Crime and Enforcement Update

Warrant Arrest, LaSalle and Newhall, March 10, 9:34 a.m. Bayview Officers Lew and Berge were on patrol when they saw three men sitting in a vehicle with a broken window and asked the men to identify themselves. A passenger provided two different names, leading the officers to believe that he might not be telling the truth, and when he provided a third name, the officers discovered a warrant for his arrest charging him as a parole violator. The man, a transient, was booked for the warrant (050 271 201).

Warrant Arrest, 3rd and Jamestown, March 10, 9:38 a.m. Bayview Officers Lamma and Doherty were on patrol when they stopped a vehicle with no license plates. The officers determined that the driver had a suspended license, no insurance, and an outstanding warrant for his arrest. The man, living in Fairfield, was booked for the warrant and traffic charges. The man's vehicle was towed due to his license suspension (050 271 182).

Possession Handgun by a Felon, Quesada and Newhall, March 10, 12:23 p.m.

Bayview Officers Berge and Lew responded to the 1700 block of Quesada on the report of numerous men arguing, one of whom was in possession of a handgun. The officers found a large group of men at the scene, and saw one man who matched the description provided by Dispatch of the man with a gun. The officers saw this man walk to a parked white Ford Explorer and place something into the vehicle's right front wheel well. The man then turned back toward the officers with his hands in the air and stated, "I ain't got nothing." Not surprisingly, this peaked the officers' interest and they checked the vehicle's right front wheel well, finding a fully loaded handgun. The suspect, living on Burnside Street, was booked as a felon in possession of a loaded and concealed handgun. A notation on the suspect's rap sheet alerted the officers to the fact that he was also wanted by Homicide Inspectors for questioning in connection with a homicide from a few years ago (050 271 803).

Warrant Arrest, 1898 Keith, March 10, 1:06 p.m.

Bayview Officers Scott, Lyons and Aherne were on patrol at Keith and Thomas and when they saw three men smoking marijuana in a vehicle and detained them. One of the men, living on the 1900 block of Palou, was found to have an outstanding warrant charging him with terrorist threats, vandalism, and battery, and he was booked on the warrant. No additional marijuana was found (they had just finished) and the two other men were released (050 271 881).

Shooting Incident, LaSalle at Osceola, March 10, 4:09 p.m.

Bayview Officers Kenney and Archini responded to 1195 Hudson on a call of shots being fired. The officers interviewed a very frightened student from Gloria R. Davis School who told them that he had been looking out the window of a classroom and had seen two groups of young men engage in a gun battle at LaSalle and Osceola. The boy had seen a group of 7-8 young black males standing on the corner when a blue Buick with 22" chrome rims pulled up and a passenger exited the Buick and began firing at the group on the corner. The shooter was a dark skinned black male in his early 20's. There was a second vehicle, described only as black in color, which had pulled in behind the Buick, and the witness believes someone from the second car was also shooting at the group on the corner. No victims were

ever located (050 272 732).

Cocaine Offense, 6600 3rd Street, March 10, 4:37 p.m.

Bayview Officers Aherne, Scott, Lyons and Benzinger were on patrol when they saw a man walking out of the Franciscan Motel at 6600 3rd Street.

The

man, upon seeing the officers, turned to a group of people on a second story balcony and yelled out, "Police." The people on the balcony scattered and the man continued walking away. The officers stopped the man

and saw him throw two rocks of crack cocaine to the sidewalk. The officers

retrieved the crack and arrested the man. The suspect, a transient, was

booked for possession of crack and possession of a crack pipe (paraphernalia) 050 272 748.

Theft by Fraud, 258 Gaven, March 10, 5:30 p.m.

A man reported to Bayview officers that on February 10, he received an e-mail regarding a "business opportunity." The man was instructed that he

would receive a check for \$2,020.00, which he should cash and keep 10 percent of the money, forwarding the remaining 90 percent to Miguel Herreiro in Vienna, Austria. The victim received a second check in the mail

and deposited it, but was later informed by his bank that his account was

overdrawn (both checks had bounced). Please do not send money to anyone

you meet on the internet from Austria offering you fabulous business opportunities (050 272 936).

Warrant Arrest, 1000 Connecticut, March 10, 6:44 p.m.

Bayview Officers Solares, Fitzpatrick and Mustafich were on patrol when they saw a man they knew to be wanted and arrested him. The man, a transient, was booked for a warrant charging him with sales of cocaine (050

211 423).

Aggravated Assault on a Police Officer, 20 Cashmere, March 10, 7:41 p.m.

Bayview Officers DeJesus, Izaguirre and Stoumen, along with Sgt. Fabbri,

were on patrol at Westpoint and Middlepoint when they saw a known drug dealer handing something to a known drug user. The officers approached both individuals and the suspected buyer put the (just received) object into his mouth and swallowed. The suspected seller began to run away and

the officers pursued him. Officer Stoumen caught up to the suspect and attempted to arrest him, but he picked her up and threw her to the ground,

where she landed on her back. The suspect again took off running. The officers pursued the suspect to Cashmere Street and found him hiding in bushes behind 20 Cashmere. When found, the suspect took a fighting stance

and challenged the (much smaller) officer to fight. (The suspect weighs

220 pounds.) The officer was joined by his partner and they were able to take the suspect into custody following a brief struggle. The suspect, a transient, was booked for aggravated assault on a police officer, threatening a police officer, resisting arrest, and trespassing on public housing property (050 273 558).

Aggravated Assault, 72 Dakota, March 10, 10:36 p.m.
Bayview Officers Bradford and Brown responded to Dakota Street on a domestic violence call. The officers were met by the male combatant in a domestic violence incident, and he told them, "Just take me to jail already, it's cold out here." The female caller refused to provide the officers with any details, but they could see numerous injuries to her face and head, and blood on her clothing. The victim refused to accompany the ambulance to the hospital, but eventually agreed to go and was taken to Davies Medical Center. The victim told the attending nurse that her boyfriend (and father of her baby) had beat her in the face, knocking her to the ground, where he kicked her in the face several times. The officers attempted again to interview the victim, but she refused, stating that she would "...break the code...of the projects" if she spoke with the police. The officers booked the boyfriend for both aggravated assault and domestic violence, and obtained an Emergency Protective Order from the courts which will prohibit the boyfriend from going near the victim in the short term (050 274 136).
