Tuesday, April 25, 2006, 2:20 AM, Loomis & Oakdale, Driving under the influence (Case # 060438322): While on patrol Sgt. Creed saw a car parked in the middle of Loomis with the engine running and its lights on. When he went to investigate, he found the driver passed out behind the wheel and a strong odor of alcohol in the vehicle. Officers Maguire and Brown responded to the scene where Office Maguire woke the driver up and attempted to administer the standard field sobriety tests to the driver. Unfortunately, the driver was unable to perform them satisfactorily and he was arrested for driving under the influence.

Tuesday, April 25, 2006, 5:45 PM, 1000 block of Hollister, Vandalism and driving with a suspended license (Case # 060441717): The victim and several witnesses told responding officers that they saw two male suspects jumping up and down on the top of a car, smashing the windows at the same time. One witness said that the suspects yelled at him, "Go ahead and call the police. We don't care. We want our money for the car." While patrolling the area, Officers Chiang and Primiano spotted the suspects' vehicle driving on Hollister. The occupants were members of a family well know to Bayview Station officers. The witnesses responded to the scene and identified the occupants as the suspects that they saw jumping on the car. A DMV check revealed that the driver was also driving with two suspensions on his license. Since the driver was a juvenile, he was booked at YGC for felony vandalism and driving with a suspended license; the passenger was booked for felony vandalism at Bayview Station.

Wednesday, April 26, 2006, 4:14 AM, Missouri & Cesar Chavez, Homicide by Firearm (Case # 060442981): Officers responded to Missouri and Cesar Chavez on a report of a black SUV driving on its rims. When they arrived they found that the vehicle not only had a flat left tire that was almost completely sheared off the rim, but also it had bullet holes in the windshield and the driver's door. The driver of the vehicle told officers that someone had shot at them at 6th and Natoma. The officers informed dispatch and Southern officers responded to that area and found several expended bullet casings on the ground. The passenger was slumped forward in the vehicle, unconscious, shot through the face. Medics responded to the scene, but were unable to save the passenger.

The suspect is a Filipino male approximately 16 to 18 years old, 5'7", 140 pounds with a shaved head. He goes by the name "Bulung" which means Whisper. If you have any information, contact Inspectors Toomey or Wynkoop at the Homicide Detail (553-1145)

Wednesday, April 26, 2006, 11:40 PM, 1700 block of LaSalle, Robbery by Firearm (Case # 060446977): The victim was entering his home when the suspect came behind him and pulled out a gun. The suspect then demanded

money. Fearing for his life, the victim gave the suspect money and the suspect ran away. The suspect is described as a teenage Latin male, 6'1" and 155 pounds. He was last seen wearing all black clothing and carrying a silver revolver.

Thursday, April 27, 2006, 8:15 PM, Dog bite (Case # 060453342): An elderly resident of Potrero Hill was out walking when he was bitten in the leg by a loose pit bull. The pit bull belongs to the homeless owner of a bus that is often parked on Indiana Street near Esprit park and has been the subject of past dangerous dog hearings by Animal Care and Control (ACC). Officer Lavin, Bayview Station Homeless Coordinator, went the next day and spoke with the pit bull's owner. When she arrived, the dog was still unsecured and roaming in the street. Officer Lavin had ACC respond to the scene and seize the dog. The owner was cited for unprovoked dog bite.

Friday, April 28, 2006, 12:00, 345 Williams, Report of Prostitutes at FoodCo: Officers DiCroce and Ernst responded to FoodsCo on a report of three prostitutes refusing to leave. Since FoodsCo is not the typical place for prostitution, this was an unusual report. When they arrived, they saw three women, dressed casually, but not provocatively in any way, standing in the parking lot. The women were attempting to obtain signatures for ballot initiatives. While they were obviously not prostitutes, the officers did not see any other group of three women in the area. The officers went into the store and met with the store manager. The manager told them that the company now has a policy that prohibits anyone from SOLICITING (i.e. selling) on FoodsCo property. Apparently he had called dispatch and advised them that there were three women soliciting on their property who refused to leave. Dispatch had interpreted this as soliciting for prostitution. The women were advised and after a good laugh left without incident.

