Crime and Enforcement Update

8/3/04

Trespassing Unit Block of Double Rock 0413 hrs.
Part 1 of a 4 part series

Bayview Officers Farrell and Anderson responded on a report of a man refusing to leave a residence. Upon arrival, they met a woman who said her boyfriend was refusing to leave the house. While they were talking to her, they heard a loud noise from the back. The boyfriend apparently jumped out a window and ran away. The officers searched for the boyfriend but did not find him. The girlfriend said that the boyfriend did not hit her.

Part 2 of a 4 part series

Bayview Officers responded to the same address on a report that the boyfriend had returned and now had a gun. Numerous Bayview units also responded. When Officer Farrell and Anderson arrived, they detained the boyfriend, but no gun was found. The girlfriend said that she only said that so the police would respond faster. Officers transported the boyfriend to Bayview Station for further investigation. A record check did not reveal any warrants or restraining orders, so the boyfriend was cited for trespassing and released.

Drunk in Public

Fitzgerald/Cameron

1000 hrs.

Bayview Officer Lujan was on uniformed patrol when a citizen advised him of a drunk person yelling and cursing at passerby's. When Officer Lujan went to talk to the drunk person, the man began to yell and curse at him. Officer Lujan requested back-up and several officers responded. The man was arrested for being drunk in public.

Misdemeanor Domestic Violence, Violation of a Court Order Unit Block of Double Rock 1043 hrs.

Part 3 of a 4 part series

Bayview Officer Barron, along with several other officers responded on a report of a man ransacking a house. Dispatch further stated that Dispatch logs show that the officers responded to that address last night on a man with a gun call. Officers searched the house, but the suspect, the boyfriend, had fled prior to the police officers' arrival. The girlfriend of the suspect, said that the boyfriend was arrested earlier today for trespassing. Later, he called his girlfriend and told her he was coming over to get his stuff. Fearing for her safety, the girlfriend left her house and went to a friends house. The boyfriend showed up at the friend's house and began to bang on the doors and yell for his girlfriend to come out. The girlfriend came outside whereupon they began to argue. The boyfriend's mom showed up and told both of them that she would give them a ride back to the house where the boyfriend could pick up his belongings. During the car ride, the boyfriend struck the girlfriend. He then went into the house and ransacked it.

The girlfriend told Officer Barron that earlier that day when the boyfriend was arrested, she lied to the police when she said that the suspect did not hit her. She said that the suspect did hit her, but she was scared. She also said that the suspect did not have a gun. She only said that to get the police to respond more quickly.

The suspect called his girlfriend when Officer Barron was interviewing her. Officer Barron spoke with the suspect and asked him to come to Bayview Station. The suspect came to Bayview Station and provided his statement.

A record check revealed that the suspect had three restraining orders against him preventing him from being anywhere near his girlfriend. He was booked for misdemeanor domestic violence and violation of a court order. Officer Barron said that initially the restraining orders did not come up during the computer record check, but another officer was able to verify the orders by calling HQ.

Since the boyfriend said that he injured hit foot trying to flee from the police earlier (Part 1), officers took him to the San Francisco General Hospital for treatment.

Possession of Cocaine for Sale, No Bail Warrant Arrest
Keith/Revere 1614 hrs.

Bayview Plainclothes Officers Solares and Fitzpatrick were on patrol in an

unmarked vehicle when they saw the suspect driving. Having prior knowledge that the suspect had a warrant, they conducted a traffic stop. The suspect was arrested and transported to Bayview Station. The suspect's car was released to a friend on the request of the suspect. Because the officers had numerous contacts with the suspect before for narcotics, they requested permission to conduct a strip search. Permission was granted and they conducted a strip search. During the course of the search the suspect admitted having "crack" in his "crack". The officers seized the "crack" cocaine and booked it as evidence.

Threats, Violation of a Court Order, Resisting Arrest Bayview Station
1630 hrs.
Part 4 of a 4 part series

Bayview Officer Coleman was notified that he was detailed to the San Francisco General Hospital to guard a prisoner who needed medical treatment, the boyfriend. When Office Coleman was informed of the boyfriend's name, he recognized the name as the person who fled from him on 8/2/05. I included this on 8/2/05's misc. crime section.

On 8/2/05, Officer Coleman and Fowler were dispatched to the unit block of Double Rock on a report of threats. Dispatch gave the description of the suspect as they were enroute. When they arrived, they saw two people who matched the description. They detained the two men and asked for identification. One of the men had a license, but the other one did not. He identified himself verbally. A computer check revealed no warrants for either of them.

