National Bike Registry (NBR) Information

When 35 specially adapted bicycles for children with disabilities were stolen from the Bay Area Outreach & Recreation Program (BORP) last month, the NBR went to work to facilitate the recovery process. NBR, the only nationwide bicycle registration and recovery service of its kind, is used by thousands of Police Department across the country to match stolen and recovered bikes with their owners.

Individuals who might come across an adapted bike they suspect was stolen (or any bike for that matter) can go to www.nationalbikeregistry.com or call 800-848-BIKE to verify the bike's lawful ownership.

Bayview Officers Anderson and Singh were patrolling the area of Oakdale Ave. and Keith St. when a Chevrolet blew by them travelling at high speed. Despite the dangerously wet conditions the Chevrolet continued down Keith St. running through numerous stop signs in the process. The Officer found the car parked on Shafter Ave. and saw three men walking from it. Upon seeing the Officers one of the males reached back into the Chevrolet. Despite the Officers' orders to back away from the car, the man reached in and pulled out a pizza box. As Officer Anderson began to struggle with this man, a second man approached Officer Anderson and joined the melee. Police backup units arrived as a large angry crowd gathered around the scene. The two men were taken into custody and transported to Bayview Station. Eventually Officers determined that the second man had several outstanding arrest warrants. He was booked at Bayview Station. The first man was cited for resisting arrest.

Saturday, January 21, 2006. 9:06 AM. Unit Block of Carr St. - Battery, Warrant Arrest - Case #:060078605:

Bayview Officer Alcaraz arrived at a house on Carr St. upon learning of a knife fight at that address. The woman who greeted him relayed the following tale: The woman had been soaking in the tub when a friend of hers walked into the bathroom. The friend sat on the toilet and went about her business. In the process the friend took a peek at the nude bathing woman. The woman was angered by the peek and demanded that her friend leave the bathroom. She complied, but only after finishing nature's call. When the first woman's boyfriend returned home, she complained to him about the incident. Now, since the first woman's boyfriend is also the peeping Jane's ex-husband, the complaint apparently fell upon deaf ears. Officer Alcaraz was able to determine that the ex-wife had come over the night prior and had stayed overnight. Enraged that the first woman had complained about the bathroom incident, the ex-wife began to strangle her before fleeing from sight. With the help of Officer Catlett, Officer Alcaraz found the peeping Jane in the house's garage crawl space. Turns out she also had an outstanding warrant for narcotics possession. She was booked at Bayview Station.

Bayview Housing Authority Officers Cahill, Rodatos, and Sanders responded to a housing unit on Missouri St. after receiving a complaint about squatters at the address. As the Officers arrived they heard noises coming from the second floor. They ran upstairs and discovered that the suspects escaped through an open upstairs rear door. The Officers found an assault rifle and 2 handguns in plain view in the master bedroom of the otherwise abandoned unit. Next to the guns were boxes of bullets, a bag of crystal methamphetamine, and a methamphetamine pipe. The Officers seized the items

Saturday, January 21, 2006. 1:35 PM. 1500 Block of Palou - Found Firearms, Resisting Arrest, Marijuana Offense - Case #: 060079459:

Bayview Plainclothes Officers Lyons, Lew, Scott, Ellis, and Kirchner were driving down Palou Ave. when they spotted two subjects standing in front of a green fence. When the subjects recognized the Officers they took off running. Several of the Officers gave chase while Officers Lew and Scott walked over to the green fence. On the other side of the fence the Officers found a loaded revolver and a realistic black semi-automatic pellet gun. The guns were scratched as though they had been hastily dumped. Meanwhile the other Officers managed to apprehend the fleeing subjects. The two males were brought to Bayview Station for questioning. One was released from the station. The other subject, a Bayview resident currently on probation, was cited for marijuana possession and released.

Specialist Officers Choy, Escobar, Farmer, and Knoble were on patrol as part of a special Violence Reduction Program in the Bayview district. One of the Officers noticed a group of males on the above block of Kirkwood Ave. and knew several of them to be known gang members. The Officer contacted the men and became suspicious when the men became anxious and fidgety. Officer Choy walked over to an open gate behind the men and found a loaded gun with an extended magazine concealed in the bushes. Next to the gun was a single six-sided white die. The Officers found the matching die on the ground where they had the men detained. CSI responded to the scene and seized the gun. The men were questioned and released from the scene.

Bayview Homeless Coordinator Officer Lavin had been receiving frequent complaints about a couple that had made camp near the railroad tracks behind the Southeast Community College. She drove to the scene and recognized the man and his girlfriend from numerous prior contacts. Officer Lavin also knew the man was a registered sex offender who had failed to register and had a warrant for his arrest. As Officer Lavin contacted the girlfriend, the wanted felon jumped on his bike and rode off. The woman physically blocked Officer Lavin's attempts to pursue the man. Officer Lavin arrested and booked the woman on numerous charges. Back at the station, Officer Lavin passed on the wanted man's information on Bayview Station's 290PC Sex Registration Enforcement Officers.
