SFPD Youth Fishing Program

The San Francisco Youth Fishing Program will begin its 38th year of taking local kids fishing. The program will run from June 20th through August 19th and fish for salmon. The program is open to established community groups that serve San Francisco Youth.

The boat will leave every Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday from Fisherman's Wharf at 5:30AM. The boat can accommodate fourteen kids and one supervisor. The youth participants must be over 12 years old and under 18 years old. Anyone over the age of 16 must possess a Fishing License. A one-day license can be purchased on board. Crimes and Law Enforcement

THE BELOW LISTED INCIDENTS WERE SUBMITTED BY INDIVIDUALS OF BAYVIEW STATION:

Tuesday, May 23, 2006, 10:45 PM, 1400 block of Phelps, Robbery (case # 060548567): The victim was on his way to work on the 1400 block of Phelps when the two suspects approached him and instantly punched him in the head. The suspects then demanded money from the victim, but the victim was too stunned to answer. Instead, the suspects took two bags from the victim and drove off in a cream colored Dodge Charger.

The suspects are described as African American males, late teens or early twenties, both approximately 5'8" tall.

Tuesday, May 23, 2006, 2:00 PM, Martin Luther King Middle School, Weapon on School Grounds (case # 060546674): Officers Miller and Valenzuela responded to the school on a report that a student had brought a pellet gun to school. A teacher had seen the student with the gun during physical education class and had seized the weapon. The student said that he had bought the weapon on the 2900 block of San Bruno and that he would go and get another one from the same store as soon as he was released. The student was booked on felony weapons charges at YGC.

Again, if you see any store selling pellet or BB guns in San Francisco, please let the police know. Many, if not all, of these guns can be mistaken for a regular gun and if pointed at an officer or another person with a gun could have deadly consequences. Further, it is against the law to sell or possess an air weapon in San Francisco. The merchant was also made aware of this law.

Tuesday, May 23, 2006, 3:00 PM, Martin Luther King Middle School, Weapon on School Grounds (case # 060549747): Officers Miller and Valenzuela had to return to MLK Middle school an hour later for another student who had a plastic BB gun. The gun had already been seized and the student had been sent home on a 5 day suspension, pending an expulsion hearing. The officers seized the BB gun and booked it at Bayview Station.

Wednesday, May 24, 2006, 9:46 AM, 20th Century Academy Elementary School, Weapon on School Grounds (case # 060550885): The next day Officer Barcojo responded to the 20th Century Elementary School on a report of BB guns. He met with the principal who told them that they had confiscated 3 BB guns as well as a knife from students the previous day. Because they wanted to handle the matter internally, they did not give the students names to

Officer Barcojo, but they needed to inform the police for the expulsion hearings.

Thursday, May 25, 2006, 1:00 PM, 20th and 3rd, Mental Health Detention (case # 060554730): Officers Barcojo and Kraus were sent to the 900 block of Illinois on a report of a man wanting to turn himself in for murder. The officers were told that the man had come into an office and told the workers there that he wanted to turn himself into the police because he had killed someone. Before they could arrive, another call came in at 3rd and 18th Streets on a report of an assault in progress. The officers responded first to 3rd and 18th, where they were met with the assault victim's friend who told them that a man had punched her friend several times for absolutely no reason. They were just walking down the street when the man started punching her friend. She also told the officers that the victim was following the suspect whose description was curiously similar to that of the man who walked into the office a block away. The friend called the victim who told her that the suspect was now at 1800 3rd St. The officers responded there with the friend in tow.

When the officers went into 1800 3rd Street, the suspect walked up to them and said, "Hello Officer, I want to turn myself in. I killed someone." When the suspect was told that they were there for a different reason, the suspect said, "Oh, that Chinese guy. I hit that Chinese guy, but I am not sorry."

In a later interview with the officers, the suspect admitted to killing rap musician Tupak Shakur by stabbing him and cutting his throat. He also admitted to having sexual relations with his relatives and told the officers that he was in love with them. He also thrown someone that he could not remember off the Golden Gate Bridge and that he had killed someone else today that he could not remember. Based upon the statements that he was making the officers detained him for a psychiatric evaluation.

