On Saturday, June 9, 2007 at 10:15 PM, Bayview Officers responded to a call of a shooting in the area of Westpoint and Middle Point Roads. The phone is staffed 24 hours a day and the calls are not recorded. Those persons that come forward with information and are concerned for their safety, may be eligible for the Witness Protection Program services.

### Crime Alert

#### Theft of Recyclables

Stealing recyclables is a problem throughout San Francisco. Recycling poachers look for items of value such as aluminum cans, bottles and personal information. This crime problem has a far-reaching and negative impact on neighborhood public safety, the environment and consumer recycling efforts. As a direct result, you and your neighbors are exposed to:

- Increased noise and often trespassing on private property, at all hours.
- Increased street litter and contamination of potential compost in another bin.
- Reduction of recyclables collected for San Francisco means higher garbage rates for you.

Did you know that taking recyclables is in violation of the law?

Municipal Health Code Sec. 293.1 states that it shall be unlawful for any person other than an authorized City employee or the City's authorized curbside recycling program collectors to take, remove, move or otherwise appropriate the container in which recyclable materials are placed for collection and the matters contained therein. The City and its duly authorized collectors shall have the exclusive right to collect recyclable materials placed for collection in public sidewalk and street areas.

Penalty: Any person violating any of the provisions of Section 293.1 shall be guilty of an infraction or a misdemeanor. Upon conviction, a person is

subject to the following penalty:

- Infraction - fine not exceeding \$250.00 for the 1st offense. 2nd or additional offense by a fine of not less than \$100 or not exceeding \$250.

- Misdemeanor - a person can be punished by imprisonment in the county jail not exceeding 6 months or a fine not exceeding \$500, or both.

You and your neighbors can prevent the theft of recyclables by:

- Placing your recyclable on the curb by 6 am the day of pick-up.

- Shred paper with personal information.

- Organize a SAFE Neighborhood Watch on your block and communicate with your neighbors and the police regularly. Call SAFE at (415)553-1984.

- Never confront or stop poachers!

- Observe and report recycling poachers to the SFPD by calling (415)553-0123. Take detailed notes on the vehicle license number, car description, time of the theft, description of the person, direction they were heading.

- Call Sunset Scavenger at (415) 330-1300 or Golden Gate Disposal & Recycling at (415) 626-4000 during business hours to report the theft of recyclables.

Sunday, June 17, 2007 at 5:45 AM - Burglary, Vehicle. 600 Block of Kansas Street. CS# 070-611-126. Dispatch sent Officer Chu to the 600 Block of Kansas Street regarding a vehicle burglary. When Officer Chu arrived, he saw the reporting party in the window of one of the residences, pointing down towards the carport. Officer Chu observed a male and a female exit the carport that he detained without further incident. Additional units arrived on scene to assist Officer Chu. Officer Chu walked into the carport and saw a vehicle that had been completely ransacked. Officer Chu spoke with the registered owner of the vehicle who stated that he had been awoken to the sound of glass breaking. The owner stated that he looked out his window and saw someone walking away from his vehicle carrying what he believed to be his speaker box. The owner stated that he could not positively identify the male that Officer Chu had detained as being a part of the vehicle burglary. The male was transported to Bayview Station, pending further investigation, where he was later released. The owner stated that the female that Officer Chu had detained was the one that he had seen carrying his speaker box. The female was transported directly to County Jail where she was booked.

Sunday, June 17, 2007 at 1:13 PM - Burglary, Non-residential, Attempted, Possession of Burglary Tools, Possession of Narcotics Paraphernalia. 2000 Block of Jerrold Avenue. CS# 070-611-966 - Officer Gasanyan and Officer Carrasco responded to the 2000 Block of Jerrold Avenue regarding a burglary attempt. When they arrived, they met with a security guard that gave them a descriptive description of a male adult, armed with a crow bar, whom had attempted to break into one of the businesses. The Officers searched the area for the suspect. A few blocks away, the Officers saw a male adult, whom matched the description, riding a bicycle on the sidewalk. When the suspect saw the Officers he dropped a crow bar and attempted to ride away. The Officers quickly gained control of the suspect and detained him pending further investigation. The security guard arrived near the scene and positively identified the male. An arrest search of the male revealed a used crack pipe. The male was transported to Bayview Station where he was booked.

Monday, June 18, 2007 at 4:19 PM - Warrant Arrest. 1700 Block of McKinnon Avenue. CS# 070-201-034 - Officer Martin, Officer Primiano and Sergeant Ewins were assigned to the Violent Crime Reduction program. While on tactical patrol, they noticed several adults loitering in front of a residence on the 1700 Block of McKinnon Avenue. Officer Martin has made numerous arrests in this area in the past, and he knew that many people hang out in this area for the sole purpose of purchasing illegal drugs. As the Officers approached, all but one of the adults began to walk away. Officer Martin approached the female and asked for her identification. A computer check showed that the female had an outstanding warrant. The

female was transported to Bayview Station where the warrant was confirmed with Central Warrants Bureau. The female was booked for the outstanding warrant.

Tuesday, June 19, 2007 at 5:21 PM - Burglary, Residence, Forcible Entry. 1300 Block of Rhode Island Street. CS# 070-623-212 - Officer Rodriguez and Officer Correa responded to the 1300 Block of Rhode Island Street regarding a residential burglary. When they arrived, they met with the victim who stated that when she returned home from work she noticed that her garage door was about one foot off the ground. The victim stated that her lock had been broken off and her bicycle had been stolen. The Officers searched the area with negative results.
