THE BELOW LISTED INCIDENTS WERE SUBMITTED BY INDIVIDUALS OF BAYVIEW STATION:

Sunday, June 18, 2006, 9:00 AM - Stay Away Order/Probation Violation - 1900 Block Of Oakdale - CS# 060 645 975 - Officers Kwan and Cowhig responded to a house located on the 1900 block of Oakdale Avenue on a report of an argument between a father and son. The son told the officers that he has a stay away order from the home and that he is on probation. Further, he requested that he be arrested. The man, per his request, was booked for the offenses.

Monday, June 19, 2006, 10:30 AM - Threat with Gun, Domestic Violence - 1000 block of Palou - CS# 060 649 444 - A woman notified police that she was threatened with a gun by her boyfriend of two years. The incident occurred while she was at her home on the 1000 block of Palou Avenue. She said that she was leaving the unit with her son and she told the suspect that he would have to leave. The suspects became agitated and told her, "You can't tell me what to do!" He then took out a pistol and pointed it at the woman. The suspect then appeared to be loading the gun. The woman, fearing for the safety of her and her child, fled the scene.

The woman went to where she felt safe and called the police. The police went to her house, knocked on the door and spoke to the man. They searched the house and found that the gun that was used was a BB gun. The man was booked on various domestic violence charges.

Tuesday, June 20, 2006, 8:25 PM - Felon with a Firearm - Waterloo and Loomis Street - CS# 060 655 918 - Officer Rightmire and Coleman were on patrol in this area when they saw a car on the street that had three men standing around it. They saw that one of the men had an open container of alcohol. As they drove past they saw one of the men reach into the vehicle. They Officers stopped and investigated. In their investigation they learned that one of the men was on parole. A search of the car

revealed that the object that the man was attempting to hide was a stolen handgun. One of the men admitted that he purchased the gun a few months ago in the Bayview District for 200.00 dollars. The gun happened to be stolen in a home invasion robbery in Suisun City.

The person that admitted to possessing the gun was arrested on numerous felony charges. The parolee was also booked for associating with gang members, especially those that have guns.

Tuesday, June 20, 2006, 9:18 PM - Transporting Marijuana - Thornton and Pomona Street - CS# 060 655 980 - Sgt. Perez stopped a vehicle at Thornton and Pomona Streets that was described earlier in the shift as having a shotgun inside of it. Sgt. Perez spoke with the driver who gave him permission to search his car. Numerous officers also responded with Sgt. Perez. Inside the man's trunk was two bags of marijuana, a weighing scale, and empty baggies.

The only thing not in the man's possession was his medical marijuana card or a medical marijuana distribution permit. The man, who also has a pending case for the same offense was arrested for drug trafficking.

Wednesday, June 21, 2006, 11:35 AM, 1300 block of Evans, Stolen property, warrant arrest (case # 060663284): Officers responded to the 1300 block of Evans at 3:00 PM and detained two suspects, one male and one female, that the victim pointed out. The victim told the officers that the two suspects had been at her office earlier in the day to get an emergency food bag. The victim left her office to get the food bag. After the suspects received the food bag and left, the victim noticed that her wallet was missing. The suspects had another appointment at 3:00 so the victim alerted the police.

However, when the suspects arrived, the female suspect indicated to the victim that she needed to speak to her in private. While the male suspect waited outside, the female confessed to taking the wallet, but said that she was forced to do it and that she was in fear of the male suspect. She showed the victim scars and bruises from beatings that she had received from the suspect. The female wanted to return the wallet, but did not want the male suspect to know.

The female suspect took officers to her house where they recovered the wallet. The victim refused to press charges against the female suspect. She spoke briefly with Domestic Violence inspectors, but refused to give much information. The inspectors arranged for her to move to a safe location.

A warrant check on the male suspect revealed that his parole had been violated and that he was going back to prison. He was booked on stolen property and the parole warrant at Bayview Station.

Wednesday, June 21, 2006, 1:35 PM, Palou and Keith, Assault, brandishing (case # 060658398): The victim was at Palou and Keith when the suspect walked up to him and asked him, "You rollin' with the 24th Street?", referring to belonging to a street gang. The suspect then showed that he was carrying a silver semi-automatic pistol. The suspect then punched the victim for no reason. Fearing for his safety, the victim ran away.

The suspect is described as a 15-17 year old African American male, 5'8, 160 pounds wearing a black beanie, black shirt and blue jeans.

Wednesday, June 21, 2006, 8:00 PM, Carolina and 22nd, Mental health detention (case # 060660036): Officers responded to a report of a man sitting in the middle of the intersection of Carolina and 22nd. When they arrived, they found the man sitting cross-legged right in the center of the intersection. It was actually amazing that a car had not hit him because he could not be seen as drivers were approaching the intersection. The man told officers that he had 22 beers. During their interview with him, the man became enraged with a group of people that were standing a block away. He claimed that they were making fun of him. To the officers, they did not appear to be paying any attention to the man at all. The man was eventually transported to SFGH and placed on the 72-hour psychiatric detention.

