#### Operation Dream Trip

Operation Dream, a non-profit organization started and run by San Francisco police officers in order to provide safe and worthwhile activities for kids living in public housing, took a group of Bayview kids (and others) to two events on Saturday. The kids attended the Bill Pickett International Rodeo, where they learned about the history of African American cowboys, and got to see some of these current cowboys in action. Additionally, the group travelled to SBC park for "kite day" and flew several kites over the parking lots south of the stadium.

#### Crime and Enforcement Update

##### Violence / Firearm Offenses

July 8, 4:58 p.m., a woman reported to Bayview officers that she had been raped on the 700 block of Jerrold several days earlier. The victim stated that the suspect and his associates had forced entry to her apartment and were lying in wait for her to return. The suspect sexually assaulted the victim when she returned home, and the suspect's associates then stole her property and vandalized her apartment. The suspect has been identified through his street name, and the case is being investigated by our Sex Crimes Unit (050 762 874).

July 8, 5:00 p.m., a man reported to Bayview officers that he heard gunshots outside his home and found that his car had been shot four times (050 767 448).

July 8, 6:05 p.m., a man reported to Bayview officers that he saw a man get into his parked vehicle and drive away. The victim followed his car and pulled alongside of it, and when he confronted the suspect, the suspect turned the victim's car toward the victim and rammed his (second) car. The suspect then fled from the vehicle on foot. The suspect is an Asian male, 5'6", shaved head, moustache, wearing a white T-shirt and baggy blue jeans (050 763 963).

July 10, 2:40 a.m., Bayview officers responded on an assault call and found a woman in a parking lot on the 1500 block of Palou lying in a large pool of blood. The officers then saw two men running from the area and one officer administered first aid while the second officer chased the suspects. The first suspect, covered in blood, was found hiding under a parked car and was taken into custody. Back-up officers then located a second suspect hiding in a nearby backyard, and he too was covered with blood. Witnesses at the scene reported to officers that the two detained men had severely beaten the woman with two by fours, rocks, a shovel and other implements. The suspects also slammed the woman's head into the sidewalk several times. The woman was bleeding from her ears and had severe injuries to her entire body and was admitted to SFGH. The suspects were interviewed by the Inspectors who responded to handle the case, and they gave rambling statements about what they had done, eventually stating simply that they were drunk. Both suspects, living on the 1500 block of Palou, were booked for attempted murder, aggravated assault, kidnapping,

mayhem, and conspiracy (050 768 628).

July 10, 9:45 p.m., Bayview officers responded on a shooting call at 141 Middlepoint and found a man who had been shot in the arm. The man was transported to SFGH and treated. The man stated that he had been walking near Hudson and Cashmere when a young black male, 20-22, wearing all black clothing had approached him and asked, "What are you doing here?" The victim stated that he then struggled with and was shot by the suspect. The victim was reluctant to provide any additional information (050 770 902).

July 10, 9:53 p.m., Bayview officers were on patrol on Garlington Court when they saw a group of juveniles loitering and began to approach the group. The juveniles all took off running in different directions and one officer chased a suspect down a stairway into an area surrounded by a high fence with no means of egress. The officer found a fully loaded assault weapon on the ground (hidden in a grille) and then saw an open window (with children inside the window). The officer approached the window and the children told him that someone had just entered the window. The officer made entry to the unit and found a ski mask, a box of live ammunition, and gang paraphernalia in the room. Three young men then ran from the apartment's front door and were detained by other officers. A second fully loaded handgun was also found under a pillow in the room. The room belonged to one of the young men who had run from the unit and had been detained. The suspect, 15 years of age and living on Garlington Court, was booked for numerous weapons charges (050 771 007).

July 10, 10:10 p.m., Bayview officers were working at Kelly's Mission Rock Inn on Terry Francois Blvd. when they saw a man lying on the ground and bleeding from his head. Additional Bayview officers had to be called to the scene and accompanied the victim to SFGH where he was treated for major head trauma. A second victim who had been at Kelly's, also with head trauma, was then brought into SFGH for treatment. (The second man was a friend of the first man.) The victims stated that they were punched and kicked by a group of eight men who then fled from the area. Both victims were intoxicated and could provide very little in the way of a suspect description (050 771 035).

#### Drug Arrests

July 8, 11:08 p.m., a man, living on the 1700 block of LaSalle, was arrested at 1638 Kirkwood for possession of crack cocaine for sale, violation of probation, and violation of a court order. The man was also booked for a warrant charging him with felon in possession of a firearm and drug charges (050 764 933).

July 10, 12:35 a.m., three people were in a car driving down Lucy Street when a man jumped onto the hood of the car and yelled out, "Help me. Help me." The people in the car pulled to the curb and phoned the police. When Bayview officers arrived at the scene, the man was still on top of the car's hood and the officers detained him. The man was sweating profusely and speaking incoherently and the officers found that he was carrying crack cocaine. The man, living on Addison Street, was booked for vandalism (to the car), drug charges and violation of parole (050 768 418).

July 8, 6:55 p.m., a man, living in Oakland, was arrested on the 700 block of LeConte in possession of a counterfeit twenty dollar bill. The man was also found to have an outstanding warrant for his arrest charging him with burglary (050 764 193).

The suspects fled in the victim's car, which Bayview officers located within a few minutes (abandoned) on the 2500 block of Griffith. The suspects are described only as black males in dark clothing (050 768 151).

July 9, 11:20 p.m., a woman was robbed at gunpoint as she was walking home from 3rd and Ingerson. The suspect is a black male, 15-16, 5'8", 150, shoulder length braided hair, wearing a white jacket with a black hood, black pants (050 768 311).
