As you are aware, we have been enforcing the posted signs and signals in anticipation of this day. Please adhere to the signs and signals so you don't become involved in a collision or receive a traffic citation.

### Crimes and Law Enforcement

THE BELOW LISTED INCIDENTS WERE SUBMITTED BY INDIVIDUALS OF BAYVIEW STATION:

Please note that there are several robberies that are listed this week involving African American males in their late teens or early 20's, wearing black hooded jackets that are taking place in the early morning. The victims are always on the street alone when the robbery takes place. In the past, the victims have been injured, even when complying with the robber's demands. This is not unique to this week. If you can avoid it, do not go out alone on the street in the early hours of the morning.

Tuesday, April 18, 2006, 12 Midnight, 425 Barneveld, Robbery with simulated firearm (case # 060411873): The victim was on a break from work, sitting in her car and smoking a cigarette when she was approached by the suspects and asked for a cigarette. The victim went to hand the first suspect a cigarette when he pointed what appeared to be a gun from underneath his shirt at the victim and demanded her purse. When the victim told the suspect that she did not have her purse, he grabbed her with his open hand and started to shake her, continuing to demand her purse. As the victim struggled with the suspect, she felt the "gun" hand and realized that there wasn't a gun there, but only the suspect's finger. The suspects then took the victim's cell phone and ran off.

The suspects are both African American males, early 20's, both 5'11, 160 pounds and both wearing black puffy jackets with fur on the hood. Both were also wearing black and white gloves.

Tuesday, April 18, 2006, 8:30 PM, Dedman Court, Loaded firearm arrest (Case # 060415085): Plain clothes officers were on patrol and because of recent gang activity were checking Dedman court. As they arrived on Dedman, they saw two juvenile males standing at the end of the court. As they approached the two males, they saw one of the males take something from his pants and put it on the ground. The object was dropped so that the officers heard it hit the sidewalk. The officers detained the two young men and found a fully loaded semi-automatic handgun on the ground. The suspect with the handgun was booked at YGC on weapons charges and his buddy who gave a false name to police was cited for false information.

Tuesday, April 18, 2006, 11:58 PM, 3rd & Paul, Narcotics and warrant arrest from traffic stop on a bicycle (Case # 060415740): Officers Ferrell and Anderson saw a man riding a bicycle without a headlight. As soon as the man saw the officers, he got turned his bicycle around and took off in the opposite direction. The officers attempted a traffic stop on the man, but as soon as they got out of the car, the man took off again on the bicycle. The man first tried to out ride the officers, but was no match for their squad car. So then he threw the bicycle down and started running. After a lengthy foot chase and a physical struggle, the officers were able to detain and handcuff the man. An arrest search of the man revealed that he had Marijuana and Methamphetamine, as well as small baggies that are used to distribute the narcotics. A warrant check revealed that he had several outstanding warrants for his arrest, including one for evading the police! The suspect was booked at Bayview Station on narcotic distribution, warrant and resisting arrest charges as well as the headlight violation.

Wednesday, April 19, 2006, 1:00 AM, 3rd & 22nd, Robbery (Case # 060415847): The victim was walking home on 3rd when he was approached by three men. The men then punched him in the face and he fell to the ground. They then kicked him in the face demanding money. The suspects then went through the victim's pockets and took his wallet and cell phone as well as the bag he was carrying. The suspects then ran west bound on 22nd St.

The suspects are described as African American males, probably all in their late teens. The suspect who did the hitting, kicking and talking was about 5'10" and 160 pounds wearing a black hooded jacket.

Wednesday, April 19, 2006, 9:53 AM, 3rd & Oakdale, Shooting (Case # 060416782): Officers responded to 3rd and Palou on a report of a shooting. When they arrived, they found the victim laying on the sidewalk nearby. Officers were told that a second victim had already been taken by friends to SFGH. The victim told officers that they were at 3rd and Oakdale when a black SUV, possibly a Dodge Durango or a Jeep, shot at them from an open window. The victims said that the shooter was an African American male, but did not provide any further information. Both were treated at SFGH for non-life threatening gun shot wounds.

Wednesday, April 19, 2006, 4:55 AM, Oakdale & Phelps, Purse snatch (Case # 060416099): The victim was standing at the bus stop at Oakdale and Phelps when the two suspects ran up behind her, punched her twice and then took her purse. Suspects are described as two African American males, between 15 and 18, 5'10" and 170 pounds, both dressed in black.

