Crime and Enforcement Update

Felony Domestic Violence, Aggravated Assault with a Knife 300 Block of Bayview 0900 hrs.

Bayview Officer Catlett responded to the San Francisco General Hospital on a report of a man who had been stabbed. When get got there, he spoke with a man who said that he and his girlfriend had got into an argument earlier in the day. During the argument the girlfriend picked up a knife and stabbed him in the hand.

Inspector Lum of the Domestic Violence Unit responded to SFGH to conduct his investigation. After conferring with Officer Catlett and Sgt. Moran, they went to the man's residence to see if they could find his girlfriend. They found her and brought her to Bayview Station where she was booked. Officers obtained an emergency protective order for the man. An EPO is a court order commanding a person to move out, stay away, not assault, etc. a family member who lives with them.

Aggravated Assault with a Gun 1000 Block of Oakdale 1056 hrs.

Bayview Officers Rodatos, Fowlie, and numerous other officers responded on a report of a shooting victim. When they arrived they saw a man who had been shot several times in the torso. They immediately gave medical aid and summoned an ambulance. The victim could only provide very limited information on who shot him and the people in the area did not give much information to the police. When the officers were trying to get information and provide medical aid, a female bystander began to berate the police. Several times she interfered by crossing the yellow "police line" tape and yelling at the police. She repeatedly tried to incite the crowd against the police. At one point she even tried to climb into the

interviewed by the police. The officers interviewed Roommate #2 and ultimately arrested her.

Bayview Plainclothes Officers Kirchner, Ellis and Stoumen, and uniformed Officers Chiang and Cahill responded on a report of a man with a gun. Upon arrival they found a man matching the description given by Dispatch. This man was detained and the officers conducted an investigation. They spoke with a woman who said that the man was her boyfriend. She said that he threatened her with a gun and hit her. Officers found numerous guns inside the residence which they confiscated. Inspector Lum of the Domestic Violence Unit responded and took over the investigation. Officers obtained an emergency protective order for the victim.

Bayview Officers Dockery and Robinson were on uniformed patrol in a marked unit when they saw a man they which they knew. They conducted a computer check on this man and discovered that a felony burglary warrant was issued the day before. They then stopped and arrested the man.
