Church Chorale

Muni Photos

We have obtained two sets of photos from cameras on Muni buses of suspects who have committed crimes while on a bus in the Bayview. The photos are high quality and I will bring them to community meetings. The first incident involves the assault of a Muni driver on May 9, at 3rd and Palou (050 517 641). The second case involves the robbery of a passenger on May 18, at 23rd and Wisconsin (050 554 972).

Power Plant Task Force

The Power Plant Task Force will host a special meeting to consider conditional support for the siting of the city's gas-fired peaker plants. The meeting will take place at the Potrero Hill Neighborhood House, 943 DeHaro Street, on Thursday, June 16, from 6:00 to 8:00 p.m.

Operation Impact

The CHP returns to the Bayview and Mission Districts this Friday, June 10, from 7:00 p.m. to 3:00 a.m. (on June 11). They will focus on traffic offenses and drunk driving cases, as well as other criminal violations.

Crime and Enforcement Update

Assault, Domestic Violence, 3rd and Palou, June 8, 8:00 a.m.
Bayview Officer Fowler spoke with a female victim who reported that she was waiting for the bus when her ex-boyfriend approached her and called her several very derogatory names. The ex-boyfriend then pushed her and her purse fell from her shoulder. The ex-boyfriend then threw the purse across the street, and when the victim went to retrieve it, it was gone. The victim stated that her ex-boyfriend is prohibited from contacting her by virtue of a court stay-away order, but the officers were unable to locate the order in the system. They did, however, locate a stay-away order which prohibits the victim from contacting the ex-boyfriend (050 641 513).

Arson Arrest, 1901 25th Street, June 8, 10:46 a.m.

Bayview Officer Bodisco was following up on the arson reported in yesterday's e-mail and located the named suspect. The suspect had three lighters and a book of matches in his pocket at the time of his arrest, but he told officers that the victim was "framing" him. The suspect was booked for arson (050 637 647).

Cocaine Arrest, 1678 Newcomb, June 8, 10:53 a.m.

Officers assigned to our Honda Unit were on patrol when they saw a woman with a crack pipe and stopped to speak with her. The woman attempted to swallow some crack, and spit it out when told to do so by the officers.

The woman, a transient, was booked for simple possession (050 640 117).

Cocaine Arrest, 1678 Newcomb, June 8, 10:57 a.m.

The same officers in the above case saw a second woman fleeing the area as they arrested the first woman, and when the woman was detained, she was found to be carrying both crack and narcotics paraphernalia. The woman, living on Venus, was booked for simple possession (050 640 189).

Kidnapping, Aggravated Assault, 70 Westpoint Road, June 8, 11:52 a.m.

Bayview Officers Dockery, Chantal and Pascua responded on a call that a person had been pistol-whipped. The 17 year old female caller told officers that she had been braiding the hair of her 16 year old boyfriend, and when she told him that she had to go home, he became angry and assaulted her. The victim left her boyfriend's home and was then approached by the boyfriend who was a passenger in a van, and the boyfriend grabbed her and forced her inside the van. The boyfriend continued to assault the victim and she eventually managed to escape and notified the police. The suspect was located and arrested. The suspect, living on the first block of Westpoint Road, was booked at YGC for kidnapping, aggravated assault, battery, and terrorist threats (050 640 628).

Possession Cocaine, 3rd and Newcomb, June 8, 1:55 p.m.

Bayview's plainclothes team was on patrol when they saw a group of men huddled together on the sidewalk. Upon seeing the officers, one of the men took off running and was eventually detained by the officers. The man was found to be in possession of both crack cocaine and marijuana and was booked for both drug offenses (050 641 046).

Possession Marijuana, 3rd and Palou, June 8, 3:37 p.m.

Bayview Officers Fitzpatrick, Aherne and Mustafich were on patrol when they saw a group of men loitering on the sidewalk. One of the men, on a bicycle, took off upon seeing the officers. The officers stopped the man and discovered 15 individually packaged baggies of marijuana, along with a wad of currency in the man's pockets. The man, living on the 1500 block of Shafter, was booked for possession of marijuana for sale and an outstanding arrest warrant (050 641 472).

Warrant Arrest, Kirkwood and Mendell, June 8, 8:14 p.m.

Bayview Officers Archini and Kenney were on patrol when they stopped a vehicle for traffic violations. The driver, living in Oakland, was found to have outstanding warrants from Clayton County, Georgia, Santa Clara County, and the city of San Jose. The man was booked for the three warrants (050 642 436).

Shooting at a Vehicle, Ingalls and Oakdale, June 8, 8:41 p.m.

Bayview Officer Kenney responded on a shots fired call and found three vehicles which had just been involved in an accident. The driver of one of the vehicles stated that he had struck the second and third vehicles because his window had just been shot out. The victim, a well known validated Bayview gang member, has been implicated in numerous Bayview shootings, but no witnesses have come forward in any of these cases and he remains free. Bayview officers booked him recently for trespassing on public housing property (050 642 458).

Carjacking Arrest, 70 Westpoint, June 9, 1:40 a.m.
Bayview Officer Lane responded on a carjacking call and spoke with the caller who reported that he was approached by a group of 8 male suspects who yelled at him, "You know what time it is. Get on the ground (n-word). Give me what you got." The suspects then stole the victim's property, along with his car keys, and fled in his car. The suspects are described only as black males in dark clothing. The stolen car is a 2001 Hyundai, 4 door, red in color, California license 4YHR796 (051 600 245).