Thursday, April 20, 2006, 2:20 AM, 1400 block of Kirkwood, Shooting into a building (Case # 060420391): The victim told responding police that at 2 in the morning she had heard several gun shots in the front of her house and then a door slamming. The victim checked the front of her house in the

morning and found that her front window had been shot out and that there were other bullet holes in the front of her house. The victim could not provide any further information why she would be targeted.

Thursday, April 20, 2006, 12:50 PM, Thomas & Keith, Failure to register as a sex offender (Case # 060421612): While working the special Revere, Shafter, Thomas foot beat (which is designed to give more focused attention to that area), Officer Lamma came across a man who was in possession of an open container. The man told Officer Lamma that he is homeless, so Bayview Homeless Coordinator, Officer Lavin, responded to help. When the officers identified the man, they found that he was a sex registrant who being homeless is required to re-register every 30 days. The last time that this man had registered was October of 2005. The officers further found out that the man had been convicted in the past of not registering, thus making this offense a felony. The man was booked on felony sex registration as well as probation violation charges at Bayview Station.

Thursday, April 20, 2006, 4:00 PM, 800 block of Missouri, Probation violation warrant arrest (Case # 060422660): Gang Task Force Officer Parker developed information that those responsible for a shooting on Missouri St on April 17th, might live on the 800 block of Missouri. Officer Parker also knew that one of the residents of the unit on Missouri was on felony probation that allowed his residence to be searched without cause at any time. Officer Parker contacted the resident's probation officer who authorized a probation search. Although the resident was not home at the time, contraband including a rifle, spent ammunition casings and a black ski mask were located inside the resident's bedroom.

Another resident when identified had a parole violation warrant from the Department of Corrections. He was taken to Bayview Station and booked on the warrant.

Thursday, April 20, 2006, 5:00 PM, Carolina & 16th, Warrant arrest from a suspicious vehicle (Case # 060423351): Residents near Carolina and 16th asked for officers to check on a van that had been parked on 16th for a few weeks. Officer Chan responded and found that the van had no license plates. As he approached the van, he noticed that a man was sleeping in the van. Officer Chan identified the man and found out that he was wanted on a felony drug warrant in another county. The man was booked at Bayview Station on the warrant.

Aherne, Benzinger, and DeJesus. While these officers were conducting a walkthrough of the Oakdale Housing Complex they encountered this male. A computer check of his criminal history indicated that he had a felony warrant in Alameda County for crack cocaine sale. He was placed under arrest.

In a search incident to his arrest more crack, packaged for sale was found on this young man. Also in this subject's possession was a cell phone. The banner on this phone indicated that this young man is affiliated with a gang that claims parts of San Francisco and the upper Peninsula as its territory. The young man was booked for the warrant, crack possession with a gang enhancement charge.

Friday, April 21, 2006, 1:25 PM - Street Robbery - Wayland and Girard - CS# 060 425 551 - A young woman and her mother were walking in this area of the Portola District when they were approached from behind by two males. The first suspect grabbed the woman's purse off of her shoulder. The force caused this woman to fall to the ground, striking her head. Simultaneously, the second suspect attempted to grab the older woman's purse, but she held on. A struggle ensued and the woman fell to the ground. She was able to keep her purse but suffered injuries to her chest, hip, and knee and was taken to SFGH.

The suspects are described as black males between 17-18 years old. The first suspect is 6'0" approximately 220 pounds last seen wearing a black jacket. The second suspect is 5'06, 150 pounds.

Friday, April 21, 2006, 1:30 PM - Assault with Acid - 850 Bryant Street - CS# 060 425 567 - A man was in front of the Hall of Justice, arguing with his girlfriend of three years. It was learned that they came down to the Hall to get a car out of the impound yard. The woman was to give money to the man for the tow and storage fees, but she changed her mind. When the woman refused the man became outraged and was reported to have begin hitting her. Apparently realizing that he was in front of the Hall of Justice he stopped. The woman found a bottle of drain cleaner in the back of the car. She opened the top and threw some of the drain cleaner on the man. The man screamed and the woman continued to shower the man with the drain cleaner.

