Update From Supervisor Maxwell

Wednesday, March 2: Ordinance sponsored by Supervisor Maxwell to clarify the appointment process for the In Home Supportive Services (IHSS) Board. The legislation will be heard at the Rules Committee, which meets beginning at 10:00am in City Hall room 263. Wednesday, March 2: Hearing sponsored by Supervisor Maxwell for the Planning Department to provide an update on the EIR for the eastern neighborhoods rezoning effort. The hearing will occur before the Land Use Committee, which meets beginning at 1:00pm in City Hall 263.

Motorcycle Officers for the Bayview

Effective Saturday, March 12, Bayview Station will be assigned two "solo" motorcycle officers for our exclusive use here in the Bayview. These officers will focus on both traffic accidents and traffic violations, and we will deploy them in all of our problem areas in the district.

Rape Suspect

A composite drawing was recently released by our Investigations Bureau of a suspect who committed a rape in the district on December 31, 2004. The crime occurred at 9:00 p.m. in the area of 19th and 3rd Streets, and the suspect held a knife to the victim's throat during the assault. The suspect is a black male, 40-50, 6'2", dark hair turning gray, scruffy beard, thin build, wearing a dark hooded sweatshirt. Crime and Enforcement Update

Carrying a Concealed Handgun, February 25, 2:31 p.m. Bayview Officers Scott and Fitzpatrick, along with Sgt. Fabbri, were on patrol in the area of Whitfield and LaSalle when they saw several young men loitering on Osceola Court. The officers began approaching the group and one of the young men took off running. The officers pursued the young man and saw him discard something while he ran. The officers eventually overtook and detained the young man, and retrieved the item he had discarded, which was a loaded handgun. The young man, 17 years of age and

living on George Court, was booked for weapons violations and delaying arrest. When questioned, the young man stated that he kept the gun for personal protection, as his older brother had been murdered a year ago and several of his friends had been "jacked" recently in the Osceola area (050 220 139).

Shots Fired, February 25, 4:05 p.m.

Bayview Officers Archini and Kenney took a report from a Muni driver at Hudson and Reuel that she had stopped her bus and saw four young men "rear board" the bus and then approach a passenger on the bus as if to fight. The driver ordered the young men off the bus and began to drive away, and as she did, she heard several gunshots being fired. The bus was not struck. The suspects are described only as black males, 16-20 (050 220 656).

Stolen Auto Arrest, February 25, 4:32 p.m.

Bayview Officers Paul and Arndt were on patrol at 22nd and Pennsylvania when they saw a vehicle drive past them with a license which was listed on their hot sheet. The officers arrested the driver, a transient, and booked him for stolen auto and violation of parole (050 214 966).

Possession Methamphetamine, February 25, 6:44 p.m.

Bayview plainclothes officers were on patrol at Phelps and Carroll when they stopped a man for traffic violations and when they asked him for his driver's license, were handed them a fake California DL. The officers arrested the man for possession of a counterfeit DL, and during the arrest search, the officers found both a quantity of meth and an illegal billy club. The man, living on Wilde, was booked for numerous drug and weapons offenses (050 221 400).

Warrant Arrest, February 25, 7:43 p.m.

Bayview plainclothes officers were on patrol in the area of Watchman Way when they came across a man changing a flat tire and stopped to offer assistance. The officers determined that the man did not own the vehicle, and when they checked the man's name, found that he was wanted for an outstanding warrant charging him with robbery, terrorist threats, aggravated assault, and violation of a court order. The man is probably considering investing in AAA road service as a result of this incident (050 221 541).

Aggravated Assault with Gun, February 25, 8:56 p.m.

Bayview Officers Singh and Anderson responded to Ardath Court on the report

of a shooting. The officers found a young man who had been shot in the leg and lip with what appeared to be shotgun pellets. The victim was accompanied by two additional young men, and they all stated that they had simply been walking down the street when they heard gunshots and realized that one of them had been shot. No suspects were seen and the victims could provide no motive for the shooting (050 221 654).

Shots Fired, February 25, 9:40 p.m.

Bayview Officers Archini and Kenney took a report from a woman living on the 100 block of Cashmere who told them that she discovered a bullet inside her home. The caller told officers that she believed the shot had been fired in the above described earlier incident (050 222 088).

Stolen Auto Arrest, February 26, 2:02 p.m.

Bayview Officer Fowler was on traffic duty on the 1200 block of Palou when he clocked (via radar) a passing vehicle at 45 MPH in a 25 MPH zone. The officer pulled the vehicle over and the vehicle's passenger fled on foot. The officer then detained the driver and found him to be a 16 year old unlicensed driver. The driver presented his student body card as ID and told the officer he had just "rented" the car for forty dollars from a woman named Karen living in the Alemany area. Not surprisingly, the young man had been given no paperwork from Karen, although he was instructed to park the vehicle at Alemany and Ellsworth when he was done with his "rental". The young man, living in American Canyon, was booked for stolen auto and traffic offenses (050 213 548).

Cocaine for Sale, Gang Related, February 26, 3:25 p.m.

