-Never leave your vehicle with the engine running.

### Pickpocketing and ID Theft

-Bring only the cash you will need.

-Keep cash separate from IDs and credit cards.

-Do not carry your social security card or passport.

-Record credit card numbers so you can immediately report any loss to the issuing company.

-Strong, confident body language and eye contact with others is likely to discourage pickpocketing.

-If taking public transit, keep your fast pass separate from your purse and wallet.

-Shred receipts that show your credit card number.

### Home Burglary Prevention

-Put timers on different lights throughout the interior and exterior of the house.

-Have newspapers, mail and deliveries held or picked up by someone you trust.

-Take a home inventory of your valuables and record serial numbers; engrave property with your CA driver's license number. Photograph your items.

### Charity and Fundraising Fraud

-Request written information about the organization.

-Don't be fooled by a name that closely resembles the name of a respected or

well known charity.

### Fire Safety

-Never leave the lights on a Christmas Tree unattended.

-Never use real candles on a Christmas Tree.

Tuesday, 12/13/05, 12:45 PM. Carjacking with a Gun. 1000 Block of Oakdale. Case #: 051399214.

Bayview Housing Authority Officers Chiang and Cahill met with two carjacking victims on the 1000 block of Oakdale Ave. The male victim had been sitting in his car with his girlfriend when the robber approached. The suspect approached the victims and brandished a chrome semi-automatic handgun. He pointed the gun at the victims and demanded their personal belongings and the car. The victims wisely chose to comply with the suspect's demands and exited the vehicle. The suspect fled in the victim's car. The suspect was described as a black male, 20 years of age, 6'00 tall, 165 lbs. He was last seen wearing a camouflage ski mask, grey puffy jacket, and dark pants.

Tuesday, 12/13/05, 12:10 PM. Carjacking, Theft. 1000 Block of Palou. Case # 051399361.

Bayview Officers Lamma and Doherty met with a DHL delivery driver at 1000 Quesada. The driver had been carjacked an hour earlier on the 1000 block of Palou. He discovered his stolen DHL van, minus the contents, at 1000 Quesada. The driver told the Officers that he had been making deliveries on his normal route when an unknown suspect approached him. The suspect kept one hand in his pocket and suggested he had a gun. He demanded the van keys and the driver complied. The suspect fled in the DHL van. A witness at the scene where the van was found reported that he saw numerous people unloading DHL packages into an older, light blue vehicle with no plates. The suspect in this case is a black male, 25-30 years of age, 5'09" tall and 160 lbs. He was last seen wearing a grey Carhart jacket, shiny black or grey pants, and knit cap.

Wednesday, 12/14/05, 12:46 AM. Reckless Driving, Cocaine Offense. Van Dyke and Keith. Case #: 051401659.

Bayview Sgt. Riskin was on patrol when he observed a vehicle driving down Van Dyke at freeway speeds. The vehicle blew numerous stop signs as Sgt. Riskin attempted to stop the vehicle. Sgt. Riskin briefly lost the vehicle; however, he soon found it. The vehicle had crashed into a business on 3rd St. The driver fled from the car but was quickly caught by responding Officers. Officers found crack cocaine in the vehicle and on the driver. The suspect was booked at Bayview Station. The suspect in this case lives in Foster City. At the time of this incident he was on Superior Court Probation for selling cocaine.

Wednesday, 12/14/05, 7:55 PM. Carjacking with a Gun, Residential Robbery. Navy Road. Case #: 051404960.

Bayview Officer Calaunan met with several victims of a carjacking on Navy Rd. A victim explained that he and several friends had gathered in the area to mourn the death of friend. As the last of the victims was exiting their vehicle, two armed gunmen approached and demanded the keys to the

car. With two guns pointed at him, the victim informed the suspects that the keys to the car were already in the adjacent house. The suspects then ran to the front door of the house and demanded entry. They ultimately forced their way into the house and retrieved the car keys. The suspects fled in the victim's vehicle. Suspect #1 is described as a black male, 20 years of age, 6'00" and 165 lbs. He was wearing a green hooded army jacket, dark jeans, and a black face mask. Suspect #2 is a black male, 20 years old, 5'10" and 160 lbs. He was wearing a black hooded jacket, black jeans, and a red face mask. Several hours after the incident, Bayview Sgt. Pate found the stolen vehicle on the 1000 block of Revere Ave.

Thursday, 12/15/05, 3:54 PM. Warrant Arrest, Aided Case - 3rd Street/Newcomb Avenue - CS #: 051 408 887

3rd Street Beat Officers Dalton and McPherson were in the area of 3rd Street and Newcomb Avenue when they saw a woman that they knew to have an outstanding warrant. They arrested her and transported her to County Jail. While handcuffed, the woman swallowed some coins that were in her pocket. A short time later she began to regurgitate the coins except for a quarter that remained lodged in her throat. Fortunately, the woman did not choke. When asked why she swallowed the coins she stated that she wanted to kill herself. The woman was brought to General Hospital where an X-Ray confirmed that a quarter was still lodged in her throat.

The Officers felt it would be best to release the woman on the warrant (to be served another day) so she could be receive psychiatric treatment.

Friday, 12/16/05, 6:19 PM Crack Cocaine Offense, Probation Violation, - Newhall Street/McKinnon Avenue - CS #: 051 412 844

A man and a woman were sitting on the corner of Newhall Street and Newcomb Avenue. Officers McPherson and Dalton were in the area when they observed the man standing above the woman who was seated on the ground. The man was shining a flashlight on the woman who was intently working on something. Because this area has been plagued by drug users, Officers McPherson and Dalton had a feeling that these two were engaged in ingesting narcotics.

Their suspicions were confirmed when the Officers stepped out of their vehicle and startled the couple. The woman attempted to conceal whatever she had in her hand behind the open can of beer that was next to her. Further examination revealed that she was attempting to conceal a crack pipe that still had a piece of crack in it. Also below the woman was a bag of crack cocaine. The woman was booked for possession of these items. The man was advised not to loiter in the area because you really can not charge someone with conspiracy to smoke crack.

Numerous Bayview Officers responded to a burglary in progress on 22nd Street in the Potrero Hill District. The 911 caller, a neighbor heard strange noises from the unit that was being burglarized. Knowing that the occupant was not home he investigated. He saw that the door was kicked in and that there was still was a commotion inside. He called the police. Officers Goldsborough and Canedo were the first to arrive and were able to take the suspect into custody. The reportee saw the suspect being lead outside and noticed that it was the occupant's ex-boyfriend. The unit had numerous items that were damaged. Further the suspect opened the gas burner on the stove and the smell of gas was strong. When later asked why he turned on the gas, he replied, "I wanted to see the light."

The occupant returned home a short time later and told the Officers that the man in custody was her estranged boyfriend. The relationship ended approximately three weeks ago. Since then the suspect has called repeatedly, up to one hundred times a day and has made numerous unannounced visits. The suspect was booked for numerous charges including burglary and stalking.
