Block Grants

The Mayor's Office of Community Development is pleased to announce the availability of a supplemental Request for Proposals (RFP) for the 2005-06 Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) program. This RFP is specifically for planning, facilities, and public services, with an emphasis on low-income neighborhoods in the southeast sector. The RFP will be available only on-line beginning February 10, 2005. Proposals will be due by 8:00 p.m., Thursday, March 3, 2005. The application is a three-step process. Crime and Enforcement Update

On February 15, at 7:50 a.m., Bayview Officer Miller responded to 18th and Utah on an indecent exposure call. Several officers were at the scene and had detained a man who matched a description just provided for a suspect who had exposed himself to a student at ISA High School at 693 Vermont and had then handled himself as the female student walked away. A cold show was conducted and the detained man was not identified as the perpetrator, however, it was determined that he was a sex offender who had failed to register. The detained suspect was booked for failing to register as a sex

offender. The wanted suspect is described as a Hispanic male, 30-40, 5'10", 180, moustache, wearing a navy blue hooded jacket and white or tan pants (050 178 732).

On February 15, at 11:32 a.m., Bayview Officer Lavin responded to a homeless complaint at Evans and Selby and found a woman standing next to a trailer. The woman was wanted for outstanding warrants and was placed under arrest, and when she was searched, a quantity of methamphetamine was found. The woman, homeless, was booked for the warrant and for simple possession (050 179 633).

On February 15, at 1:30 p.m., Bayview Officers Leung, Kwan, Reyes, Berge, and Baron responded to the 300 block of Holyoke on a burglary call. The victims told officers that they had returned home to find their home ransacked and their property missing. A neighbor then approached and stated that she had seen a man ringing the doorbell to the home for approximately five minutes during the period of time that the victims were gone. The witness had seen the man speaking on a cell phone and then saw him leaving the area in a gray car with a license plate similar to 4URL02_. The man driving the car was a black male, 19-20, 5'10", wearing a black knit cap, black jacket and black pants. Approximately one hour later, Officers Kwan and Reyes spotted a gray Camaro with California plate 4URL089 and stopped it, finding three occupants aboard. The occupants were identified, and one of them was found to be on probation with a search condition. The witness was brought to the scene of the traffic stop for a cold-show, but couldn't identify any of the detained men as the suspect she had seen (050 180 323).

On February 15, at 1:54 p.m., Bayview Officer Lamma was on patrol on Nichols Way when she saw three men loitering in a doorway and knew that none of them lived there (she knows the resident of the unit). The officer identified the men and discovered that one of the men had an outstanding warrant for his arrest charging him with making terrorist threats. The man was booked on the warrant (050 180 458).

On February 15, at 5:33 p.m., officers assigned to our Fugitive Recovery Team met with a parole agent on Nautilus Way to take custody of a man wanted on a federal parole warrant. The man was on home detention and was supposed to be wearing monitoring equipment. The man, living on the 100 block of Nautilus, was booked for violation of parole (050 181 183).

On February 15, at 7:55 p.m., Bayview Officers Olson and Arndt responded to the 600 block of Minnesota on the report of a burglary. The female caller told officers that her male roommate had just left their apartment, and she then heard noises and found a man going through her personal belongings inside of her apartment. The caller demanded that the suspect leave, and he complied. The suspect is described as a black male, 35-40, 5'10", 160, wearing a brown sweatshirt, black parka, dark pants, appeared homeless and smelled of booze (050 181 622).

On February 15, at 10:10 p.m., Bayview Officer Buelow received an anonymous phone call (below described quality of life phones) and was told that homeless people had been seen entering a vacant building at 550 18th Street. Officer Buelow arrived in time to see a woman entering the premises and

detained her. Additional officers arrived at the scene and entered the building, finding a man inside the building who was also detained. The man and woman were interviewed and each said that they were in the building visiting the other. A female officer was present and conducted a pat search of the detained female, finding a large quantity of methamphetamine inside one half of her bra. When the officer searched the other side of the bra, a second (large) quantity of meth was found. Apparently the drugs had been split up in that manner for purposes of assuring balance. The woman, who stated that she resides on 6th Street, was also found to be in possession of over \$6,000.00 in currency, which was booked as evidence. The woman was booked for possession of methamphetamine for sale and trespassing (050 182 012).
