

BAYVIEW COMMUNITY UPDATE April 20, 2005

From Supervisor Maxwell's Office

The following legislation was introduced on April 12 and 19 at the Board of Supervisors:

- (1) Hearing on the trafficking and use of illegal guns in San Francisco.
- (2) Resolution to establish mental health services for San Franciscans exposed to gun and gang violence and for youth in the juvenile justice system as policy priorities in the city's application for Prop 63 mental health funds. Research has shown that over a third of urban youths exposed to community violence have developed post-traumatic stress disorder. In addition, the National Mental Health Association reports that the prevalence of mental health disorders among youth in the juvenile justice system is as high as 60 percent. Other research has found that at least one in every five youths in juvenile justice facilities in the United States has a serious mental health disorder.
- (3) Hearing before the Land Use Committee to review the city's policy on meeting the housing needs of all San Franciscans

Crime and Enforcement Update

Threats, San Bruno and Silver, April 18, 3:25 p.m.

A 15 year old female reported to Bayview officers that she was walking to the bus stop when she noticed a group of women following her and was then approached by one of the women. The victim was then threatened by the woman because the victim had recently spoken with a male who once had a relationship with the woman. The suspect was named by the victim and lives in the Bayview (050 432 679).

Warrant Arrest, 6600 3rd Street, April 19, 6:30 a.m.

A woman walked into Bayview Station and told officers that she had received a phone call from a woman who told her that she had found some of her personal possessions and wanted a "reward" to return them to her. The woman's car had been stolen days earlier, and the personal items had been taken from her car. The officers accompanied the victim to the "meeting point," which was the Franciscan Motel on 3rd Street. Once the female who had phoned the victim saw the police, she returned the property to the victim gladly without asking for a reward. The woman was accompanied by three other individuals, one of whom had an arrest warrant. The man with the warrant, living on the 1000 block of Palou, was booked for a warrant charging him with violation of parole (050 432 500).

Warrant Arrest, 4 Nichols, April 19, 8:53 a.m.

Bayview Officers Lamma and Lew were on patrol when they stopped a man for traffic violations and determined that his driver's license had been suspended. The man initially provided a fictitious name to the officers and was arrested for both the suspended license and for falsely identifying himself to the officers (050 432 922).

Bomb Threat, 1195 Hudson, April 19, 9:15 a.m.

Bayview Officer Johnson spoke with the principal at Gloria R. Davis School who told her that a telephone bomb threat had been received at the school. The suspect sounded like a teen-age boy (050 433 150).

Stay Away Order Violation, 1827 25th Street, April 19, 11:00 a.m.
Bayview Officers Reynoso, Sanders, Rodatos and Bodisco responded on the report of a restraining order violation and spoke with the female caller who told them that her ex-husband had been knocking on her door and harassing her in violation of a stay away order. The officers located the ex-husband and booked him for violation of a court order (050 433 906).

Possession Cocaine, Keith and Thomas, April 19, 12:26 p.m.
Bayview Officers Scott and Benzinger, along with Sgt. Fabbri, were on patrol when they saw a known drug dealer being handed currency from a known crack addict. The officers stopped the dealer and found him to be in possession of currency and crack cocaine. The man, living on the 1500 block of Underwood, was booked for possession of crack cocaine and drug loitering (050 433 962).

Warrant Arrest, 23rd and Arkansas, April 19, 12:47 a.m.
Bayview Officers Rodatos, Sanders, Bodisco and Reynoso were on patrol when they stopped a vehicle for traffic violations and determined that the driver's license was suspended, and also, that he had an outstanding arrest warrant. The driver, living on Herman Street, was booked for the warrant and the traffic offenses (050 434 164).

Aided Case, 1500 block of Oakdale, April 19, 6:15 p.m.
Bayview Officers Calaunan and Escobar responded on the report of a woman hanging out of a third story window and screaming. The caller told officers that the woman was her cousin and was threatening to jump. The officers approached the woman and grabbed her as she attempted to leap from the window. The woman struggled violently with the officers, kicking them and screaming as they tried to escort her from the home. The woman then bit one of the officers and was eventually turned over to ambulance personnel, who transported her to SFGH. During transportation, the woman broke free of her restraints twice and the officers had to accompany the ambulance personnel to the hospital (050 435 504).

Identity Theft and Fraud, Various Locations, April 19, 6:22 p.m.
A woman came into Bayview Station and reported that she had been receiving bills from various companies for purchases she never made from credit accounts she never opened. The companies included Sam's Club, Mastercard, Radio Shack, Home Depot and Circuit City, and the purchases totaled more than \$13,000.00. The victim notified all of the companies and the case is being investigated by our Fraud Detail (050 435 366).

Possession of Firearm, 19 Northridge, April 19, 8:05 p.m.
Members of our Gang Task Force were on patrol at Harbor and Northridge when they saw a man walking down the street wearing a ski mask. Knowing that there were no slopes nearby, the officers began to approach the man and then saw him remove an object from his jacket and drop it to the ground. The officers detained the man and retrieved the object, which was a fully loaded handgun. The man, living on the first block of Northridge, was booked for possession of a loaded and concealed handgun (050 435 930).

Illegal Lodging, Hubble and 16th, April 19, 10:45 p.m.
Bayview Officer Buelow was on patrol when he found a woman living in a

Winnebago motorhome on a public street. The woman was cited for illegal lodging (050 436 295).

Shooting, 821 Ingerson, April 20, 1:52 a.m.

Numerous Bayview officers responded on the report of a shooting and spoke with the female caller, who was living in a trailer and told the officers that she was awakened by the sound of gunshots and then realized that she had been shot. The officers found bullet fragments inside the trailer and bullet holes on the exterior of the trailer. The victim received only bruising from what appeared to be a bullet ricochet (050 436 621).