The man and the woman then drove to Bayview Station and pulled into the station's parking lot and told Officer Lamma, "She threw acid on me. It's burning." Officer Lamma reported that the acid was already burning holes in the man's clothing. Other officers responded to the scene and an ambulance was summoned. The man was brought inside the station and placed in the shower of the mens' locker room in attempt to flush his skin. An ambulance arrived and transported the man to the hospital. It was later learned that the man walked out before being seen by a doctor.

Since the woman accompanied the man to Bayview Station she was easy to arrest. An on call judge was contacted and an Emergency Protective Order was obtained for both the man and the woman. It was also learned that the man had filed a restraining order against the woman but it had not been served. An inspector from Domestic Violence is currently investigating.

As a side note...The man was in front of Southern Police Station when the drain cleaner was thrown on him, but he drove to Bayview Station, over four miles away. When he was asked why he came to Bayview, he stated that he felt he would be treated better at Bayview Station because the officers here know him. One can guess how we know him.

Saturday, April 22, 2006 3:35 PM - Crack for Sale - 1500 Block of Quesada - CS# 060 429 597 - Plainclothes Officers Solares, Mustafich, and Alcaraz were speaking with a person on the 1500 block of Quesada when they smelled marijuana coming from a van that was parked on the sidewalk. They peered inside and saw someone in the back seat. The man attempted to hide but it was too late. The man was brought out of the van and placed under arrest. A search of the man yielded a large quantity of crack cocaine packaged for sale.

Sunday, April 23, 2006 12:15 AM - Arson - Jennings and Gilman - CS# 060 431 138 - Bayview Officers responded to a home in the vicinity of Jennings and Gilman on a report of a house fire. San Francisco Fire Department was on scene and extinguishing the fire. Contact was made with one resident who told one officer that the fire started from candles he was burning. He told another officer that the fire started because he was burning newspaper in the fireplace and it got out of hand.

Turns out that police were at the home earlier in the day for a verbal argument between the man and his lady friend. The woman decided that it would be best if she left and let the man cool off. It was later learned that after the woman left the man called her on her cell phone and told her if she did not return, he would burn the house down.

After consulting with the Arson Investigators the man was booked for arson.

Sunday April 24, 2006, 10:11 AM - Narcotics Arrest - Shafter Avenue and Third Street - CS# 060 432 023 - A citizen from Shafter Avenue called the police to report that two women were smoking drugs on their block. In fact, the residents of Shafter Avenue have tolerated their block being used for narcotics for quite sometime and are getting fed up. The caller was able to describe the women. Officers Foss, Bernal, Dalton and McPherson arrived and found the women. A computer check revealed that one of the women had an outstanding traffic warrant. She was placed under arrest. A search yielded that she had a crack pipe hidden up her sleeve. She was

booked for the warrant and the crack pipe.

Sunday, April 24, 2006, 10:10 PM - Assault with a Knife - 700 Block of Jerrold Avenue - CS# 060 433 899 - Officers Blount and Archini were sent to SFGH on report of a stabbing that occurred on Jerrold Avenue. When they got there the suspect was sitting in her car. She broke down and told the officers that she stabbed her boyfriend because he was hitting her. She then drove him to the hospital. There was evidence of blood in the car and on the woman's hands.

Contact was made with the boyfriend who was being treated for non-life threatening stab wounds to his abdomen and arm. He told the officers that him and the girlfriend were parked in the area of the 700 block of Jerrold. The man saw an old friend, a woman that he knew as "Bubbles". He patted Bubbles on her buttocks and his girlfriend became enraged.

The man did not want to fight with his girlfriend and he got out of the car. The girlfriend got out, poured vodka on him, and slapped him in the face before stabbing him.

Domestic Violence Inspectors are currently investigating. A side note: earlier in the evening the couple were seen by Bayview Officers earlier in the evening kissing in the car, prior to the stabbing.

Monday, April 24, 2006, 09:21 AM, 700 Block of Missouri St., Shooting (Case # 060435099): Bayview Station Housing officers responded to the 700 block of Missouri and found the victim shot in the upper back. The victim, who was still conscious although in pain, identified the shooter as another resident of the 700 block of Missouri. The victim was taken to SFGH for treatment.

Note, this was the fourth day in a row that firearms had been discharged on the south side of Potrero Hill resulting in two people being shot
