female for proof of identification, but she was only able to verbally identify herself. Sergeant Martinez conducted a computer check of the female which revealed an active warrant for her arrest. Officer Festa and Sergeant Martinez transported the female to Bayview Station where they positively identified her through the SF Mugshot System. Officer Festa contacted Central Warrants Bureau who confirmed the warrant. The female was then transported to County Jail where she was booked.

Monday, April 16, 2007 at 6:51 PM - Warrant Arrest, Enroute to Outside Jurisdiction. 17th Street at Kansas Street. CS# 070-338-739 - Officer Thompson and Officer Blount were on uniformed patrol in the area of 17th Street at Kansas Street when they were flagged down by a Starbucks Coffee employee. The employee pointed to a man who was sitting on a fire hydrant on the corner. The employee told the Officers that the man has been coming into the coffee shop several times a day and harassing the customers as well as other employees. Officer Thompson and Officer Blount went and spoke with the man. They asked the man if he had any identification on him and he was not able to provide them with a picture I.D. However, the man did have a green card with his name and date of birth on it. Officer Thompson conducted a computer check on the male and it turned out he had a No Bail warrant. The Officer's transported the male to Bayview Station where they positively identified him through the SF Mugshot System. Officer Thompson contacted Central Warrants Bureau who confirmed the warrant. The male was then booked at Bayview Station.

Wednesday, April 18, 2007 at 4:10 PM - Theft, Petty, with Prior Conviction; Stolen Property, Possession with Knowledge, Receiving. 200 Block of King Street. CS# 070-396-970 - Dispatch sent Officer Trubin and Officer McCormick to 3rd Street and Mission Rock Street regarding a reported theft from a Parking Control Officer (PCO) vehicle. Dispatch informed the Officers that the PCO had a male adult detained. When the Officers arrived they spoke with the PCO who told them that he had parked his DPT vehicle on the 200 Block of King Street while he ran into Safeway. The PCO said that he had placed his backpack, containing his medication, into the trunk of the vehicle and locked it. The PCO stated that while he was in Safeway he was approached by a shopper who told him that she saw someone take a bag from the trunk of his DPT vehicle. The PCO got back into his vehicle and drove down 4th Street towards 3rd Street in an attempt to locate the suspect. The PCO saw the suspect walking on 3rd Street at Mission Rock Street. Thursday, April 19, 2007 at 11:27 PM- Suspicious Occurrence (Ballistic Vest); Parole Violation, Adult. Wills Ct. at MiddlePoint Rd. CS# 070-398-807 -Officers Lozano and Soohoo were working the Violence Reduction Program and were on patrol in the Hunter's Point Housing Complex. The Officers drove down Wills Ct. at MiddlePoint Rd. and they saw two occupied parked vehicles. Officer Lozano immediately recognized the driver of one of the vehicles, from prior contacts, and knew that he was on parole. Additional units responded on scene to assist. Officer Robinson arrived and conducted a parole search of the driver. Officer Robinson felt that the driver was wearing a ballistic vest which is in violation of his parole. Sergeant Burke transported the driver to Bayview Station where he retrieved the vest. A booking search revealed that the driver was also in possession of fraudulent US Currency. Officer Soohoo booked all the evidence at Bayview Station. The driver was also booked at Bayview Station.

Saturday, April 21, 2007 at 11:00 PM - Robbery w/Gun. Avalon Street at Edinburg Street. CS# 070-410-150 - Officer Fong was assigned to the front counter at Bayview Station when an adult male walked in to report that he had just been robbed at gunpoint. The victim stated that he was walking on the street when he was approached by three unidentified black male adults. The victim stated that one of the suspects pulled out a black semi-automatic handgun and pointed it at his face. The victim said that the suspect with the gun told him to empty out his pockets. The victim said that the other suspects then went through his pockets and stole his wallet. The victim said that the three suspects then fled in an unknown direction.

Sunday, April 22, 2007 at 2:23 AM - Shooting into Inhabited Dwelling or Occupied Vehicle. Fitzgerald Avenue at Cameron Street. CS# 070-410-730- Officer Lee and Officer Lieu were dispatched to Fitzgerald Avenue regarding a "shots fired" call. Upon arrival the Officers spoke with the reporting party. The reporting party told them that he saw a vehicle enter the Double Rock Housing area at 2:19 AM. The reporting party stated that four minutes later he heard five shots. The reporting party said that right after he called 911 he saw the same vehicle exit the housing area. Officer Lee broadcasted a description of the vehicle to other Officers in the area. As Officer Lee and Lieu were responding to the location where the shots were fired to check for victims, Officers Wise and Hernandez observed a vehicle matching the description. A felony traffic stop was done on the vehicle and the driver was detained. During a search of the vehicle, Officer Lee observed several bullet holes on the passenger side. Officer Lee spoke with the driver who told him that he had gone into the Double Rock Housing area to pick up a friend. The driver said that as he was waiting for his friend he heard several shots being fired. The driver
