (050 275 518).

March 11, 12:57 p.m., Bayview plainclothes officers were on patrol at Keith and Thomas when they saw a man loitering on the corner who had already been charged twice with drug loitering at the same corner. The man, living on the 1200 block of Thomas, was booked for drug loitering and violation of parole (050 276 308).

March 11, 2:36 p.m., Bayview plainclothes officers arrested a man in the parking lot of the Joe Lee Gym for possession of marijuana for sale. The man, living on Osceola Way, was booked for possession of marijuana for sale and violation of probation (050 276 596).

March 11, 3:04 p.m., Bayview Officer Damonte responded to the 1700 block of LaSalle on the report of a drug dealer plying his wares. The officer located the described man and found him to be carrying marijuana. The suspect, living on the 1000 block of Palou, was booked for possession of marijuana and loitering for drug sales (050 276 916).

March 11, 6:38 p.m., Bayview plainclothes officers saw two men on Kiska Road, one a validated member of the "Big Block" gang, and when the men saw the officers, the second man took off running. The officers pursued the man into a home on Northridge and found him hiding in a bed. The occupant of the apartment told officers she didn't know the suspect, and he had just run into her unit prior to their arrival. A bag of crack cocaine was found near the window sill adjacent to the man. The man, living at a different

apartment on Northridge, was booked for possession of crack cocaine for sale (050 277 732).

March 12, 11:00 a.m., Bayview plainclothes officers were on patrol at Keith and Revere when they saw two men huddled together in an apparent drug deal and detained the men. The first man was found to possess crack cocaine and narcotics paraphernalia, and was also found to have an outstanding arrest warrant (050 279 807).

March 12, 4:17 p.m., Bayview Officers Damonte and Doherty responded to 3rd and Hollister on the report of a drug dealer selling marijuana. The officers found a young man at the corner matching the description provided and detained him. The young man, 16 years of age and living on Exeter Street, was cited for possession of marijuana (050 280 848).

March 13, 9:53 a.m, Bayview Officers Parry and Harmston were on patrol at 24th and Michigan when they saw three men preparing to vandalize a wall with graffiti and detained the men. The men admitted their intentions, and told officers that they thought it was "legal" to graffiti the wall in question. The officers located marijuana on one of the men, who had also provided a fictitious name. The man, living on the 1700 block of Page, was charged with the marijuana and with providing a fictitious name (050 282 775).

Robberies

The following robberies occurred this weekend:

March 11, 9:10 a.m., Bayview plainclothes officers conducted a follow-up investigation of a home invasion robbery which had been committed on Robblee Avenue. The officers received information from a confidential informant who provided the street names of the two persons who had robbed an elderly Asian male in his home. The officers were able to tentatively identify both suspects, and based upon additional information they had received, the officers went to the Mission Jewelry and Loan pawnshop at 2318 Mission Street and located many items which had been stolen during the robbery. The officers responded to the last known addresses for both suspects and searched them, pursuant to probation search conditions, and located cocaine, methamphetamine, marijuana, and other evidence. The following suspects are wanted in connection with this robbery: Charles Wesley Burns, 23 years of age, 5'8", 275, last known address of 201 Harbor Road, and Stephen Grady, 24 years of age, 5'9", 170, last known addresses of 2178 Quesada and 263 Bridgeview (050 275 065).

March 11, 10:25 p.m., A man told Bayview officers that he was loading items into his vehicle on the 1100 block of Oakdale when he was approached by three males, two of whom were armed with guns. The suspects placed the guns to the victim's neck and demanded his property. The suspects then took both the victim's personal property and his vehicle and fled the area in the victim's car. The suspects are described as black males with bandannas over their faces (050 278 322).

March 12, 3:00 a.m., A man told Bayview officers that he was beaten and robbed at 3rd and Newcomb by four male suspects. The victim described the suspects only as four black males (050 279 227).

The officers found a vehicle with a shattered window and located the vehicle's owner. The owner told the officers that a tool box had been stolen from his vehicle, and the officers located the tool box in the back of the truck the suspect had been seen driving. The suspect, living on the 6300 block of 3rd Street, was booked for possession of stolen property, vandalism, and auto burglary (050 279 142).

March 13, 12:37 a.m., Bayview Officers McCormick and Nichols responded to Oakdale and Phelps on the report of a stabbing and found a man bleeding profusely from a serious knife wound to his neck. The officers administered first aid to the victim and were told by the female suspect had just stabbed him in the neck following an argument. The female, who was still at the scene, told officers that she had just smoked crack with the victim and he had then "freaked out." The suspect, living on the 1700 block of Revere, was booked for aggravated assault (050 281 993).

On March 13, at 8:05 a.m., Bayview Officer Reynoso was on patrol at 1828 26th Street when he located a stolen auto and arrested the driver. The driver, 14 years of age and living in Boonville, was booked at YGC for stolen auto (050 282 628).