Friday, April 28, 2006, 1:30 PM, 3000 San Bruno, Passing stolen checks (Case # 060453693): Officer Dalton responded to 3000 San Bruno on a report of a woman attempting to pass a stolen check. When Officer Dalton arrived, the woman was still in the store attempting to cash the check. During Officer Dalton's investigation, he obtained permission to look into the suspect's purse. He noted that there was a note inside the purse that had the personal information for the name that was on the check, but that other items in the purse had a different name. As Officer Dalton was investigating the purse, the suspect began to suspect that perhaps all was not well and she suddenly ran out of the store. Officer Dalton gave chase to the woman female suspect. Officer Dalton and was able to catch up to her. After the woman was treated for asthma at SFGH, she was booked on fraud, forgery and burglary charges at County Jail.

Friday, April 28, 2006, 7:24 PM, 135 Middle Point Road, Shooting (Case # 060455003): Officers were in the area on a medically related call when they

heard a single gun shot. They noticed that a group of residents had gathered in front of 135 Middle Point. Witnesses in the area said that that the shooter was in a 1970's type maroon Buick with a white top. Officers found the victim lying on the ground, shot through his torso and arm. Since SFFD paramedics were already on scene from the previous call, they immediately started attending to the victim. The victim was transported to SFGH where emergency surgery was performed.

Friday, April 28, 2006, 8:20 PM, 1700 block of McKinnon, Burglary in progress (Case # 060455257): Officers were sent to the 1700 block of McKinnon on a report of a burglary in progress. When they arrived, they met with the owner of the property who said that he saw lights on inside his house which should have been unoccupied. Officers Solares and Alcaraz went into the back yard and saw the suspect leaving the house with his arms full of clothing. The officers were able to detain the suspect without further incident. During an arrest search, the officers found a necklace in the suspect's pants pocket which the home owner identified as belonging to his daughter. The juvenile suspect was booked at YGC on burglary and possession of stolen property charges.

Friday, April 28, 2006, 10:32 PM, 2890 3rd St, Robbery with a knife (Case # 060455605): The victim was working the counter at the gas station at 2890 3rd Street. In the evening, the store inside the station is locked; the customers do not have access to the cashier except through a pay window. Unfortunately on this date, the cashier had allowed a regular customer to enter the store. As the cashier was letting the regular customer out, the three suspects entered as the customer left. One of the suspects then held a 5" knife to the cashier's stomach and demanded the cash in the cash register. The second suspect grabbed the cash in the cash register and then all three suspects fled. The suspects are described as African American males in their late teens, all 6' tall with thin builds. All suspects were wearing black clothing.

Saturday, April 29, 2006, 8:10 AM - Attempted Robbery - Jennings and Revere - CS# 060 456 653 - An area resident was riding a bicycle to a relatives house in the district. Two suspects, also riding bicycles caught up to the man and yelled, "Give me your wallet!" The man pedaled faster as the suspects pursued and punched at the man. The man was able to pedal to his uncle's house and call 911. It should be noted that man was robbed in the same area just two months ago.

The first suspect is a black male between 25-35 years old, 5'09" and 165 pounds. He was wearing a Muni Bus Driver Jacket, and riding a red mountain bike. The second suspect was a black male 5'10" and 170 pounds with 'twists' in his hair; age unknown. He was wearing a black jacket and riding a blue mountain bike.

Saturday, April 29, 2006, 9:30 PM - Arson, Domestic Violence - 1600 lock of Palou - CS# 060 458 853 - Bayview officers responded to the scene of a domestic disturbance. The man told the officers that he was having a verbal disagreement with his girlfriend of five months. The girlfriend left the house and returned approximately twenty minutes later.

