Crime and Enforcement Update

On December 24, at 8:34 a.m., Bayview Officers Benzinger, DeJesus, Izaguirre, Fitzpatrick, Mustafich and Aherne were working on the 700 block of Missouri and detained a man who had been seen making a drug deal with a passing motorist. The officers found a stash of crack cocaine near the suspect and arrested him. The suspect, living on the 700 block of Missouri, was booked for sales and possession for sale of crack cocaine and violation of parole (041 454 254).

On December 24, at 10:08 p.m., Bayview Officers Dangerfield and Lane were on patrol at Silver and Revere when they made a stop on a vehicle for traffic violations. The officers determined that the passenger was on federal probation, and a search of the vehicle revealed a loaded handgun in the console. The passenger then took off running and the officers pursued him, eventually locating him in a nearby backyard. Both the driver and passenger were booked for a variety of firearms and probation charges (041

456 341).

On December 24, at 10:51 a.m., Bayview Officers Parry and Harmston were on patrol at 17th and Mississippi when they made a stop on a motorcycle for traffic violations. The officers determined that the driver had a suspended license and placed him under arrest. The driver was found to have two outstanding warrants for his arrest, including a felony warrant from Los Angeles. The suspect was booked for the warrants (041 454 721).

On December 24, at 5:34 p.m., Bayview Officers Erb and Johnson responded to the 1700 block of Newcomb on a battery call. The female caller told officers that her husband had punched her following an argument. The husband told officers that the wife had been trying to steal Christmas presents in order to sell them for drug money, and this had resulted in the argument. The husband was arrested for battery, and the officers then determined that the wife was a sex offender who had failed to properly register. The wife was arrested for violation of her sex offender registration requirements (041 455 804).

On December 24, at 11:26 p.m., Bayview Officers Mitchell and Winesberry were on patrol at 3rd and Newcomb when they made a stop on a vehicle for traffic violations. The officers determined that the driver was on parole and found narcotics paraphernalia as well as unlawful weapons in the vehicle. The man, living on Westbrook Court, was booked for violation of parole and other offenses (041 456 498).

On December 25, at 11:40 p.m., Bayview Officers Wilhelm and Wise responded to the first block of Progress Street on a carjacking in progress call. The officers were told by Dispatch that a man armed with a gun and wearing a ski mask was attempting to steal a new black Grand Am. As the officers were driving on Whitney Young Circle they saw a black Grand Am turning onto Hudson from Whitney Young. The officers could see that the vehicle had four occupants and pulled it over at Newhall. As the vehicle stopped, a man jumped from the driver's door and began to flee on foot. The man was taken into custody and the officers then detained the three additional occupants of the vehicle. After the occupants had been removed from the auto, the officers found a fully loaded shotgun on the car's floorboard and seized it. The officers determined that the first man who had jumped from

the car was actually the victim, and he was interviewed. The victim told officers that one of the suspects had phoned him and asked to be given a ride by the victim. The victim drove to Sunnydale Avenue and met with the first suspect, who brought him into a home. The two additional suspects were inside the home, and one of them, armed with the shotgun, robbed the victim of his property. The three suspects then forced the victim to drive to his bank and withdraw money from his ATM. After obtaining money from the ATM, the suspects forced the victim to drive to his grandmother's house, where they obtained more cash. The suspects then forced the victim to drive to his girlfriend's house and tried to obtain additional money, but the girlfriend phoned 9-1-1, and the officers responded to this home and made the arrest. During searches of the suspects, the officers found live shotgun shells, crack cocaine, and marijuana. The first suspect, living on Key Avenue, was booked for kidnapping, multiple counts of robbery, carjacking, conspiracy, felon in possession of a firearm, possession of a loaded firearm, possession of crack cocaine for sale, possession of marijuana and violation of parole. The second suspect, living on Garrison, was booked for the same charges, as was the third suspect, living on the 700 block of Pacific (041 458 400).

On December 25, at 11:44 p.m., Bayview Officers Nichols and Winesberry were on patrol at 17th and Vermont when they stopped on a vehicle for traffic violations. The driver had a suspended license and was arrested, and the officers then found a large quantity of methamphetamine in the driver's pockets. The driver also possessed a quantity of marijuana and over \$500.00 in currency. The suspect, living on Valencia Street, was booked for transportation and possession for sale of methamphetamine, possession of marijuana, and traffic offenses (041 458 353).

On December 26, at 12:54 a.m., Canine Unit Officer Montoya was on patrol on Innes near Griffith when he saw a vehicle driving directly toward him at a high rate of speed. The officer veered off the roadway and allowed the suspect vehicle to pass, and then made a U-turn and pursued the vehicle. The suspect vehicle drove recklessly throughout both the Bayview and Southern Police Districts and was eventually stopped as it drove onto Hwy 280 from Mariposa by officers who had deployed spike strips. The suspect,

living on Middlepoint Road, was booked for felony flight from a peace officer, attempted aggravated assault, resisting arrest, and driving with a suspended license (041 458 494).

On December 26, at 4:05 a.m., Bayview Officers Damonte and Cahill were on patrol at 17th and Connecticut when they heard voices coming from the parking lot of a company which was closed for business. The officers searched the lot and found a man hiding inside one of the business's trucks. The man was detained and was found to have a syringe filled with cocaine and a separate stash of powdered cocaine. The man was booked for possession of cocaine (041 458 369).

On December 26, at 8:00 a.m., Bayview Officer Darnell responded to the Radio Shack store at 2490 San Bruno Avenue and spoke with an employee who related the following. The employee was opening the store and noticed the metal security gate was rolled up. The employee also noticed that loose wires were hanging from the electrical box used for the security gate. The employee then noticed that the tradesman door adjacent to the business was also unlocked and ajar. The employee then saw the cash register from Radio Shack inside a box and she walked away from the area. The employee then saw a vehicle drive up, a man exit the vehicle and retrieve the box containing the cash register, and re enter the vehicle prior to fleeing from the area. The man is an Asian male, 20-25, 5'5", 130, wearing a red baseball cap and light colored shirt and pants. The suspect entered a 1999 Mercedes Benz, ML-320, 4 door hatchback, California license 4SDR930 (041 458 933).