Officer Fowler then made contact with the girlfriend. She said that her boyfriend violated a restraining order and came over to use the bathroom. When she let him in, he threatened her. She also told Officer Fowler the boyfriend's true name and pointed him out.

When Officer Fowler went back to where the two men were being detained, the boyfriend suddenly ran away. Numerous officers pursued the boyfriend, but he got away.

On 8/3/05 when Officer Coleman went to SFGH to guard the boyfriend, he arrested him on the additional charges of felony threats, violation of a court order, lying to the police, and resisting arrest.

Trespassing, Resisting Arrest, Felony Warrant Arrest, Lying to the Police
1700 Block of McKinnon 1702 hrs.

Bayview bicycle beat Officer Dalton was on uniformed bike patrol when he saw a man sitting on the steps of a residence notorious for where drug users congregate. The man was sitting beneath a 25 MPC sign advising people not to loiter there; and permission was given to the police to arrest people on the steps. Officer Dalton asked the man for ID to which the man said that he did not have any. The man gave a name that came up clear during the computer check. Officer Dalton searched the man and found the man's wallet containing the man's true name. A computer check of the man's true name revealed that he had three outstanding felony narcotics warrants.

Felony Warrant Arrest, Possession of Open Container of Alcohol in Public

On the way back to Bayview Station, Officer Dalton saw a man with an open container of an alcoholic beverage in his possession. Officer Dalton stopped the man and conducted a computer check. The computer check revealed an outstanding felony arrest warrant for burglary out of Richmond, CA. Arrest Made.

Misdemeanor Domestic Violence Unit Block of Kiska 1800 hrs.

Bayview Officers Johnson and Ebr responded on a dispute between a boyfriend and girlfriend. The girlfriend said that her boyfriend and she began to argue after he accused her of cheating on him. When he refused to leave the house, she called the police. The boyfriend left prior to the police officers' arrival. The girlfriend was uncooperative and would not provide much information. She would not tell the officers how she was injured. The officers are not even sure if the boyfriend's name she provided is the true name. Officers attempted to obtain an Emergency Protective Order, but the judge issuing the order refused.

Misdemeanor Warrant Arrest Unit Block of Nichols Way

Bayview plainclothes Officers Stoumen, Benzinger, Banvik, and Sgt. Fabbri were on when they saw a man in front of his residence. The officers recognized this man as some who they have had many police contacts with before and is on probation. The officers searched the man but nothing was found. The man's brother was inside the house, but came out when requested by the police. The brother was also on probation and had an outstanding misdemeanor probation warrant from Santa Clara.

Drunk in Public 1000 Connecticut 1948 hrs.

Bayview plainclothes Officers Brandt, DeJesus, Fitzpatrick, and Wakayama were conducting an investigation when an intoxicated man walked up to Officer Brandt and began to speak with him. The man had all the classic symptoms of being intoxicated, so he was arrested.

Possession of Cocaine for Sale, Resisting Arrest Unit Block of
Dakota 2225 hrs.

Bayview plainclothes Officers Solares, Mustafich, DeJesus, and Fitzpatrick were walking on the unit block of Dakota when they heard arguing coming from a residence. Looking through an open window, they saw a man who they recognized from previous police contacts. On the table in front of him was a plate with suspected cocaine on it. Two other men were with this person. The officers alerted Sgt. Fabbri and quickly set up a perimeter around the residence. As Officer Solares made his way to the front door, the man they recognized opened the door. He was holding the plate containing the suspected cocaine in his hand. The man dropped the plate and tried to shut the door. Officer Solares grabbed the man, but he broke free and began running away. Officer Solares pursued the man and saw him

discard an object. When Officer Solares caught up to the man, he used a bar-arm take down to force the man to the face down on the ground. Once on the ground, the man continued to resist. The man would not put his hand behind his back. He kept it in front waistband area of his body. Officer Solares used a knee strike to the man's thigh to make him comply. The man still did not comply and continued resisting. Officer Fitzpatrick assisted also, but the man would not put his arms behind his back. When Officer Solares used the mastoid pain compliance technique, the man finally gave up.

The other officers went inside the house and discovered other narcotics and narcotics paraphernalia. A woman was discovered inside along with the two men. All were arrested.

Felony Warrant Arrest Selby/Evans 2355 hrs.

Bayview Officer Cullen Cahill, the night watch homeless coordinator, was on patrol when he saw a man stripping copper wire. Officer Cahill asked the man where he got the wire. The man said that he found it. When Officer Cahill asked for ID, the man said that he had a warrant. A record check revealed a felony warrant from Santa Clara.
