Crime and Enforcement Update

Domestic Violence, 16 Dedman Court, April 11, 9:00 a.m.

Bayview Officers Berge and Lew were dispatched on a domestic violence call and spoke with the female caller who stated that her baby's father had just knocked her to the ground and choked her following a dispute regarding visitation of the child. The officers tracked down the father at his place of employment and arrested him for domestic violence (050 397 948).

Marijuana Arrest, 400 Mansell, April 11, 3:20 p.m.

Bayview Officer Miller met with a teacher at Burton High School who had seen a student smoking and then discarding marijuana. The student, 15 years of age and living on the 1500 block of Revere, was cited for possession of marijuana (050 400 870).

Child Abuse, 100 block Cameron, April 12, 8:00 a.m.

Bayview Officer Lamma responded on a call of a domestic dispute and spoke with the male caller who stated that his estranged wife was abusing their son. The 8 year old son was present and was later interviewed by officers, telling them that his mother beats him with a belt. CPS (Child Protective Services) was notified and will be investigating the case. The child was removed from the home and taken to school, where CPS workers were going to meet him (050 402 741).

Vandalism, 1720 25th Street, April 12, 8:24 a.m.

Bayview Officer Rodatos responded on a report that a person armed with a knife was in front of the premises. The officer found a couple arguing and attempted to intervene and mediate. The male present then turned his anger toward the officer and cursed him out, yelling, "Blank you, blank you, I don't give a blank, blank the police." He actually used a word other than blank. The man started to physically fight with the officer and had to be restrained. The woman then admitted to the officer that she had just slashed her boyfriend's tires because he had cheated on her. The woman was cited for vandalism, the man was cited for resisting an officer, both suspects were released, and the knife was confiscated (050 402 848).

Possession Stolen Checks, 4947 3rd Street, April 12, 10:45 a.m.

Bayview Officers Calaunan and Escobar responded on a call that two persons were attempting to cash stolen checks. The bank employee told officers that two females had come into the bank and presented two checks to be cashed. Both checks were from a Chinese restaurant on Mission Street, and when the bank employee phoned the company, she learned that the checks had been stolen yesterday in a robbery. Both suspects fled from the bank, but left their California ID cards behind. The first ID comes back to a woman

living on Middlepoint Road, and the second to a woman living on Reardon Road. The case will be handled by our Fraud Detail (050 405 369).

Shooting, 60 Osceola, April 12, 4:55 p.m.

Bayview Officers Kenney and Archini responded on the report of a shooting and met with the victim who stated that he had been standing on the sidewalk on LaSalle near the rear stairs at 60 Osceola when a white, four door compact vehicle (possible Toyota), drove past him and the driver shot him once with a handgun. The driver is described as a black male, 19-24, armed with a black semi-auto handgun. The passenger was a black male, 18 years of age (050 405 961).

Exhibiting Weapon, 1301 Revere, April 12, 5:30 p.m.

Bayview Officers Escobar and Calaunan responded on a report of the brandishing of a toy gun. The officers spoke with employees from the "Nailah Group Home" who told them that a resident had displayed a handgun to them and stated, "I got the heat now, if any (n word) wanna see me." The officers found an air gun hidden in the backyard of the home and the juvenile admitted that he had brandished this gun. The juvenile, 15 years of age and living on the 1300 block of Revere, was booked for brandishing an imitation firearm (050 406 113).

Stay Away Order Violation, 336 Lathrop, April 12, 5:45 p.m.

Bayview Officers Kenney and Archini responded on a report that a man was installing surveillance cameras on city trees adjacent to his home in violation of a court order. The man retreated inside his home upon the arrival of the officers. This is an ongoing situation and the City Attorney's office is pursuing a contempt of court order against this man for violating a prior court order (050 405 795).

Robbery, 770 Kirkwood, April 12, 5:51 p.m.

Bayview Officer Bodisco responded to Kiska and Dormitory on a robbery call and spoke with the victim's mother who stated that a group of boys had just taken her son's cell phone from him by force. The officer was provided with the first names of two of the suspects, but the 15 year old victim refused to cooperate with the investigation. The cell phone was eventually returned to the victim, and one of the named suspects was detained and identified by the officers (050 405 717).

Shooting, 1124 Palou, April 12, 9:00 p.m.

Bayview Officers Cahill and Wise responded on a report of a shooting and spoke with a victim who told them he had been inside his home when two suspects forced their way into his residence and began to struggle with him. The victim stated that one of the suspects then shot him. The evidence at the scene was not consistent with the victim's story and when the assigned Inspector confronted him with this fact, the victim admitted that he had accidentally shot himself with a shotgun (050 406 317).

Discharging a Firearm, Innes and Hunter's Point, April 12, 10:20 p.m.

Bayview Officer Dangerfield responded on a shots fired call and spoke with a witness who stated that a car had just driven past the area and someone inside the car had fired a gun from the car. Several shell casings were found in the area. The car is described as an older Ford, red and white in color, possibly a Veteran's Cab Company car (050 406 630).
