Memorial Garden for Officer Isaac Espinoza

This Sunday, April 10, marks the one year anniversary of the death of Officer Isaac Espinoza. Officer Espinoza was shot and killed on Newhall Street while attempting to stop a local gang member who was armed with an AK47 assault rifle. At 4:00 p.m. on Sunday, officers assigned to Bayview Station will dedicate a garden to Isaac's memory behind Bayview Station. This garden would not have been possible without the generous efforts of Topher Delaney and her employees at SEAM (on Illinois Street). Members of the public are welcome to attend the ceremony.

Apprenticeship Exposition

The suspect having the advantage was able to escape. He won the battle. The night officer passes the information to the day watch. Officers were in the area attempting to locate the suspect to serve the protective order when the witnesses point toward the apartment in a whispering manner. They informed the officers that the suspect was in the apartment. The suspect again went out the back window, down the fire escape. A perimeter was set up, the information was deciphered, and an arrest plan was implemented. The officers broke down the door to another apartment the suspect was using to hide in. He was arrested with out further resistance. He was served with the EPO and booked at County jail. (050384230)

Officers, driving in the area, saw a subject they knew had a felony warrant. After contacting the suspect, they discovered he was in possession of, several baggies of suspected cocaine. He was booked on the warrant and the possession for sale charges. (050384230)

He was making remarks that there was going to be another cop killing like the Espinoza murder. He said that his kids would be killing our kids. I respect the officers for their professionalism and restraint, knowing that this was not the time to act on those threats. They prepared an incident report documenting the threats. Other officers the next day searched, and found the suspect. He was arrested and booked at county jail with to resistance. (050380498)

Domestic violence 04/07/05 9pm 1800 blk 26th St.
Officers responded to an address regarding a violation of a protective order. The victim stated that she wanted to arrest the suspect because he was ordered not to contact her. Officer detained him on her front porch. The victim stated that he had choked her and stuffed a sock in her mouth. He threatened to "disable her" her if she tried to leave. The suspect was booked for several felonies and was transported to the hall of justice for booking. (050385937)
