#### Crime and Enforcement Update

Robbery, Sexual Assault, Mansell / Brussels, February 28, 7:50 a.m.  
A 14 year old girl reported to Bayview officers that she was walking to school (Burton High School) on Mansell when she was approached by two suspects who began to go through her pockets. When the victim told the suspects she didn't have anything, one of the suspects pulled a knife and both suspects began beating her. A third suspect then approached and began to grope the victim through her clothing. All three suspects eventually fled and there was no loss of property. Suspect one is a Hispanic female, 15-17, 5'3", 130, red hair, wearing a black jacket and blue jean pants. Suspect two is a Hispanic female, 5'3", 115, wearing a black hooded jacket and blue jean pants. Suspect three is a Hispanic male, 5'7", 150, wearing a black jacket and blue jean pants (050 232 059).

Shooting into a Dwelling, 1554 Newcomb, February 28, 9:00 a.m.  
Officers Mojica and Darnell responded to Newcomb and spoke with a woman who told them that she was awakened by the sound of glass breaking in her front room, and when she went to investigate, she found a broken window and a single bullet inside her living room (050 229 658).

Possession of Firearm by Felon, 850 Bryant Street, February 28, 9:24 a.m.

Officer Whitney received information from a confidential informant that a local gangster (and convicted felon) was carrying a gun. The informant also provided the officer with a description of the gangster's car. The officer determined that the suspect was due in court on a pending criminal case, and the officer went to the courtroom and found the suspect. The officer then followed the suspect as he left 850 Bryant Street and saw him enter a parked auto (the same one described) on 6th Street. The officer detained the suspect and found a fully loaded handgun hidden under the driver's seat. The suspect was booked as a felon in possession of a loaded and concealed handgun and violation of probation (050 229 589).

Shooting into a Dwelling, 4705 3rd Street, February 28, 12:25 p.m. Officers Darnell and Mojica responded to the Bayview Opera House and spoke with an employee who had heard several gunshots and then found a bullet hole on an exterior wall of the Opera House. A witness stated that a Toyota with tinted windows had just driven past the area and a passenger had leaned out of the car and fired a handgun several times. The suspect is described as a black male, 20-25, no further (050 230 586).

Domestic Violence Arrest Made, 46 Harbor, February 28, 1:45 p.m. Officers Bodisco, Siguido and Reynoso responded to Harbor Road on a domestic violence call. The female caller told officers that her live-in boyfriend became enraged when he found her on the phone, thinking that she was having an affair. The boyfriend then struck the victim in the face. The boyfriend was booked for domestic violence (050 231 023).

Robbery, Galvez and Mendell, February 28, 3:24 p.m. Officers Siguido, Rodatos and Fowlie responded to Hare and Middlepoint on a robbery call. The victim told officers that he was riding a pocket bike at Fairfax and Galvez when two suspects pulled up to him in a white van. The suspects exited the van and punched the victim several times prior to taking the pocket bike and fleeing the area in the van. A witness saw the incident and followed the van to Hare and Middlepoint. The suspects were seen running from the van with the pocket bike and were lost in the area. The officers towed the van with a "hold" for Robbery Inspectors. Suspect

one is a black male, 15-17, 5'8", 140, braided hair, wearing a baggy white T-shirt, blue jeans pants and black shoes. Suspect two is a black male, 5'8", 120, wearing a black hooded sweatshirt, blue jean pants and black shoes (050 231 506).

Auto Burglary, Suspect Seen, 1244 Hollister, February 28, 4:00 p.m. Officers Berge and Parry interviewed a man who stated that he was working on his truck, which was parked in front of his home, when he left it unattended for a moment as he walked to his garage. When he returned to the truck, the victim saw that his vehicle keys were missing. The victim's neighbor told him that he had just seen a man walk by and take the keys. The suspect then fled on foot. The suspect is a black male, 29-31, 5'9", 170, wearing a fake "Gucci" jacket and brown slacks (050 231 699).

Battery, Warrant Arrest, Fitzgerald and Hawes, February 28, 4:35 p.m. Officers Hastings and Madrid responded to Cameron Way on a battery case. The victim told officers she was walking into the Alice Griffith Development when she accidentally bumped into a man and then apologized to him. The man then punched her in the face and told her, "I don't care about your (expletive deleted) apology." The officers located the suspect and booked him for battery and an outstanding warrant charging him with burglary, fraud, and possession of stolen property (050 231 857).

Warrant Arrest, 2498 Newcomb, February 28, 10:30 p.m. Officers Johnson and Erb were on patrol when they saw a generator (very loud) hooked up to a parked auto and stopped to investigate. The officers found two men living inside the vehicle and determined that both of them were wanted for outstanding warrants. Both men were booked (050 232 996).

Aggravated Assault with Gun, Felton and Brussels, February 28, 11:05 p.m. Officer Dangerfield responded on a shots fired call and spoke with an employee of the Walgreen's on San Bruno Avenue who told him that as he was walking to his car after work he saw three men standing on the corner of Felton and Girard. The employee began to drive away when he saw one of the men point a gun at him and begin firing the gun. Neither the victim nor his vehicle were struck. The victim stated that he has seen the suspects in Walgreen's before, and he believes they live in the area. Suspect one

is a black male, 18-20, 6'0", 200, wearing all black clothing.

two and three are described only as black males (050 233 154).

Transporting Marijuana, Bacon at Girard, March 1, 12:25 a.m.  
Bayview Sergeant Halley was on patrol at Bacon and Girard when she attempted to stop a vehicle for speeding. The vehicle took off at a high rate of speed and was eventually stopped several blocks away. The driver was arrested for reckless driving and driving without a license, and an arrest search of the vehicle revealed a large amount of marijuana. The driver, living on Santos, was booked for possession of marijuana for sale, violation of probation and reckless driving. \$2,700.00 in currency was seized from the suspect and booked as evidence (050 233 273).
