Track and Field Opportunities

Crime and Enforcement Update

On February 1, at 11:29 a.m., Bayview Officer Chu responded to a home on the 200 block of Elmira on a theft call. The caller told the officer that, following a fire at her neighbor's home, she hid several valuable items, including a large amount of currency, inside her stove. The caller stated

that she had phoned PG&E to re-light her stove's pilot light, forgetting that she had hidden her personal items there. When the PG&E worker left the home, the caller checked the stove and noticed her property missing (050 123 981).

On February 1, at 12:47 p.m., Bayview Officers Gallo and Reyes responded to 1791 Bancroft, the Sun Reporter Newspaper Company, on a call of harassing phone calls. The caller told officers that various people have been calling their phone for the past month and leaving harassing and racist messages. The caller was able to provide officers with the phone number of the suspect(s) and the case will be investigated by our Special Investigations Detail as a potential hate crime (050 124 387).

On February 1, at 1:11 p.m., Bayview Officers Ernst and Garate were on patrol at San Bruno and Bacon when they made a traffic stop on a vehicle for mechanical violations. The driver told officers that he did not have his driver's license with him, but he provided the officers with his name and date of birth. The officers were unable to locate any DMV record for the driver and continued to question him about his identity. The officers were going to place the man under arrest as an unlicensed driver when they found the man's wallet in his rear pocket and located a California ID card belonging to the man, but with a different name from the one he had provided. The officers confronted the man with this new information and he verified that the name on the ID card was his. The man stated, "I get confused because I got hit on my head once." The man was arrested as an unlicensed driver and was also charged with an outstanding warrant (050 124 519).

On February 1, at 4:00 p.m., a man living on Quesada came to Bayview Station and reported that he had met a woman on-line at the E-Bay website and had agreed to pay her over \$2500 for three Sony Vaio computers. The man sent the money through Western Union to the woman and received confirmation of his payment from "transactiondetails@tnt-deliver.com." The victim never received any computers and has been unable to contact the woman since he paid the money. The victim had contacted the woman through her chat address of "dmecs@yahoo.co.uk." The case is being investigated by our Fraud Detail (050 125 987).

On February 1, at 5:38 p.m., Bayview Officers Arndt, Bradford, Paul and Olson responded to the 600 block of Rhode Island on the call of a man with a gun. The officers were met by three victim / witnesses who told them that a man had just threatened them with a gun and then run into a nearby building. The officers went to the four-unit building pointed out by the victims and knocked on each door, receiving no answer each time. One of the officers then saw a man climbing onto the roof of the building and the officers pursued the man onto the roof. The officers then detained the man at gunpoint and were able to handcuff him. The officers patted the man down and found two fully loaded clips (magazines), but no firearm. A protective search of the man's apartment revealed a handgun case, a quantity of methamphetamine and a hypodermic needle and syringe filled with methamphetamine, but no firearm. The victims told officers that they had been standing in the street when the suspect had appeared on the balcony of his unit and yelled at them. The suspect then pulled a handgun from his waistband and pointed it at the victims, threatening to shoot them. The suspect was found to be a convicted felon, and based upon the victims' statements was booked as a felon with a firearm, along with other offenses, including possession of methamphetamine (050 125 909).

On February 1, at 6:28 p.m., Bayview Officer Reyes responded to 2480 San Bruno Avenue, the San Bruno Supermarket, on the report of a battery. The employees told the officer that they had seen a woman placing items into a bag and then attempting to leave their store without paying for the items. When the employees confronted the woman, she attempted to push them away and the employees phoned the police. Numerous stolen items were found in the woman's bag and she was charged with petty theft with a prior (conviction) 050 126 139.

On February 1, at 9:53 p.m., Bayview Officers Foss and Birco responded to the 1100 block of Fitzgerald on the call of a carjacking. The victim told officers that he was dropping off a friend at a home on the 1100 block of Fitzgerald and was double-parked when a man approached him and pointed a black "Tec-9" assault weapon at the victim's head. A second suspect

approached the passenger side of the vehicle holding a shotgun. The two suspects then entered the victim's vehicle and fled the area. Suspect one is a black male, 21-22, 5'8", 180, dreadlocks, face covered with a "skull" ski mask, wearing a black T-shirt over a red T-shirt, armed with a Tec-9 Assault weapon. Suspect two is a black male, 20-25, holding a shotgun, no further description. The vehicle stolen is a 1979 Chevy Impala, 2 door, silver in color, California license 4KWZ980 (050 126 662).

On February 1, at 10:58 p.m., Bayview Officers Bates and Batchelder were on patrol at San Bruno and Mansell when they made a traffic stop on a vehicle for mechanical violations. The officers determined that the driver was wanted for an outstanding warrant charging her with fraud, and she was arrested for the warrant (050 126 929).

On February 1, at 11:11 p.m., an officer assigned to Mission Station was at SFGH when three men walked a shooting victim into the hospital, saying that the man had just been shot on Harbor Road. The Mission officer attempted to gather additional information, but the men were very uncooperative and refused to be interviewed. Bayview Officers Anderson and Farrell then responded to SFGH in an effort to interview the victim and witnesses. The witnesses, as well as two nephews of the victim who had just arrived at the hospital, were all uncooperative. The victim was then interviewed and provided several (conflicting) accounts to the officers of what had transpired. The victim admitted to the officers that he had been smoking crack prior to the incident, and stated that he had been walking home (to Harbor Road) from Westpoint and Middlepoint when he noticed he was being followed by a man. The man suddenly shot at the victim (three times), striking him once. The suspect is described as a black male, 20, 6'0", 200, dreadlock hair, wearing a camouflage jacket and gray hooded sweatshirt (050 126 907).
