More Jobs

Mount Kilimanjaro

I received a phone call last week from a police officer from New Mexico who represents a group of officers from around the country who get together annually to scale one of the world's highest peaks in honor of a peace officer killed in the line of duty the previous year. Well over one hundred officers die in the line of duty each year in this country, but this group chose Bayview Station's Officer Isaac Espinoza as this year's honoree. The group will be climbing Mount Kilimanjaro in Africa, and plans to take memorabilia from Isaac's life to the top of the mountain, where photos of Isaac's belongings will be taken for later presentation to his widow. This is an extreme honor for Isaac, for Bayview Station, and for the entire SFPD. Isaac was chosen because of the tremendous reputation he had established during his many years in the Bayview, with citizens, fellow officers, and even individuals he arrested. I will be accompanying this group on their climb, and will carry Isaac's favorite softball bat with me to the top of Kilimanjaro, where I will take photos of it for later display at Bayview Station.

Crime and Enforcement Update

On December 2, at 7:10 a.m., Bayview officers received information from a family member that a wanted subject had just returned home. The officers responded to the home on Whitfield and arrested a 15 year old male who was wanted for an outstanding arrest warrant charging him with aggravated assault (041 369 443).

On December 2, at 9:15 a.m., a woman walked into Bayview Station and reported that her ex-boyfriend had just choked her and threatened her with a knife. The victim, living on the 1800 block of Ingalls, reported that her ex-boyfriend had phoned her numerous times and she had told him to stop phoning and to not come to her home. The boyfriend then showed up at her home and rang the doorbell of a neighbor so that he could get past the front gate. Once inside the building, the boyfriend had entered the victim's home and then threatened and choked her. The suspect lives in South San Francisco and the case is being investigated by our Domestic Violence Unit (041 371 608).

On December 2, at 11:45 a.m. Bayview officers responded to the Bank of America on Jerrold on a fraud call. The officers were directed to a man standing at a teller's window who was attempting to cash a stolen check. The man was arrested and told officers that his nephew had given him the check to cash, but he refused to provide his nephew's name. The man,

living in Oakland, was booked for various fraud and theft charges (041 370 569).

On December 2, at 2:56 p.m., Bayview officers responded to San Bruno and Harkness on the report of a drunk driver. A citizen had been following the driver from downtown, and had witnessed the drunk driver almost hit a pedestrian at Church and Market, hit a vehicle on Franklin, hit the witness's vehicle twice, hit a bike rider at Gough and Fulton, come close to hitting a meter maid at Fell and Hayes, and then drive to San Bruno Avenue, where he parked, got out of the car, and urinated on a building. The driver, living in Hillsborough, was booked for felony drunk driving (due to the injury accident), and several counts of hit and run (041 371 410).

On December 2, at 3:42 p.m., Bayview plainclothes officers were on patrol on the 1100 block of Mendell when they saw a 17 year old male walking by. The officers knew the young man, and also knew that he was wanted. The young man, living in a group home on Fulton Street, was booked at YGC for the warrant (041 371 551).

On December 2, at 4:12 p.m., Bayview officers responded to the 100 block of Dakota Street on the call of a dispute between neighbors. The dispute had been resolved by the time the officers arrived, but they discovered an outstanding warrant for the arrest of one of the parties. The wanted man, living on Westpoint Road, was booked for a warrant charging him with possession of stolen property (041 371 711).

On December 2, at 7:21 p.m., Bayview officers were on patrol at Newcomb and Toland when they saw a vehicle listed on their hot sheet and detained the driver and passenger. The driver told the officers that he had bought the car "...from some dude on Potrero Hill." The driver had no paperwork for the vehicle and didn't know the name of the "dude" he had purchased the vehicle from. Additionally, the officers determined that the driver was on probation for a prior stolen auto case. The driver, living on the 1800 block of 25th Street, was booked for stolen auto (041 344 304).

On December 2, at 7:30 p.m., Bayview officers responded to a home on the 1900 block of Lane on the report of a fight between brothers. The caller told officers that he and his brother were fighting over repairs done to their home, and the brother had attempted to punch him twice and had then threatened to throw a saw blade at him. The brother dropped the saw blade and then returned with a billiard ball and held it in a threatening manner. The brother then dropped the ball, returning moments later with another billiard ball, which he held up as if to throw at the victim. The brother then threatened to kill the victim prior to leaving. The case is being investigated by our Inspector's Bureau (041 372 640).

On December 2, at 8:45 p.m., Bayview officers responded to Westpoint Road on the report of a dispute between neighbors. The caller told officers that she had looked outside her window to see her neighbor's dog defecating on her lawn, and she had confronted the neighbor about the incident. The neighbor had then threatened to "sic" her dog on the caller, although the dog is only a 10 pound puppy. The caller was not intimidated by this threat and simply went back into her home and notified police. The SFHA

will be notified about this violation of their rules and regulations (041 372 747).

On December 2, at 8:52 p.m., Bayview officers were on patrol at San Bruno and Silver when they stopped a vehicle which was travelling with no headlights. The officers determined that the driver had a suspended license, the vehicle had false registration, and the driver was wanted for an outstanding arrest warrant. The driver was arrested and a search of the vehicle revealed a large black garbage bag containing marijuana. The driver, living on the 2000 block of Pacific Avenue, was booked for possession of marijuana for sale, traffic violations, and a warrant charging him with possession of methamphetamine (041 372 690).
