Murder Rate Down

Due to an increase in violence in our district this past spring, former Deputy Chief Greg Suhr assisted us by "loaning" several officers from other districts to the Bayview for the summer months. These officers work with our "Ceasefire" team, which focuses on gun violence and gang crimes. As a result of the work of these teams, as well as the work of all of our other Bayview officers, there have been no homicides in the Bayview since June 10. During this same period last summer, we had six homicides.

Housing Crime Down

Capt. Bruce just received the July crime stats for our four main public housing developments in the Bayview. There were 34 "Part One" crimes reported in the month of July in these developments (homicide, rape, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, larceny, pursesnatch, theft from a locked vehicle, and stolen vehicles). This compares to 51 crimes reported in July of 2004, a 33 percent reduction for 2005. The officers assigned to these developments have done a great job, and we're going to continue to focus on reducing crime in public housing, particularly violent crime.

Crime and Enforcement Update

Warrant Arrest 08/25/05 2pm 400 block Sommerset
Officer responded to a call from a citizen who stated that there was an individual in her back yard that did not belong there. The suspect had told the reportee that she was an insurance agent. Officers arrived and the witness did the right thing, watched where the suspect went and immediately notified the officers arriving. Other officers fanned out and the suspect was located hiding behind a wall. The suspect tried to play it off like she had the right to be where she was, but we now know different. She was looking to burglarize something. Remember, if something looks strange and feels strange, most of the time it is strange. She was arrested for criminal trespassing and found to be on parole. Maybe she was looking for her parole agent in the backyard, because she had a warrant for violating her parole. (050955728)

Warrant Arrest 08/25/05 8:30pm 3rd and Newcomb
Bayview officers are informed. We have a few officers that come in on their days off and work on this in their spare time, to keep the Bayview Officers informed as to those subjects wanted in the Bayview. Officers routinely check the warrant status of subjects they have arrested. The information is

shared with all the officers and a picture is posted on a wall. This allows the officers to make such arrests like this one. The officers saw two subjects that they knew had warrants. End of story. They were booked for the warrants. (050957047)

Poss of Marijuana 08/25/05 7am 3rd and Palou
Sgt. Moran acting on information received from Sgt. Fabbri located a suspect in the wee hours. The suspect matched the description except for the cornrows. Marijuana was found however the suspect claimed to be a caregiver and had a medicinal marijuana card. Evidence was retrieved and the case has been referred to the District Attorney's Office. The subject was released at the scene.

Poss of Marijuana 08/25/05 2pm Oakdale and Griffith
Officers observed an individual that they knew had a warrant. When he was stopped he had a passenger in his vehicle. The officers discovered enough marijuana to book the individual for possession for sale. The driver tried to say that the marijuana belonged to the passenger, but all indications led to him. He was booked for expired registration on the vehicle also. (050955740)

Assault 08/25/05 11:45am 700 block Toland
Officers responded to a commercial establishment regarding a fight. A dispute between a customer and employee occurred and the employee asked the customer to leave. The customer refused and yelled several threats to the employee. The suspects fled the scene before the officers arrived. (050954924)

Throwing substance at Veh. 08/25/05 9:20pm 3rd and Palou
Officers in our plain-clothes unit were driving on 3rd st when they observed two individuals throw rocks at a truck. The rocks broke a window. The officers went to the area of the suspects and attempted to arrest them. After all was said and done the officers transported three juveniles to the station and their parents responded. They were cited and released to the custody of their parents.

Our housing officers have been splitting time between the gym and the baseball diamond. Sometime when they weren't around the suspects entered the gym and vandalized it. They broke windows and walls.
