Toy Give-Away

This Sunday, December 19, a Christmas toy give-away will take place at Bayview Station from noon to 2:00 p.m. Bayview Station is working with Operation Dream to provide gifts and toys for needy children who reside in the Bayview District. Operation Dream normally provides toys every Christmas to children living in public housing, but this year is assisting Bayview Station with providing toys for kids who live outside of public housing, many of whom are also in need of our support and assistance. If you would like to support this effort, Operation Dream is still looking for donations, both monetary and in the form of toys and other gifts. If you know of any kids who could benefit from this program, please bring them by Bayview Station at noon on Sunday, where they can meet Santa and be provided with a Christmas gift.

Infant Case

The SFPD is seeking the public's assistance in the case of the body of a third-trimester male infant discovered in the toilet waste water tank of a Greyhound bus on Sunday, December 12. The bus arrived at 1:00 p.m., and a maintenance worker discovered the body at the bus company's maintenance yard on the 1100 block of 7th Street about an hour later. The bus departed initially from Salt Lake City on December 11, and went through Wendover, Elko, Battle Mountain, Winnemucca, and Reno in the state of Nevada. The bus traveled through Sacramento, Vallejo and Oakland before arriving in San Francisco. SFPD Public Affairs, 553-1651.

Crime and Enforcement Update

On December 13, at 11:55 p.m., Bayview Officers Wise and Wong arrested a man at Newcomb and Mendell for an outstanding felony arrest warrant (041 414 480).

On December 14, at 5:16 a.m., Bayview Officers Lavin and Buelow responded to Mendell and Newhall on a call of numerous people living in trailers and motorhomes on the public street. The call further stated that the people were dumping large amounts of garbage on the sidewalks and were using

nearby bushes as restrooms. The officers contacted a woman living in a motorhome who told them that she has an apartment but doesn't want to live in it. Furthermore, the woman told the officers that she wasn't going to move and was going to continue to live wherever she wants. The woman was cited for illegal lodging on public streets (041 414 731).

On December 14, at 10:29 a.m., Bayview Officers Parry and Harmston responded to a home on the 1700 block of Revere on a domestic violence call. The female caller told officers that her boyfriend had punched and slapped her numerous times following an argument over who was going to iron their baby's clothes. The boyfriend fled prior to the arrival of the officers. The case is being investigated by our Domestic Violence Unit (041 415 660).

On December 14, at 11:00 a.m., Bayview Officer Chu took a report from a woman who stated that someone had shot twice into her vehicle, which had been parked on the first block of Dakota Street. The incident took place between 8:00 p.m. on December 10 and 10:00 a.m. on December 11 (041 415 745).

On December 14, at 1:24 p.m., Bayview plainclothes Officers Lyons, Scott and Izaguirre were working at 3rd and Newcomb when they saw a woman wrapping crack cocaine inside a dollar bill. The woman, living on the 1700 block of McKinnon, was arrested for possession of crack cocaine and possession of narcotics paraphernalia (041 416 389).

On December 14, at 2:39 p.m., Bayview plainclothes Officers Mustafich, Solares and DeJesus were on patrol at Newcomb and Newhall when they saw a man they knew to be wanted and arrested him. The man had outstanding warrants for cocaine sales and two additional possession of cocaine cases. Due to his various ailments, the man was not admitted to County Jail and he was released from custody (041 051 769).

On December 14, at 2:50 p.m., Bayview Officer Lew took a report from a woman, living on Watchman Way, who stated that a phone which had been stolen from her home in a burglary had been returned to her by a neighbor. The neighbor told the victim that he had received the phone from another woman who also lives on Watchman Way (041 416 884).

On December 14, at 5:21 p.m., Bayview Officers Fowler and Hastings responded to Bayshore and Visitacion on the report of a found child, who was crying and appeared scared. The officers found a four year old boy

crying and shivering on the corner and placed him in their car. The officers spoke with the little boy, who was able to direct them to a nearby apartment building in which he stated he lived. The officers walked the boy into a vacant apartment he identified as his own and then notified Child Protective Services. While the officers were on the phone with CPS, the boy's mother walked into the apartment and told officers that she had been at the nearby 7-11 "buying an Icee." The woman then changed her story and said that she had been driving a friend home and had left the TV on for her son. The child was taken into protective custody and the mother was booked for child endangerment (041 417 622).

On December 14, at 11:43 p.m., Bayview Officers Bradford and Archini responded to VanDyke and Keith on the report of a man with a gun. The officers found three individuals who matched the description given by Dispatch, and as the officers told the three men to stop, one of them did and two of them fled on bikes. While one officer detained the first man, the second officer chased after the second and third man, catching one of them. This man struggled violently with the officer and refused to remove his hands from his waist area, leading the officer to believe that he was in fact armed. The man was eventually taken into custody and a supply of crack cocaine was found in his front waistband area. The first man, living on the 300 block of Thornton, was booked for an outstanding arrest warrant charging him with sales of cocaine. The second man, living on the 1600 block of Yosemite, was booked for possession of crack cocaine, and two counts of resisting arrest (041 418 658).

On December 15, at 1:25 a.m., Bayview Officers Farrell and Anderson were on patrol on Bayshore Blvd. near Oakdale when they made a traffic stop on a vehicle for mechanical violations and determined that the driver was unlicensed. As the officers were interviewing the driver, the passenger referred to them as "honky ass pigs," and then spit on one of the officers. The driver was booked for the traffic offenses and the passenger was cited for spitting on the officer and advised to use more up to date put-downs in the future. (The last time someone called me a "honky ass pig" I was wearing a leisure suit.) 041 418 896

On December 15, at 2:24 a.m., Bayview Officers Anderson and Farrell responded to the 1000 block of Fitzgerald on the report of a vandalism. The victim told officers that he was awakened by his car alarm and went outside where he saw two men near his van, one reaching into a (just) broken window. The men fled upon seeing the victim. Suspect one is a black male, 30-40, 6'2", 140, wearing a dark baseball cap with white letter "N," dark jacket and blue jean pants. Suspect two is a black male, 6'0", 230, wearing a brown jacket (041 418 965).

On December 15, at 4:43 a.m., Bayview Officers Batchelder and Bates responded to a home on Scotia Street on the report of a person attempting suicide with a gun. While en-route to the home, the officers learned via their computer that the occupant of the home had two outstanding warrants for his arrest, one related to a firearms case. The officers located the man who the call had been made for, and he told the officers he had ingested some pills, and the officers had him transported to SFGH for a pysch evaluation and hold. The officers then realized that the warrants were for the man's son, who had the same name. The son was located inside the home and officers arrested him for an outstanding warrant charging him with felon in possession of a firearm. Inside the man's room the officers found a shotgun and numerous shells, a handgun, a quantity of powdered cocaine, a quantity of crack cocaine, scales, brass knuckles, and a knife with a spiked knuckle guard. The man, 32 years of age and living on the first block of Scotia, was charged with the warrant and with numerous additional felonies based upon the drugs and firearms (041 419 098).
