Toy Give-Away

Operation Dream normally provides toys every Christmas to children living in public housing, but this year is assisting Bayview Station with providing toys for kids who live outside of public housing, many of whom are also in need of our support and assistance. If you would like to support this effort, Operation Dream is still looking for donations, both monetary and in the form of toys and other gifts. If you know of any kids who could benefit from this program, please bring them by Bayview Station at noon on Sunday, where they can meet Santa and be provided with a Christmas gift.

Crime and Enforcement Update

On December 13, at 4:20 a.m., Bayview Officers Lavin and Buelow responded to Mendell and Newhall regarding a call of people living in cars on the street. The officers located a woman living in a motor home and cited her. The woman told officers that she was not going to leave regardless of how many times she was cited (041 410 422).

On December 13, at 5:20 a.m., Bayview Officer Darnell responded to 50 Quint on a call of numerous vehicles broken into. The construction company employee told the officer that someone had broken into the company's parking lot and then broken into at least three parked company trucks, stealing numerous construction tools (041 411 022)/

On December 13, at 8:50 a.m., Bayview Officer Bodisco responded to a home on the 900 block of Connecticut on a call of a family dispute involving a knife. There had been numerous prior calls to the apartment at various times earlier in the day. The female caller told officers that her 20 year old daughter and her daughter's boyfriend had been arguing all night and she wanted him removed from the premises. The boyfriend had an outstanding warrant for his arrest and was arrested (041 410 870).

On December 13, at 4:39 p.m., Bayview Officers Lew and Archini received information that a man wanted on an outstanding arrest warrant, and also in violation of a court-issued stay away order, was standing at Thomas and Hawes. The officers located the man and determined that both the stay-away order and warrant were valid, and the man was arrested (041 413 432).

On December 13, at 6:25 p.m., Bayview Officer Bradford took a report from a man who stated that he had been working earlier in the day at Lee's Liquors at Revere and Jennings when his ex-girlfriend had approached him and sprayed him in the face with an unknown caustic chemical. The girlfriend, living on the 1000 block of Palou, then fled. The case was referred to our Domestic Violence Unit for follow-up (041 413 705).

On December 13, at 10:33 p.m., Bayview Officers Foss and Birco responded to a home on Nichols Way on a call from Child Protective Services that

numerous children had been left alone in the home and were drinking and doing drugs. The officers found five children in the home, ranging in age from 4 to 15, and although the home was in disarray, the children appeared in good health and there was no evidence of drinking or drug usage. The mother returned home shortly thereafter, and the CPS reportee was contacted and wished only that a report be authored (041 414 349).

On December 13, at 11:55 p.m., Bayview Officers Wise and Wong were on patrol at Newcomb and Mendell when they came across a man wanted for an outstanding warrant and placed him under arrest (041 414 480).

On December 14, at 2:52 a.m., Bayview Officers Wilhelm and Singh were on patrol at Jennings and Thomas when they made a traffic stop on a vehicle and determined that the vehicle's ID number (VIN) did not match the license plate. Additionally, the driver had a suspended license. The driver, living on Kellogg, was cited for a variety of vehicle code violations and the vehicle was impounded (041 414 628).