Bayview's plainclothes team was surveilling the area of Palou and Hawes when they saw a man known to them as a validated member of the "Oakdale Mob" gang standing on the sidewalk. The officers knew the man was on probation for illegal narcotics sales. Moments later, the officers saw the man make a hand to hand drug transaction with a person in a passing vehicle, and the officers began to approach the man to arrest him. The man took off running and ran into a home on the 1000 block of Palou. The officers pursued the man and he jumped from a second floor window onto the ground and again began running. The officers eventually caught up to the man and he began swinging at them and yelling to a nearby group of people who were attending a children's party. The people at the party then began

throwing items at the officers, striking one of the officers in the head.
So much for "party favors." The suspect, living on Vista View Court, was booked for numerous drug charges, participation in a criminal street gang and violation of probation (050 224 244).

Possession of Cocaine for Sale, February 26, 8:44 p.m.
Bayview plainclothes officers were on patrol on the 800 block of Missouri when they saw a known "Zoo Block" gang member standing near the building line. The officers knew both that the man was on parole, and that he has an active stay-away order issued for the area. As the man saw the officers, he began to run away, and the officers pursued him. The officers saw the man discard a plastic bag and the officers retrieved it, finding a quantity of crack cocaine. The man, a transient, was booked for possession of crack cocaine for sale, participation in a criminal street gang, violation of a court order, violation of parole and destroying evidence (050 225 236).

Illegal Lodging, February 26, 10:09 p.m.
In response to numerous citizen complaints, Bayview Officers Buelow and Lavin were addressing illegal lodging issues and issued numerous citations to individuals sleeping in vehicles and other structures. A man was cited at 20th and Indiana for living in a vehicle (050 225 355). A man was cited for living in a motorhome at Army and Minnesota (050 225 662). A man and woman were cited at Illinois and 19th for living in a trailer (050 221 949). A man was cited for living in a vehicle at 23rd and Illinois (050 225 571). A woman was cited for living in a vehicle at Illinois and 23rd (050 225 850). A man and woman were cited at 20th and Illinois for living in a van (050 225 468).

Warrant Arrest, February 27, 1:22 a.m.
Bayview Officers Farrell and Anderson responded to a boarding house on the 1700 block of Jerrold on the report of a person with a knife. The officers met with two tenants of the home, one of whom was drunk, and the tenants both stated that they had been involved in a fight regarding excessive noise. The drunk tenant stated that the other tenant had been armed with a knife, but no knife was found. The second tenant was subsequently booked

for an outstanding arrest warrant charging him with aggravated assault (050 225 941).

Investigative Detention, Resisting Arrest, Threatening an Officer
February
27, 3:16 a.m.

Due to a series of crimes committed recently in the area, Officers Buelow and Lavin were on patrol at 20th and Minnesota when they came across a man who matched both a composite drawing recently released of a rape suspect and the various descriptions provided by nearby residents who had been confronted by a man who had behaved in a bizarre and threatening manner.

In one recent incident, the man had been seen walking around the area naked, in an aroused state, and shouting out the name, "Jehovah." The officers located a man who matched the composite drawing (and description provided) and attempted to detain him. The man immediately became violent and got into a fighting stance. The man then threatened to kill the officers and they called for back-up. The man was arrested without incident and was turned over to the Sex Crimes Inspector handling the original rape. This case and suspect may be tied to the homicide reported a week earlier from the same area (050 580 594).

Robbery February 27, 3:24 a.m.

Bayview Officers Farrell and Anderson responded to 3rd and Newcomb on the report of a robbery and met with two Asian men who had just been robbed.

The men told officers that they had been in a vehicle accident at the corner, and as they got out of their car, four men at the scene began to beat and rob them. A woman living nearby and driving past the scene then stopped her car and began yelling at the suspects to leave the victims alone. All four suspects then fled. The suspects are described only as young black males (050 226 193).

Burglary, February 27, 8:19 a.m.

Bayview Officers Ernst and Garate took a report of a burglary which had just occurred from a man living on the 100 block of Connecticut. The victim told the officers that he heard noise in his home and went downstairs and saw a man fleeing from his home carrying copper pipe. The suspect is described as a black male, 30s, wearing a brown baseball cap with a red unknown logo and a brown jacket (050 226 529).

Heroin Offense, February 27, 1:09 p.m.

Bayview Officer Coleman was on a traffic stop at 3rd and Wallace when he

saw a man walking in and out of traffic and yelling loudly. The officer detained the man and determined that he had an outstanding warrant for his arrest. An arrest search of the man revealed a quantity of heroin. The man, living on Margaret Street, was booked for the warrant and for possession of heroin (050 227 276).

Possession Marijuana, Probation Violation February 27, 5:09 p.m. Bayview plainclothes officers were on patrol at LaSalle and Newhall when they saw a man they recognized as a local drug dealer (currently on probation) engaged in what appeared to be a drug sale. The officers approached the man and found a quantity of marijuana on his person. The man, living on the 1700 block of LaSalle, was booked for numerous drug offenses and violation of probation (050 227 969).