Wednesday, June 21, 2006, 10:00 PM, 3rd and McKinnon, Robbery (case # 060660161): The victim was at 3rd and McKinnon at 10 at night when he was surrounded by 10 African American juvenile males. They demanded money and then beat him until he fell to the ground. They then took his wallet from his back pocket.

Thursday, June 22, 2006, 12:30 AM, Jamestown and Harney (Candlestick Point), Robbery with firearm (case # 060660547): The victims were sitting in their car at Candlestick point when the suspects approached their car, opened the car door and stuck a gun in their face. The suspects demanded money and took a purse from one of the victims. The suspects are described as African American males in their late teens or early twenties, 5'8 to 5'10 wearing all black clothing.

Thursday, June 22, 2006, 1:30 PM, 5200 block of 3rd, Hot prowl burglary (case # 060662349): The victim came into Bayview Station and told the ever alert Officer Garate that someone was in her house. Officer Garate alerted other officers who then responded to the victim's house on the 5200 block of 3rd. When they arrived, the house was already empty, but the back door showed signs of being pried open with a screwdriver.

The suspect's description was broadcast to other officers who soon located the suspect on the 1500 block of Lane. The victim positively identified

the detained man as the man she saw inside her house. An arrest search on the man revealed that he was still carrying the screwdriver that he had used on the back door.

Friday, June 23, 2006, 3:00 AM, Mendell and Galvez, Auto burglary (case # 060664737): Officers responded to the area of Mendell and Galvez where they were met by the victim who lead them to the two suspects at Galvez and 3rd. The victim's property from the car was found nearby in some bushes.

The victim told the officers that he was checking on his car which due to a mechanical malfunction could not be locked. When he came to his car, he found one of the suspects in his car. He told them to leave, but they simulated a gun and told him to leave. Fearing for his life, the victim left and called the police.

An arrest search revealed that the suspects were carrying a hammer, especially designed for smashing car windows.

Friday, June 23, 2006, 11:53 AM, Silver and Cambridge (on a Muni bus), Purse Snatch (case # 060665901): The victim was riding the bus when two juvenile females that were also on the bus grabbed her purse and jumped off the bus. The victim called her father who then, along with the rest of her family, responded to pick her up. Her family then searched the area and spotted the two suspects hiding on Dunsmuir. Responding officers were flagged down by the family and the two suspects were taken into custody.

Besides catching the suspects, another interesting part of this story is that another bus rider witnessed the theft. Instead of just going about his business, he jumped off the bus and started chasing the two suspects. Although he lost sight of them, he saw where they dumped the purse and the victim was able to recover her belongings.

Friday, June 23, 2006, 5:30 PM, Gilman and Ingalls, Auto burglary (case # 060666987): The victim was walking to his car parked at Gilman and Ingalls when he saw the suspect hitting his car window. The victim was in shock and immediately called the police. The suspect hit the car window until it smashed and then crawled through the window, rummaging around inside the car. The victim then followed the suspect at a safe distance to the Alice Griffith Housing Project. He met with responding officers who soon found the suspect walking at Cameron and Double Rock. The victim positively identified the suspect.

A warrant check revealed that the suspect was already on probation for ... burglary. He was booked on auto burglary and probation violation charges at Bayview Station.

(case # 060664210): Another local resident who is helping make her neighborhood safer noticed a man on her neighbor's back deck attempting to climb on the roof. She called the police and kept an eye on the man. When police arrived, she pointed out the man still attempting to get on the roof. Officers took the man into custody without further incident.

A warrant check revealed that the suspect was currently on probation. The original charge for that incident was burglary, but it had been plead down to misdemeanor petty theft, so he got probation instead of jail time.

Saturday, June 24, 2006, 2:00 PM, 3rd and Kirkwood, Shooting (case # 060669884): Officers responded to 3rd and Kirkwood on a report of a shooting, but when they arrived, all they found was bullet casings and blood. Witnesses in the area said that the victim had been taken away in a brown van. Local hospitals were alerted to be on the look out for a gun shot wound victim and within a few minutes St. Luke's notified police dispatch that a victim had arrived in a brown van. Officers arrived at St Luke's and found three members of a local gang with blood all over their clothing. They said that they had just transported their friend, another local gang member to the hospital.

The victim was transported to Mission Emergency Hospital at SFGH, the best trauma center in the City for this type of treatment. However the victim, another local gang, member told officers, "I would appreciate it if you leave me alone," and would give no further information.