Thursday, May 25, 2006, 8:15 PM, 23rd and Wisconsin, Assault on an officer/resisting arrest (case # 060556510): Officers Gala, Kieve and Obot were patrolling Potrero Hill when they noticed that a man was walking in the traffic lane, in danger of being hit by a car. Traffic had been passing around the man, but as it was getting dark, and on coming traffic would not be able to see him in the road. The officers stopped to tell the man to move to the sidewalk, but the man responded with a stream of profanity and continued to walk in the traffic lane. Several requests and then commands to move to the sidewalk were met with more profanity, the officers stopped and approached the man. Officer Gala stood in front of the man and told him to stop, but the man pushed Officer Gala's hand aside and then punched the officer with his right fist. The man then grabbed Officer Gala's legs and hoisted him into the air, slamming him down the curb on his lower back. It should be noted that the suspect was 6' tall

and weighed 275 pounds, over 100 pounds more than the officer. The three officers then struggled with the suspect, attempting to control him. Other officers, particularly Officer Wolf of Mission Station arrived to aid the officers who were then able to control the suspect.

After the officers had placed the suspect in handcuffs, a 270 pound woman tried to interfere with the arrest. Officer Wolf told her to stay back, but she tried to grab at the now cuffed suspect. Because she would not stay back and continued to interfere with the arrest, Officer Wolf attempted to arrest her and place her in handcuffs. The woman started screaming profanities and continued to resist arrest. Officer Primiano arrived on scene and the two officers were finally able to control the woman. As the woman was being walked to a patrol car, she started twisting and trying to break free. Officer Keeve assisted getting her into the car.

The man was booked on battery and assault charges on the officers at county jail. The woman was cited for obstruction and interfering with an officer's duties and released from Bayview Station.

Friday, May 26, 2006, 11:40 AM, Brussels and Dwight, Robbery (case # 060559657): The victim was walking down the street when the suspect approached him from the back and grabbed his shirt. The suspect then pulled the victim's wallet from his back pocket and jumped into a waiting car. The suspect is an African American male, late teens or early 20's, 5'8" and 130 pounds.

Friday, May 26, 2006, 12:49 PM, Brandishing and threats, Westpoint and Middlepoint (case # 060558613): The victim and the suspect were in an argument, when the suspect pulled a black 9mm handgun from his car and pointed it at the victim and his family. The suspect then cocked the gun and told them to "chill." The suspect then left the area. He is described as an African American male, late teens or early 20's, 6'1" and 175 pounds. His car is a newer black Monte Carlo with tinted windows and a Raider's sticker on the back window.

Friday, May 26, 2006, McKinnon and Newhall, Warrant arrest/firearm possession (case # 060559122): Plain clothes officers were on patrol when they saw a man who was wanted on a narcotics violation warrant. The man is also a known member of a Bayview gang. The officers jumped out of their car and detained the man without incident. During an arrest search, the officers found a loaded firearm in his waistband as well as narcotics in his pants pockets. The suspect was also currently on felony probation, thus he was booked on the warrant, the weapons and new narcotics charges as well as having his probation revoked at Bayview Station.

Friday, May 26, 2006, 5:45 PM, Palou and Barneveld, Recovered Auto (case # 060559699): Officers Erb and Johnson were on patrol when they noticed what

appeared to be two juveniles in a parked car, one sitting in the others lap. A DMV check revealed that the car was reported stolen out of Santa Rosa. The two juveniles were detained without incident. The male juvenile that was sitting in the driver seat gave a name of Robert Green, but the officers could find no record of a "Robert Green" with the birthdate that the juvenile had given. Officers released the female juvenile that was sitting in "Green's" lap, but transported him to Bayview Station. At Bayview Station the officers were able to contact a relative who told them the suspect's actual name. A warrant check revealed that he had a probation violation warrant out of Alameda County. He was booked on the stolen car and the warrant at YGC.

Friday, May 26, 2006, 5:47 PM, Palou and Quint, Recovered Auto (case # 060559730): Officers Olson and Singleton (recently returned from two years of duty in Iraq) were on patrol when they saw what appeared to be a very young man driving a Chrysler LaBaron. A DMV check revealed that the Chrysler was reported stolen. The officers stopped the car and took the driver into custody. They also found 3 other juveniles inside the car, riding as passengers. The parents of the passengers arrived on scene and took custody of them. The driver was transported to Bayview Station where Officer Olson determined that the driver had a current case pending for stealing another vehicle and driving without a license.

Saturday, May 27, 2006, 2:47 AM, Shafter and Lane, Robbery with pen (case # 060561149): The victim was parking his car after a late night out when two suspects approached him in his car and asked him if he wanted to buy drugs. When the victim refused, one of the suspects put a pen to the victim's neck and stole the victim's cell phone. The suspects are only described as African American males, 5'8" to 5'10" tall.