The woman poured a liquid from a soda bottle onto the front steps of the house. The man thought it was just soda. Turns out that it was gasoline. The woman lit the steps on fire and went inside and poured the gasoline on the carpet of the living room. The man grabbed the bottle of gasoline out of her hand and ran to the kitchen to get some water. He was able to extinguish the flames and it appeared that there was no damage from the fire.

The woman fled the scene prior to the arrival of the Fire Department and Police. The woman was apprehended on April 30th at 2:00 AM when she returned to house and began to make noise and dance in the street. She was extremely intoxicated.

Sunday, April 30, 2006, 3:31 AM - Carjacking - Double Rock Housing Projects - CS# 060 459 798 - An East Bay man and his cousin were victims of a carjacking this early morning. He and his cousin met a few young ladies on Broadway and offered to give them a ride home.

When they arrived in the Double Rock Housing complex they parked the car and got out and began to talk. Five suspects approached them and demanded their money and car. The driver was certain that two of the suspects had guns. He gave them his cell phone. Some of the suspects began to punch and kick the cousin, knocking him down. The suspects grabbed the cousin's money and cell phone from his pockets.

The suspects grabbed the keys out of the car's ignition. The driver ran away and flagged down Bayview Officers Whitfield and Norris, who were on patrol in the area. They returned to the scene and found the car and the cousin. The women were also gone and were not injured in this assault.

Sunday, April 30, 2006, 6:48PM - Discharging a Firearm - Lane Street and McKinnon Avenue - CS# 060 461 624 - Numerous Bayview Units responded to this corner on a report of gunfire. Officers located several casings on the sidewalk but could not locate any victims or suspects. A break in the case occurred when the roommate of the shooter called the police and told them who did the shooting. Police returned and found the shooter, the gun and several rounds of ammunition in his bedroom. He was intoxicated and declared, "I found the gun at the Super Save Market and shot it! I did it! I'll tell you everything!" He added that he hung out of his bedroom window and fired the gun.

The roommate heard the shooting and went into the room and confronted the shooter. The roommate told him that he would have to notify the authorities.

Monday, May 1, 2006, 1:23 AM and 7:35 PM - Traffic Violation and Parole Warrant - CS# 060 462 343 and CS# 060 465 444 -- In two separate incidents two parolees at large were returned to the Department of Corrections.

The first man, from San Francisco, was spotted driving without a seatbelt by Officers Wise and Singh in the area of Ingalls Street and Revere Avenue.

The second man, from South San Francisco, was seen doing donuts in the intersection of LaSalle Avenue and Newhall Street by our plainclothes team.

In addition to being fugitives, both men also were driving on a suspended driver's license and failed to have insurance.

Monday, May 1, 2006, 11:00 PM - Robbery, Assault with a shotgun - San Bruno Avenue - CS# 060 465 983 - Bayview and Ingleside Station units flooded the area of San Bruno Avenue between Wayland and Bacon Streets on a report of a robbery and then a subsequent shooting.

The first victim advised that she was walking on San Bruno Avenue near Wayland Street when she saw a masked man armed with a shotgun. The man attempted to conceal the gun by hunching over. The suspect then demanded the woman's money. The woman believed that the shotgun was a toy and refused. A second masked suspect appeared out of nowhere and made the demand again. Both men searched the woman and removed money and a lottery ticket from her. The suspects ran north on San Bruno Avenue.

The woman screamed for help but no one came to her aid. A few moments later she heard a gunshot from the area of San Bruno Avenue and Bacon Streets approximately two blocks from her. It was learned that a man was shot in the abdomen. The suspects then began to run south on San Bruno Avenue past the woman. This time their masks were off.

The man that was shot was unable to give a statement and transported to SFGH. It was unclear if robbery was a motive because the man had all of his personal property with him. One of the businesses has a video camera that may have captured the suspects on film.

The suspect with the shotgun is believed to be a Hispanic male approximately 5'03 and a heavy build. The second suspect is an unknown race 5'07", thin build.
