The officer told this person to remain back, a safe distance, and he could watch from there. This person did not obey the officer's verbal commands. This person walked right up to the officer and the officer used his hand to stop the advance. The officer told this person to walk back or down the street, but not to interfere with his investigation. This person refused. The officer put his arm out to stop the advance and the person pushed his hand away. The officer then was forced to arrest this person for interfering in his duties. The officer tried to handcuff this individual but he was resisting yet again. During the arrest the suspect kick another officer who was helping in the handcuffing. Now the other suspect started to become involved and the plain-clothes officers stopped his activity. Officers placed the first individual in the police vehicle and he damaged the window by kicking it. Now the second suspect felt he was going to jail without a fight so he resisted. Fours were reported stolen in the Bayview. We recovered five vehicles.

We are testing some new equipment that can scan license plates. It then compares them to the reported stolen plates in a database. The computer will alert the driver if it comes across a plate that has been listed as stolen. During the testing phase I noticed there are several cars in our district without front plates, a violation of the Vehicle code. Please check your vehicles and if you do not have a front plate on your vehicle, have it fixed.

This system works even if you are not in the car monitoring it. I was riding with an officer yesterday testing it. We exited the vehicle to get lunch. When we returned we notice that the system picked up a vehicle that was driving by and it recorded a license plate number that had been reported stolen. Of course I notified the officers in the district to be on the lookout for this plate, but it would have been nice to recover the vehicle and arrest the crook.
