Tuesday, January 3, 12:44 PM - Robbery Suspect Investigation - Driving on a Suspended License - 3rd Street and Thomas CS # 060 009 020 An area woman called 911 and said that a group of men knocked on the door to her parked trailer. She was scared and did not let them in. She told police that one of them had a gun. Armed with the suspects' descriptions, Bayview Officers with the aid of outside units scoured the area.

A car was spotted on Newcomb Street with what was believed to be the suspects. The occupants were taken out of the car and searched. One of the suspects, a juvenile, had a cap gun the appeared to be a replica revolver in his waistband. The victim who feared retaliation refused to cooperate any further and did not identify if these were the suspects that contacted her. It is believed that this subject could be involved in robberies. Robbery Inspectors are currently reviewing this case to see if it may provide any leads for open cases.

However, the driver who had a suspended driver's license also had a warrant

Tuesday, January 3, 5:24 PM - Stolen Automobile, Parole Warrant - 3rd and 16th Streets CS # 051 371 325

Officers Festa and Cruz were on patrol in the area when they pulled behind a van at a stoplight. They checked "Hot Sheet" (a list of stolen cars) that they had taped to their dashboard and saw that the van was listed as stolen. After alerting other units to come to the area a traffic stop was made and the driver was taken into custody for vehicle theft and an outstanding parole warrant.

Bayview Officers responded to an apartment building on Third Street in response to numerous 911 calls regarding shots fired inside the building. Officers Berge and Erb were the first to arrive and were given entry. Numerous witnesses directed officers to one apartment. Attempts to contact anyone inside were negative. To ensure that anyone inside and was not hurt entry was forced. No one was inside the apartment.

As details unfolded it was learned that there was an argument inside the apartment. One male ran outside to the hallway. Another male emerged from the apartment holding a large kitchen knife and pursued the first male down the hall. The males were out of sight of the witness when the shots were heard.

Disturbingly, no evidence of bullets holes was found in the building and no one arrived at area hospitals for bullet wounds.

Police dispatch received a phone call from a woman that whispered into the phone that her boyfriend was in her living room with a gun and hung up. Officers Meehan, Chin, and Zapponi arrived at the location and saw that the front door was ajar. Because of the despondence of the caller they announced their presence and went inside. They found two juveniles in the living room asleep. The officers woke the first one subject up. Under the sweatshirt that the subject was using as a pillow was a loaded handgun, an

extra magazine clip, US Currency, and a bundle of crack cocaine. His companion was also asleep on the floor and he too had a bundle of crack cocaine and US Currency under him.

Computer records indicate that the handgun was stolen out of Suisun City during a home invasion robbery. The two Bayview males ages 14 and 16 were booked for weapon and narcotics violations. On a further note both of them had outstanding felony warrants for similar charges.

In two separate incidents there were street robberies in the Portola District. In the first incident a young woman was approached by four black female juveniles and had her purse ripped from around her neck. When woman attempted to keep her purse, one of the suspects put the victim in a headlock and dragged her to the ground.

In the second incident another young woman was walking down the street when she was approached by a black female juvenile who asked her, "What you got?"

When the victim replied that she had nothing the suspect grabbed her and rummaged through her pockets. The loss was a cell phone.

Both cases are under investigation and are being reviewed to see if they are connected.

Bayview Police officers responded to a business on Third Street on a report of a robbery in progress. It was learned that a clerk was entering the employee area of the store when she was followed by an unknown black male approximately 30-40 years old, wearing glasses a baseball cap and a black sweat top. The male pushed her inside and brandished a handgun. In the next room were two other employees counting their cash register tills. The suspect demanded the money.

The suspect demanded money from the safe. The employees told the man that the manager has the keys to the safe. He demanded that the manger be called. When the manger did not show up the suspect became agitated and left with over \$1,000.00.

Bayview Officers Foss and Bernal responded to the intersection of 3rd St. and Van Dyke Ave. when passersby reported that a man was jumping in front

of cars and flashing a large knife. The Officers found the man on the sidewalk screaming and waving a large knife. The man approached the Officers, ignoring their commands for him to drop the knife. Fearing for their safety, the Officers drew their guns, pointed them at the man, and yelled for him to drop the weapon. The man dropped the knife, but as Officer Foss was reholstering his handgun, the man rushed at him. Officer Foss struggled to fend the man off with one hand. His gun hand was occupied securely locking his handgun into his holster. The man then lunged at Officer Bernal. He grabbed her with both arms and began pushing her backwards. The man was outweighed Officer Bernal by approximately 160 lbs. Bayview Officer Fung arrived and managed drag the man to ground. Numerous Officers held the man to the ground despite his violent thrashing. The Officers eventually transported the man to SFGH for evaluation. Had the man not dropped the knife when he did, this incident could have ended very differently.

Sunday, January 8, 2006, 1:50 PM, 21st and Connecticut, Indecent exposure arrest: Sgt. Moran and Officers Izaguirre and Kangrga were on patrol in uniform when they spotted a man matching the description of an indecent exposure suspect. The man had exposed himself to the victim on the north side of Potrero Hill a few days after Christmas. The ever-alert officers stopped the man and identified him as the suspect in the indecent exposure. Officers took him into custody and booked him at Bayview Station.

Sunday, January 8, 2006, 3:34 PM, 6600 3rd St, Cocaine/Probation arrest: Plain clothes officers Lyons and Scott were patrolling the Franciscan Motel as requested by the owners of the motel. The motel and the surrounding area have a high incidence of drug activity. Officers saw a male sitting on the stairs in front of one of the courtyard rooms. When the male saw the officers, his behavior suggested that he might be involved in drug activity. Officers Scott and Lyons spoke with the man and determined that he was on felony probation with a warrantless search condition. The officers searched the man and found a large quantity of crack cocaine in his pants pocket. The suspect was booked at Bayview Station on cocaine sales and probation violation charges.

Monday, January 9, 2006, 2:35 AM, Double Rock/Cameron, Concealed Firearm arrest: Officers Alcarez and Wise responded to Double Rock Court to investigate suspicious persons reported in the area by local residents. When they arrived, they saw a Latin male suddenly start to walk away. Officer Alcarez told him not to leave, but he continued to walk away. As officers approached the man, he suddenly started running away. The officers chased the suspect as he ran towards Cameron. When he reached Cameron, the suspect dropped a silver metal object. Officer Alcarez recovered the object which turned out to be a fully loaded 9mm

semi-automatic pistol. The officers finally caught the suspect as he attempted to run out of the Double Rock.

While taking the suspect into custody, the suspect started yelling, "Help, the police are trying to kill me! Don't let them take me!" The suspect continued to resist and scream until he was transported to Bayview Station.

1) By telephone for non-emergency incidents that need an investigation. Callers can receive assistance by calling (415) 553-0123 to report non-emergency incidents. An officer will be assigned to respond to your location as priorities allow. TTY callers will be transferred to a TTY call taker and translation assistance is available for limited English speaking persons.

Note: Life threatening emergencies or crime-in-progess calls should be reported immediately by calling 9-1-1.

- 2) In person by going to any of the ten district stations: Central-766 Vallejo Street @ Stockton Street Southern-850 Bryant Street @ 7th Street Bayview-201 Williams Street @ Newhall Street Mission-630 Valencia Street @ 17th Street Northern-1125 Fillmore Street @ Turk Street Park-1899 Waller Street @ Kezar Drive Richmond--461-6th Avenue @ Geary Boulevard Ingleside-- #1 Sgt.
