#### **Juvenile Justice Reform**

The Berkeley Center for Criminal Justice (BCCJ) and the National Council on Crime and Delinquency (NCCD) are co-sponsoring the "Juvenile Justice Reform: Forty Years After *Gault*" conference at UC Berkeley's Boalt Law School on October 26 & 27, 2007.

The conference will feature top juvenile justice leaders from the Bay Area and across the nation. It will focus on the key juvenile justice policy issues the nation is facing forty years after the seminal Supreme Court case of *In re Gault* established due process rights for children in the juvenile justice system.

Plenary panels will include a state legislator's panel, a judge's panel and a media panel. Breakout panel topics will include reforming juvenile corrections in California; juvenile justice, child welfare and mental health systems overlap; disproportionate minority confinement;

### Crimes and Law Enforcement

*THE BELOW LISTED INCIDENTS WERE SUBMITTED BY INDIVIDUALS OF BAYVIEW STATION:*

**Monday, October 1, 2007 – 12:03 AM – Recovered Vehicle, Warrant Arrest – 3rd Street and McKinnon Avenue - CS# 071 005 811** – Officers Bates, Borromeo, and McKean were on patrol in the area of 3rd and Newcomb Street when they spotted a Toyota Corolla in front of them. They also noticed that the license plate on the Toyota was listed on the Hot Sheet, which is a list of stolen cars that officers tape to their dash boards and check throughout the shift. The car parked and the officers took all the occupants into custody. The passengers were ultimately released and the driver, who also had a warrant, was booked for stolen auto.

**Monday, October 1, 2007 – 3:53 PM – Possession of a Firearm, Threats with a Firearm – Pomona and Thornton – CS# 071 008 542** – Bayview Officers responded to the area of Pomona and Thornton regarding a person that was brandishing a gun. The Officer met with a man, who stated that he received a threatening phone call earlier in the day from his ex-girlfriend who told him, "You are a dead man" Later, while he was standing outside, the ex-girlfriend drove up, got out of her car, pointed a gun at the man and repeated her threat. The man ran behind another car and his ex-girlfriend drove off.

Police went to the ex-girlfriend's house and took her into custody. Permission was granted for the police to search the house for the firearm. The gun was located in a box in a child's bedroom. The woman was booked for numerous felonies.

**Monday, October 1, 2007 – 5:01 PM – Aggravated Assault with Knife – 4th Street and China Basin – CS# 071 008 536** – A man was stabbed in the neck after a verbal altercation with an associate. The victim was approached by the suspect who demanded, "You owe me a dollar or a cigarette." The victim said, "No", and the suspect slashed the victim in the neck with a razor. The suspect left the area. The victim refused to cooperate with the police any further. The victim was taken to the hospital for treatment.

### **Tuesday, October 2, 2007 – Attempted Homicide Arrest – 3rd Street and McKinnon Avenue – CS# 070 119 233**

– A seventeen year old juvenile was arrested in connection with a shooting that occurred in earlier this year in February. In that incident the suspect fired an assault type weapon at an occupied car in the area of Westpoint/Middlepoint Housing complex. Fortunately, no one was injured in that incident. The juvenile was taken into custody without incident at the corner of 3rd Street and McKinnon Avenue by Officers Coleman and Scott.

### **Wednesday, October 3, 2007 – Possession of Crack Cocaine, Parole Violation – 6:30 AM – CS# 071 014 191**

– Officers Altofer and Carrasco saw a man riding a bike on the sidewalk in the area of Keith Street and Van Dyke Avenue. They told the man to stop but he continued to pedal away. Officer Carrasco began to follow on foot as Officer Altofer followed in the car. The suspect jumped over fence and was followed by Officer Altofer. The suspect was taken into custody. In his sock was a plastic sandwich bag filled with crack cocaine. The man, on parole for manslaughter, was booked for numerous charges as well as having his parole revoked.

– Plainclothes Officers were driving past a store when a clerk flagged them down, pointed to a man, and said that he just stole some items from the store. As the police got out of their car the thief began to run. He was caught a block away, in front of Bayview Station. As he was being handcuffed the bottles of lotion fell out of his pants. The man who had been arrested previously at the same location was booked for theft and delaying the police.

### **Saturday, October 6, 2007 – 11:00 PM – Robbery with a gun – 800 Block of Terry A Francois Boulevard – CS# 071 028 283**

– Numerous club goers to a popular Potrero Hill Night Club reported that they were robbed at gun point by a band of robbers. The patrons reported that they were approached by two black male youths as they were getting out of their cars. The youths brandished a handgun and demanded the victim's possessions. Three groups of victims were struck within a fifteen minute span. No further description of the assailants is available.

– Officers Pasqua and Norris were in the area of Potrero Hill Housing projects when they saw a car speed through a stop sign. They followed the car and saw it drive to the 700 block of Missouri Street, park the car, get out of the car while it was still running and began to walk away. The motorist was quickly detained by Officers Pasqua and Norris. The motorist did not have any identification with him and verbally identified himself to the

officers. The name he gave the officers revealed that he had numerous warrants for his arrest. But alas, a hostile crowd was gathering and fearing for the safety of the motorist and themselves they took the offender's car and the motorist to the station.

The officers obtained a mug shot picture and it did not match the individual that they had taken into custody. When confronted, the motorist revealed his true identity. A computer record check verified his true identity; it also revealed that the motorist was driving with a suspended driver's license and had a felony warrant for his arrest. Coincidentally, the warrant was for using someone else's identity. He was booked for traffic violations, lying to the police with the identity of another person, and the warrant.
