Third Street Light Rail:

The LRVs began weekend service on Saturday, January 13th, 2007. While this will be a great asset for residents who use public transportation, those of you who drive or walk in the Third street corridor need to be careful. These vehicles are essentially trains, they are very heavy and they glide to a stop. This means that if you drive or walk into the path of an LRV, the driver can't stop very quickly. Please be careful and avoid being injured in an accident. Also, as I mentioned in previous emails, the police department will be enforcing the posted signs related to the operation of the LRV system. A transportation search revealed that he had a plastic baggie, a paper bag, a dollar bill and a straw each filled with a white powdery substance that Officer Tierrafria believed to be suspected cocaine. The unlicensed driver was booked at Bayview Station for possession of cocaine, driving with no license issued, expired registration, and false evidence of vehicle registration.

CS# 070 212 699 - Officer Fowlie and Officer Ferraez were conducting a premise check of an abandoned apartment located on the 1800 block of 25th Street. The property manager had informed Officer Fowlie and Officer Ferraez that he believed that there were people living illegally inside the apartment. Officers Fowlie and Ferraez knocked on the door and it was answered by a male adult. The male subject told the officers that there was another male adult upstairs. The officers had both males step outside where computer checks were conducted on both. The computer checks revealed that the first male had no outstanding warrants so he was advised regarding trespassing in an abandoned housing authority unit. The second computer check revealed that the other subject had an outstanding warrant for his arrest. Officers Fowlie and Ferraez took the subject into custody without incident. They then transported him to Bayview Station where the warrant was confirmed and the subject was later booked.
