Crime and Enforcement Update

Possession Prohibited Weapon, Napoleon and Evans, July 7, 11:00 a.m.
Bayview Officer Lavin responded on a homeless encampment call and found a man sleeping inside a tent. The man was found to have two outstanding warrants for his arrest and was placed under arrest. At the time of his arrest, the suspect was found to be armed with a meat cleaver on a long chain, and the officer confiscated the weapon. The suspect became violent after being handcuffed and threatened to "get" the officer the next time he sees her. The suspect pointed out the size difference between him (6'4", 220 pounds) and the female officer (5'5", 120 pounds) when he threatened to hurt her physically. The suspect, a transient, was booked for threatening an officer, possession of a prohibited weapon, and two outstanding arrest warrants (050 757 900).

Warrant Arrest, 1800 Oakdale, July 7, 11:20 a.m.
Bayview Officer Edwards responded to the City College campus and met with school security who had detained a man for igniting fireworks in the stairwell. The man, living on Paris, was found to have an outstanding arrest warrant charging him with possession of a prohibited weapon and he was booked for the warrant (050 757 637).

Warrant Arrest, Thornton and Neptune, July 7, 2:00 p.m.
Bayview Officers Ernst and Mostasisa were on patrol when they saw a man struggling with a large garbage bag and stopped to find out what he was doing. The man's bag was loaded with canned goods that he stated he had been given, and the officers determined that the man was wanted for a Solano County warrant which charged him with robbery and violation of probation. The man, living on Venus, was booked for the warrant (050 758 384).

Trespassing, 25 Garlington Court, July 7, 2:23 p.m.
Bayview Officer Winters responded on a call that security officers had detained two trespassers. The security guards, hired by AIMCO Properties, stated that the two detained individuals had been loitering on the property all day, and had been previously warned to stop trespassing. Both men were cited for trespassing (050 758 754).

Domestic Violence, 100 block of Dakota, July 7, 3:15 p.m.
Bayview Officers Ferraez, Hoo and Fowlie responded on an assault call and spoke with the female caller who reported that her boyfriend had just kicked in her door and slapped her. The female stated that her boyfriend was drunk and had forced his way into the home and assaulted both her and her 2 year old son. The man was located in the area by the officers and

was booked for domestic violence, vandalism and an outstanding arrest warrant (050 758 782).

Warrant Arrest, LaSalle and Newhall, July 7, 5:27 p.m.

Bayview Officers Dalton and McPherson were on bike patrol when they saw a man they knew to be wanted and arrested him. The man, living on the 1400 block of Palou, was also charged with drug loitering for hanging out repeatedly at notorious drug corners after being warned numerous times not to (050 759 348).

Warrant Arrest, Flora and Thornton, July 7, 8:35 p.m.

Bayview Officers Paul and Arndt responded on a call that a man was breaking into a home. The officers located the described suspect and detained him. The officers could find no signs of any break-ins in the area, but determined that the man (a transient) was wanted for an outstanding warrant charging him with possession of cocaine for sale (050 759 752).

Burglary Arrest, 362 Arkansas, July 7, 10:26 p.m.

Bayview Officer Cahill responded on an auto boost call in which a silver Honda was being burglarized. The officers located the car and found a woman standing next to it holding a flashlight. The officers also found a 17 year old male inside the vehicle. The two subjects were detained and the caller came to the scene and identified the detained individuals as those he had seen breaking the window of the auto. The subjects were found in possession of numerous items of stolen property, and the officers searched the area and located two additional vehicles with windows which had recently been broken. All of the victims were located and the subjects were arrested. The woman, 21 and living on the 1100 block of York Street, was booked for burglary (several counts), conspiracy and possession of burglar tools. The juvenile, living on the 1200 block of Cortland, was cited for the same charges and released to his mother (050 760 038).

Domestic Violence, 2100 block of Palou, July 8, 12:01 a.m.

Bayview Officers Birco and Dangerfield responded on an assault call and spoke with the female caller who reported that her boyfriend had just punched her several times in the head and then kicked her following an argument. The boyfriend was not at the scene and an Emergency Protective Order was issued. The case was forwarded to our Domestic Violence Unit (050 760 298).

Battery, 100 block of Westpoint Road, July 8, 9:00 a.m.

Bayview Officer Pascua was on foot patrol when he was approached by a woman who reported that her boyfriend had just assaulted her. The boyfriend, who is also the father of several of the woman's children, was gone from the area. An Emergency Protective Order was issued and the case was forwarded to our Domestic Violence Unit (050 761 531).