Saturday, May 27, 2006, 1:25 PM, railroad tracks on the 100 block of Paul Ave, Death by Train (case # 060562460): Bayview and Amtrack officers responded to the 100 block of Paul on a report of a man jumping in front of a train. When they arrived, they found the remains of the man in the middle of the tracks.

Saturday, May 27, 2006, 4:25 PM, 300 block of Sommerset, Purse snatch (case # 060562824): The victim was standing in front of her house, when the suspects drove up to her in a small 4 door red car. The passenger jumped out and approached the victim. The passenger then asked the victim if she had the time. As she was answering, the passenger pulled on the victim's purse, pulling the victim to the ground. The passenger then jumped back in the car and the driver drove off.

The suspects were both African American males in their late teens or early 20's. The passenger was approximately 6' tall and 170 pounds. He was wearing a grey sweatshirt and a grey knit cap.

Sunday, May 28, 2006, 1:46 PM, Jennings and Revere - Cocaine for Sales - CS# 060 565 395 - Plainclothes officers observed a group of males loitering in the area and appeared to be engaging in narcotics transactions. They observed one male in particular going back and forth between the group and a paper bag that was left down the street and then handing something off to people that would come up to him. The male then left the area and picked up the bag that is when plainclothes officers moved in. The male threw the bag down and made a brief attempt to escape capture before he was apprehended. In the bag were numerous pieces of cocaine. The man, currently on probation, who lives in the Bayview District was booked for possession of crack cocaine for sale.

Sunday, May 28, 2006, 6:34PM, 1800 Block of 25th Street - Attempted Homicide of a Police Officer with a Firearm - CS# 060 566 456 - A call was to the police that a group of people were fighting in the area of 25th and Connecticut Streets. The caller stated that someone in the crowd claimed to have a gun. Plainclothes Officers Ellis and Kirchner were first on scene and were walking in the area. They spotted the group of people and walked towards them. The group saw the officers and acknowledged the officer's presence. One male grabbed his waistband and took a few steps away from the approaching Officers.

The suspect began to walk away. Based on the information that the officers received and the actions of this person, it was reasonable to believe that this person had a gun. Officer Ellis ordered the male to stop. The male quickened his pace. Officer Ellis ran towards the male. The male now began to run. Officer Kirchner joined the chase.

The male slowed his pace and turned towards Officer Ellis and fired one shot towards him. Officer Ellis crouched down. Officer Ellis attempted to return fire but he saw an innocent bystander in the field of fire and did not shoot, fearing he might strike her.

The suspect continued to run with the Officers following. The suspect ran around the corner of a building. When Officer Ellis made the corner, a citizen told him that the suspect threw the gun in the grass. Officer Kirchner found the gun. The suspect was lost in the area of Dakota and 25th Streets.

A perimeter was established with the units that arrived on scene in an attempt to apprehend the suspect. Unfortunately he eluded capture. The gun was recovered. It was found to be a .38 caliber Colt with the serial number scratched off. The gun as well as a hat the suspect was wearing is being analyzed for forensic evidence.

Officers Ellis and Kirchner were not injured in the incident.

The suspect is described as a black male between 18-25 years old approximately 5'9" and 160 lbs. His hair was medium length twists and was wearing a black hooded sweatshirt and a white t-shirt.

Sunday, May 28, 2006, 8:45PM, Unit block of Northridge Road - Assault with a BB gun - CS# 060 566 644 - A twelve year old girl was sitting outside eating some candy when another twelve year old boy, whom she considers a friend, approached her and asked her for some candy. When she said no he took out a BB gun and shot her in the foot and then ran away. The young girl was treated and released on scene.

Sunday, May 28, 2006, 9:20 PM, 600 Block of Indiana Street - Drunk in Public, Battery on a Police Officer - CS# 060 566 707 - A man from Oakland was arrested after an early evening of revelry at an area club. Police were notified that this individual was picking fights at a club and was ejected. When police arrived on scene the male was still in the area. As the officers approached the male, he stated, "F^%\$ the police, get on with yourselves." A struggle ensued to bring the male into to custody. In the process, the male stated, "I lift weights boy, that don't mean nothin' to me." In attempt to free himself, the male punched one officer in the leg.

The officers brought the male into custody after he was administered pepper spray. The male was booked for assaulting an officer and drunk in public. The officer was not injured in the incident.
